Improving Your Grant Getting Success

This three-hour workshop is designed to assist consortium leaders and staff members in all stages of planning, developing, drafting, revising and providing post-award stewardship for grant proposals to optimize success in getting grants. After a brief panel presentation of best practices by experienced higher education and consortium grant writers/managers, the panelists and consortium leaders experienced in getting grants will provide small group mentoring and facilitate mutual mentoring for participants who are working on grant proposals at similar stages of development.

Our goal is to provide mentoring in small groups of individuals facing challenges at similar stages with a ratio of one mentor to no more than 3-4 group members. Hence enrollment will be limited, perhaps to 20 or 24 participants.

Workshop mentors/organizers include experienced leaders of higher education collaborations and experienced development professional, all with successful records of developing proposals that earned external support.

1: Sustaining Language Instruction through Course Sharing (Academic Collaboration)

Panelists will share strategies for maintaining language learning opportunities for both classroom-based instruction and tutorials, for commonly taught languages and less commonly taught languages (LCTLs) involving inter-institutional sharing of courses and instructors.
