


ACEC New York Political & Policy Infrastructure Survey

Confusion Reigns


Which of the following is your best understanding of how Ranked Choice Voting works:

IMPORTANCE OF INFRASTRUCTURE:

Infrastructure is a Priority

Updating New York City's infrastructure and building so that they are more green and energy efficient and we reduce our carbon footprint.

How important of a priority is this for the New York City government to focus on?

SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The survey, conducted by Honan Strategy Group, was fielded between April 16, 2021 and April 21, 2021 and consisted of 520 self-identified likely Democratic primary voters, and has an overall margin of sampling error of +-4.29%. 68% say it's important that NYC elected officials invest in infrastructure, but only 36% think the candidates are talking enough about these issues.
