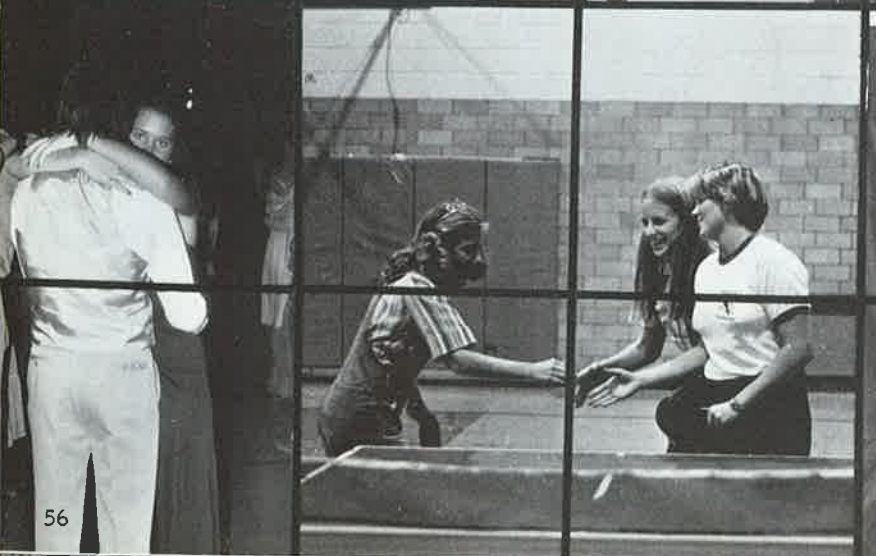
For most, the Student Council year ended here, but various groups carried on to provide the upper classmen with the Junior-Senior banquet, Prom and finally graduation.

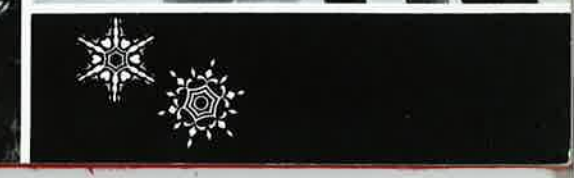
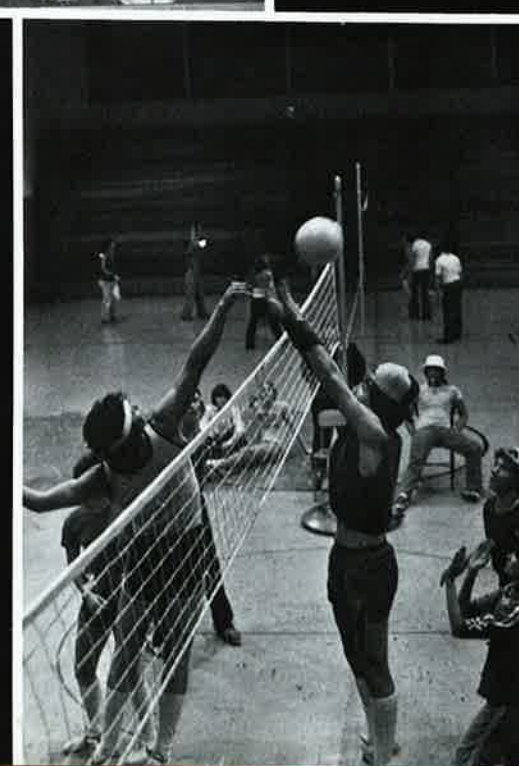
SNO WEEK

PIZZA SALES



During the month of March, Shanley students were busy selling a new, hot item-pizzas! Br. Roger, the principal, introduced the idea of a "Pizza Sale" and the Student Council set out to make it a reality.

The purpose of the "Pizza Sale" was to eliminate some other fundraisers and bring the Shanley community together in a spirit of unity.

The profits from the sale amounted to over \$8000. 10% was given to Student Council, 25% to the school, 25% to the bus fund and 40% to the 21 clubs, organizations, and sports that participated.

Every student was asked to sell 40 pizzas with a variety of prizes offered to provide incentive. Mike Day, a junior, sold over 600 pizzas to become the high-seller.

The project culminated on March 31, "Pizza Day", when 300 students, teachers, and parents came together in the school cafeteria to assemble over 10,000 pizzas. Nine assembly lines, working from 6 a.m. to 3 p.m., took 1300 pounds of pepperoni, 900 pounds of sausage, and 2500 pounds of cheese to turn out 30 pizzas a minute.

The "Pizza Sale", one the largest projects ever taken on by the Shanley community, was deemed a "delicious" success in its initial year.

