Yesterday: a pioneering school, born from hope following chaos

After the First World War, the League of Nations was created to prioritise conflict resolution through dialogue. In its wake, in 1924, was born the International School of Geneva, familiarly known as Ecolint, as the fruit of the visionary outlook of a handful of League of Nations' civil servants and pioneering educators.

The objective is doubly original: to educate both international and local children, and to offer an innovative teaching method centred on the specificities of each child, his or her development as well as human values. Later on, Ecolint became the birthplace of the renowned International Baccalaureate, now offered and recognised throughout the world.

The International School of Geneva was thus the first of its kind to see the light of day.

Today: perennial and true to its values

Soon to celebrate its centenary, the International School of Geneva is today one of the biggest in the world and remains a benchmark in international education. It hosts some 4,400 students, aged 3 to 18 years, across its three campuses, providing high-quality international bilingual education, with an exceptional success rate in final exams.

With students from 139 different nationalities and 85 mother tongues, each new day gives substance to the values of respect, dialogue and openness, both in the classroom and beyond.

Determined to remain at the forefront of pedagogy and offer the best to its students, Ecolint is ceaselessly re-evaluating its practices. Attentive to the world and its constant evolution, we are developing new methods and programmes, namely through partnerships with universities and pedagogical experts.
