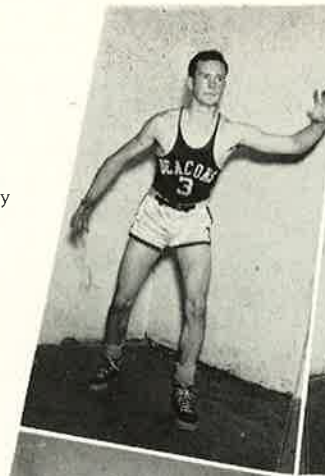
Playing under the handicap of no home court, the Deacons nevertheless had a fairly successful season winning 10 of the 25 scheduled games.

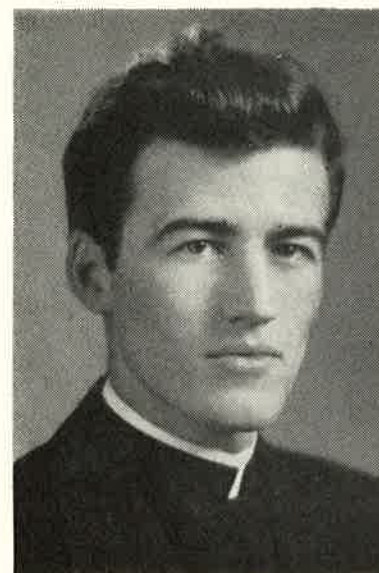