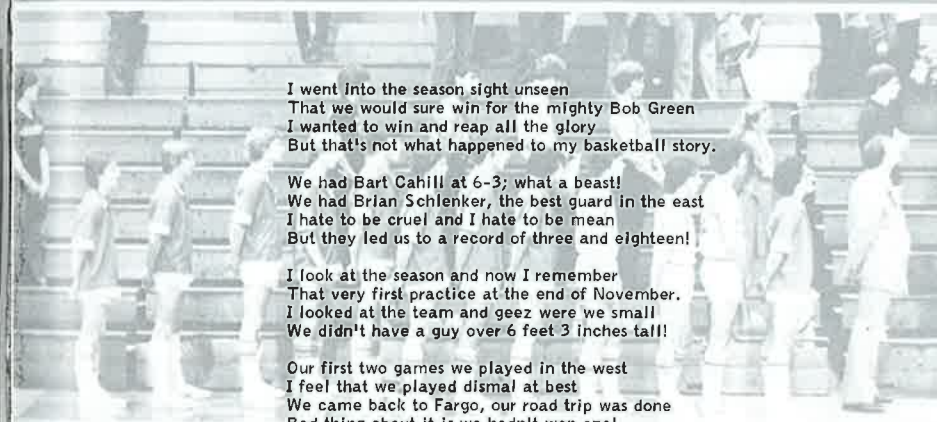
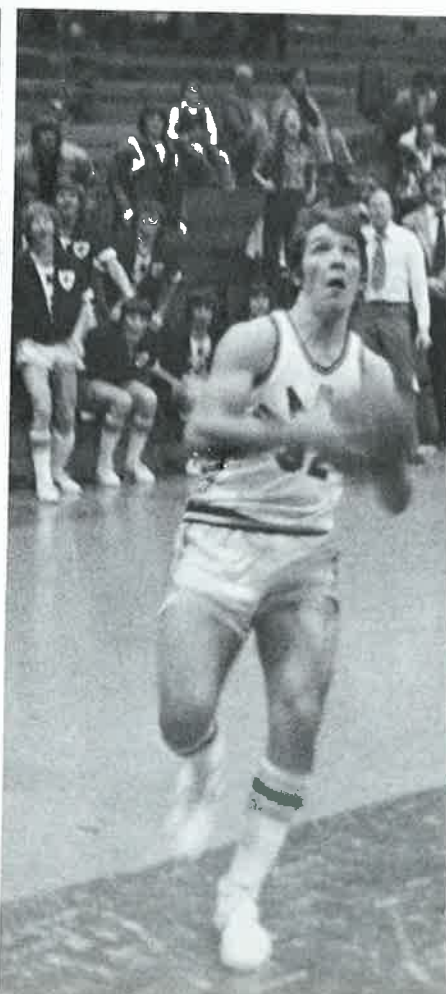
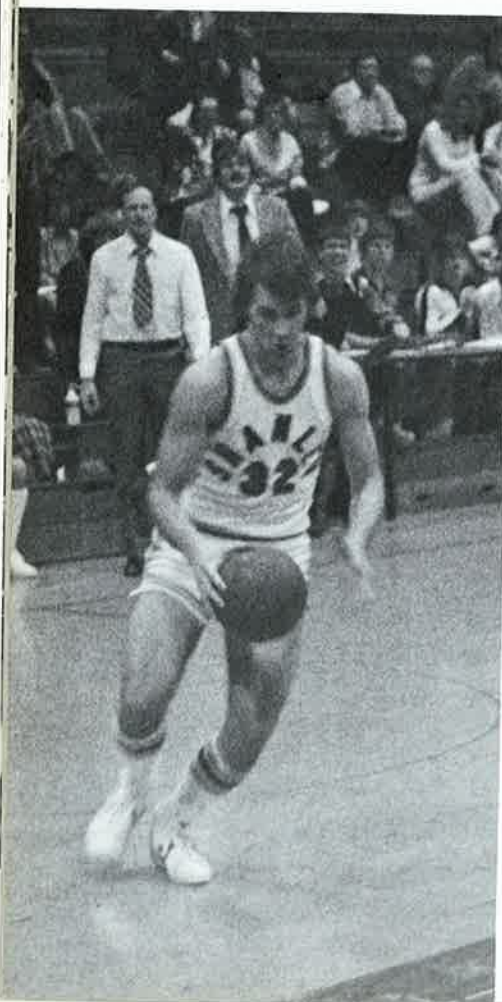
Overall, the Deacons played spectacularly, continuing in the Shanley football tradition.

