



ACEC NEW YORK PRESIDENT AND CEO JOHN T. EVERS ANNOUNCES FY2025 ANNUAL REPORT

Outlines Past Year's Achievements Including Nearly 40 Industry Events Hosted, Distribution of More Than \$105,000 in College Scholarships and Implementation of New York City's Congestion Pricing Program

Report First of its Kind in Organization History

NEW YORK – (June 5, 2025) American Council of Engineering Companies of New York (ACEC New York) President and CEO John T. Evers today announced the issuance of the FY2025 Annual Report, the first report of its kind in the organization's 104-year history. The 52-page report details a variety of accomplishments over the past year, including nearly 40 signature industry events across the Empire State, dozens of policy meetings with elected leaders and more than \$105,000 in college scholarships awarded to local students. As the unified voice of New York's engineering community, ACEC New York represents nearly 300 of the top engineering firms in New York and strives to create new opportunities that improve the built environment and enhance the quality of life for all New Yorkers. In the past year, the organization welcomed more than 30 new full and affiliate members.

"Improving New York's infrastructure has never been more important, and our first Annual Report illustrates our diligent efforts to highlight that message among elected, government and business leaders in every corner of the Empire State," said **John T. Evers, President and CEO of ACEC New York**. "Thank you to all of our member firms, our staff and our supporters for making the contents of this report possible, and we look forward to another successful year of advocating for our engineers who continue to improve the way we live, work and build."

"ACEC New York brings together engineers of all disciplines to share new ideas and strengthen key relationships that move our industry forward, and this Annual Report reflects the remarkable progress we have made in the past year," said **Keith Harlock, P.E., Chair of the Board of Directors of ACEC New York and Senior Vice President at WSP**. "I commend John Evers and his amazing team for their commitment to our members, and I applaud our member firms for working together to bring our vision to the forefront of the construction industry."

During FY2025, ACEC New York hosted 39 events, including the Fall Conference, Winter Conference and Engineering Excellence Awards Gala where thousands of industry leaders gathered to celebrate the most innovative engineering projects, discuss the latest design and construction trends and meet with key decision makers in government, business and communities statewide. Over the past 12 months, ACEC New York staff and members participated in 16 hearings, delivered eight submissions of testimony and sent dozens of email blasts with updates on the latest legislative priorities for the organization and its member firms. ACEC New York was among the first organizations to support New York City's congestion pricing program, as well as the Metropolitan Transportation Authority's (MTA) 2025-2029 \$68.4 billion capital plan and New York State Department of Transportation's \$32.8 billion capital plan including an \$800 million increase for its core projects.

The Annual Report also highlights ACEC New York's focus on education, both of its current members and members of the next generation. In the past year, 30 PDH programs were offered statewide, and more than 1,200 professionals received advanced training in various fields of engineering. To encourage college students to pursue careers in engineering, ACEC New York administers a statewide scholarship program, distributing more than \$1.4 million to more than 460 college students since 2002. In 2025, 34 students across New York State received scholarships, including two top winners who received \$10,000 each: Caroline Gilmore of Manhattan College and John Keeffe of the University of Buffalo. All scholarships are funded directly by ACEC New York member firms, reinforcing the organization's commitment to educating the industry leaders of tomorrow.
