o Career objectives to include a statement regarding your interest in the construction industry as a career.

Mail your completed application with enclosures, postmarked *no later than May 26, 2017, to the address above, attention Merry Beckmann* (mbeckmann@agcmn.org or 651-796-2187). Scholarship recipients will be notified by June 30, 2017. All scholarship awardees will be asked to be present and participate in the AGC of Minnesota Sporting Clays fundraiser August 28, 2017 at the Minnesota Horse & Hunt Club in Prior Lake at which time the scholarship will be awarded.
