How Universities are Responding to COVID-19

The COVID-19 crisis has shown the resilience and adaptability of the California independent, nonprofit higher education sector (ICCU) to keep students safe and learning during these unprecedented times. ICCU colleges and universities moved quickly to implement distance learning, develop safe living environments for students unable to leave campus, expand telehealth options, provide PPEs to frontline workers, and in some cases, convert to COVID-19 testing sites.
