First State Legislature Bill regarding the Nurse Initiative introduced in TN

Bill: HB 2288 - This new legislation would change the title of veterinary technician to veterinary nurse. A "veterinary nurse" would be defined as any person who is a graduate of a veterinary nursing or veterinary technician program accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA).

Under this bill, all licensed veterinary technicians in good standing on or before January 1, 2019, would be in compliance with the registered veterinary nurse requirements, and would be granted a registered veterinary nurse license. To [view text of the bill, click here](#).



Labor Statistics for Veterinary Technologists and Technicians

The US Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics has info on national, state, metropolitan, and non-metropolitan areas. You'll often find significant differences between not only different states, but different cities. These statistics do NOT differentiate between credentialed veterinary technicians and those working as vet techs without credentials. So it is possible that if there are many non-credentialed individuals in a particular state, the number may be skewed. Also, you have to remember that these numbers include those working in ALL aspects of veterinary medicine including private practice, shelter medicine, specialty, emergency, large animal, small animal, exotics, zoo, academia, industry, research, government, etc, etc. So if you have a lot of institutions that typically pay veterinary technicians more, the number may be falsely elevated in that area, but these numbers are really quite accurate.
