


## Q1 How many ASA RMD Meetings have you attended in the past decade?




## Q2 How many ASA Division meetings have your attended in the past decade other than Rocky Mountain (Pacific, Southern, Eastern)

### Q3 For how many years of the past decade have you been a member of ASA?



## Q4 What is your current ASA membership status (for 2024)?



## Q5 How important is attendance at the ASA RMD Meeting to your professional life, teaching, and/or scholarship?







## Q10 Were you aware that the ASA Policies on Discrimination, Harassment, and Respectful Behavior applied to this meeting?



**Q11 Were you aware that the ASA RMD Ombudsperson Lenore Wright was available throughout the meeting?**


