In case you missed it...

RCOO 2023 Date Change

On 8 September 2022, the Holm Center published Amendment 1 for the FY 23 Air University Programing and Production Schedule, impacting all Officer Training Courses, including MOTS 003, Reserve Commissioned Officer Orientation Course (RCOO). The course originally scheduled for 31 January-14 February 2023 slipped to 23 February – 8 March 2023.

This memo was sent to all Force Development Offices (FDO) by AID and published to the AID SharePoint. SG leadership was not notified & learned of the change in January 2023 and immediately began to address TLNs with AID to issue 35 seats to FDOs for RCOO.

DHA FY 23 Annual Training List

In October 2022, DHA published their Mandatory Training List for FY23 which was disseminated to FDOs by AID. The document listed training requirements for military, civilian and contract personnel and ultimately caused confusion, concern and frustration throughout the enterprise.

DHA J-7 has confirmed that DHA does not officially have Authority, Direction and Control over the ANGMS and therefore the ANG is not required to follow the listing. ANG units are to continue following current guidance in place; collocated units working in MTFs should contact their host MTF to identify any additional annual training requirements.

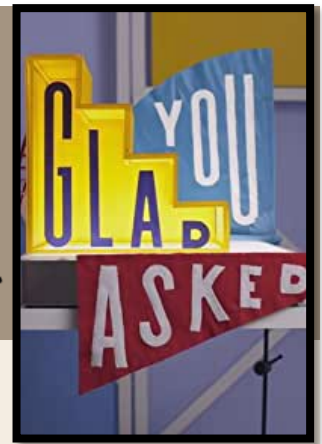

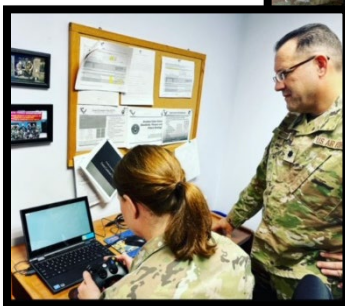

- 976H Divestment. The suspense for turning in 976H assemblage items and HAPSITE (to include all consumables, components associated with Inificon and Toughbook) was **31 December 2022**

 - NGB/SG is no longer providing funding for the items removed from the 976H Allowance Standard and will not support funding requests for equipment items not on the current Allowance Standard. It is imperative that these assets are turned into DRMO and your IEMP 10-2 reflect the current capability

What: Public Health Emergency Management (PHEM) Basic Course

When: July 24-28, 2023

Where: Joint Base Andrews, MD

Who: State Air Surgeons AND any interested ANG service member who meets the education/qualification criteria listed in AFI 10-2519 and willing to serve as the installation PHEO.

AFI 10-2519 section 2.3.6.1.1. The primary PHEO must be a senior AFMS officer with a clinical degree (e.g., Medical Doctor (MD), Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO), or Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) and must have either a Master of Public Health (MPH) degree or related.

AFI 10-2519 section 2.3.6.1.2. The alternate PHEO must be a senior Medical Corps or Public Health Officer and must have either a Master of Public Health degree or related.

Why: The ANG continually receives UEI discrepancies for currently assigned PHEO's not being current with the mandated DMRTI PHEM course training (AFI 10-2519 section 2.3.6.1.8.1.1.). This is due to chronic limited seating in the DMRTI course (ANG receives 1-2 seats per course). Arrangements have been made to host an ANG-specific course to accommodate the ANG and we have 40 seats available for State Air Surgeons and anyone at Base level who is qualified to serve as an installation PHEO.

What: Health Systems Specialists (HSS) and Medical Administrative Officers (MAO) Course

When: 16-22 July 2023 (17-21 July inclusive dates)

Where: Bldg. 3501, Room 260, Joint Base Andrews, MD

Course Scope: Designed to provide HSS and MAOs an overview of basic task, responsibilities and skills required to carry out ANGMS mission requirements. Emphasis placed on budget and manpower programs, supplies, equipment, medical readiness, administrative functions, training development and planning, inspection management programs and more. Attendees will have the opportunity to meet NGB/SG staff and Subject Matter Experts, discuss enterprise-wide issues and concerns with a variety of headquarters staff and collaborate within their FEMA Region, mission sets and peers throughout the ANGMS. This is a unit-funded course; home units are responsible for providing orders and travel authorizations.

IAW DAFI 36-2903, Table 5.1, certain Air Force Specialty Codes may wear a spice brown subdued cloth duty identifier centered at the top of the Velcro area on their operational camouflage pattern uniform while performing the duty.

Any provider, provider extender, nurse, 4NXXX and any other medical AFSCs certified in NAEMT-Medical Personnel or DHA TCCC Tier II or hier will wear the MED patch with black border
