## Webinar Presenters Needed

## News You Can Use

Technology tools can help us create worthwhile and exciting learning experiences, but the array of available tools and apps can be daunting. In a recent workshop, David Stein and I shared tools we use for three phases of instruction: pre-training, during training, and post-training transfer. The phases correspond with three stages of knowledge building: preparing, producing, and publishing. For example, watching a YouTube video before training begins can help a learner prepare for your session. Producing a group video can help refine ideas during training, and publishing the video on YouTube can foster dialogue with the larger community to reinforce post-training transfer.