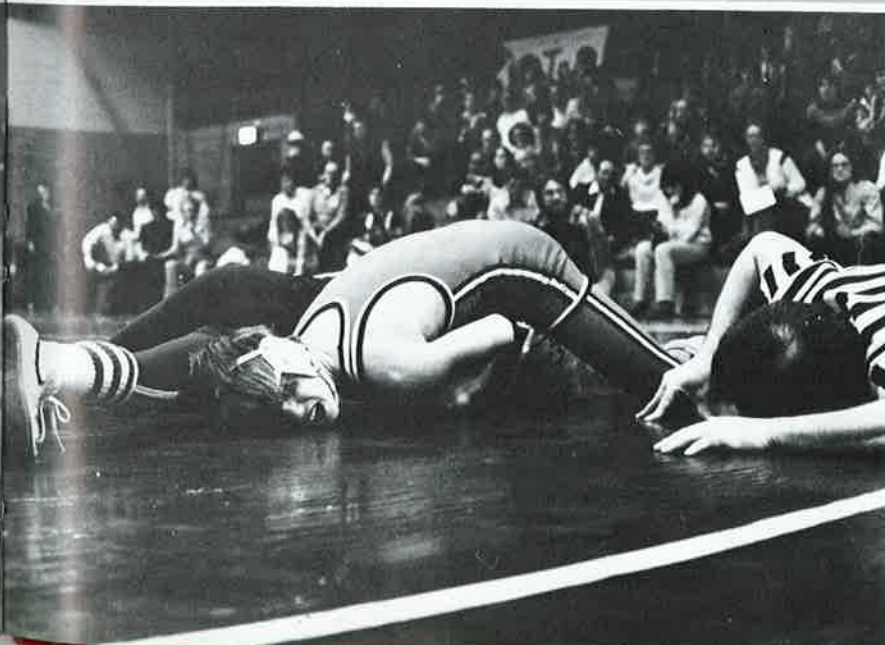
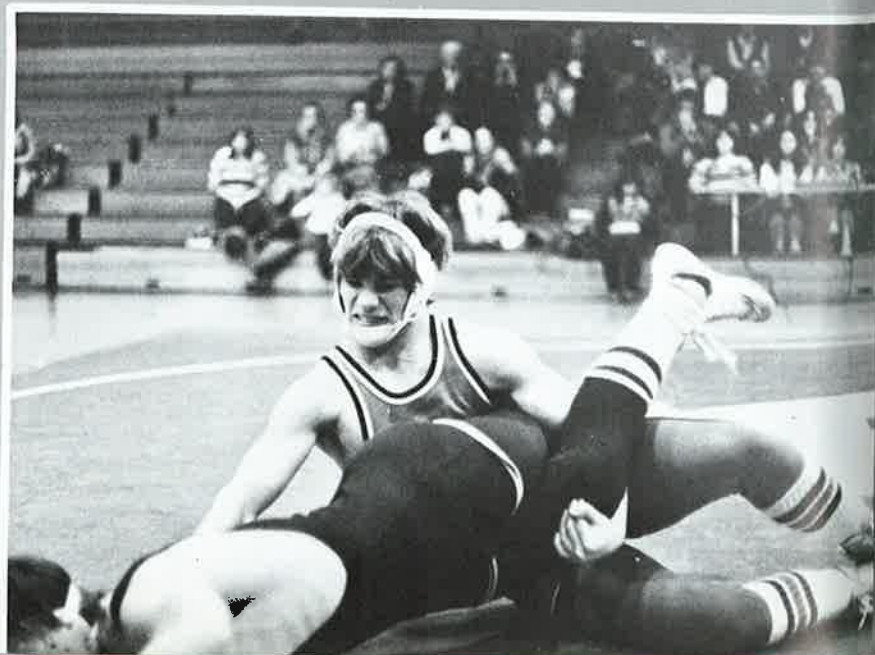
WRESTLING

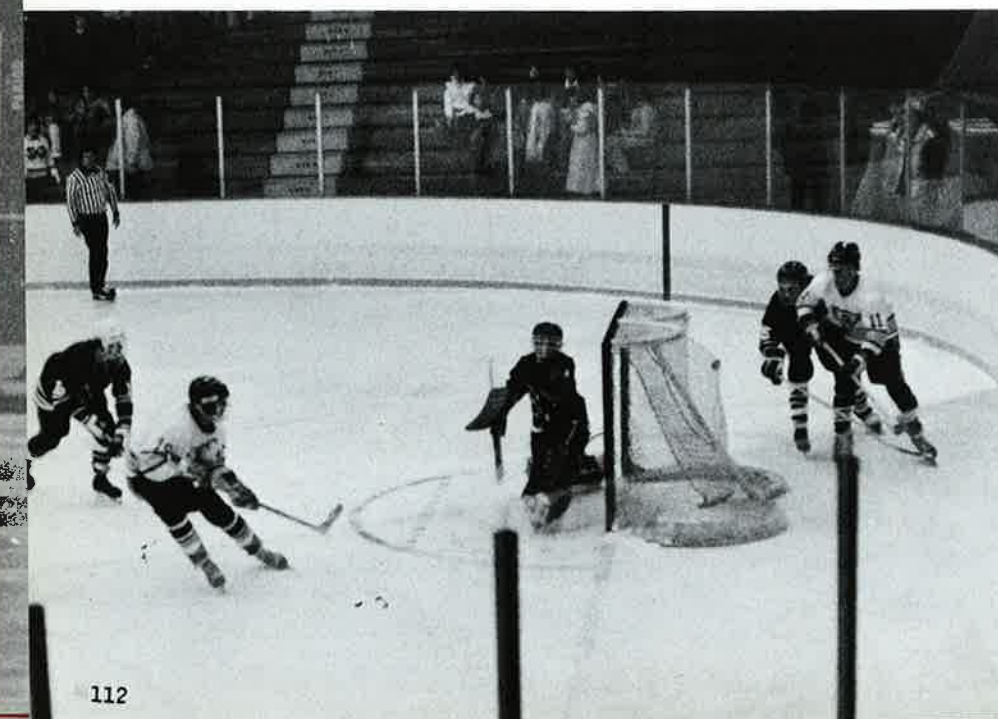

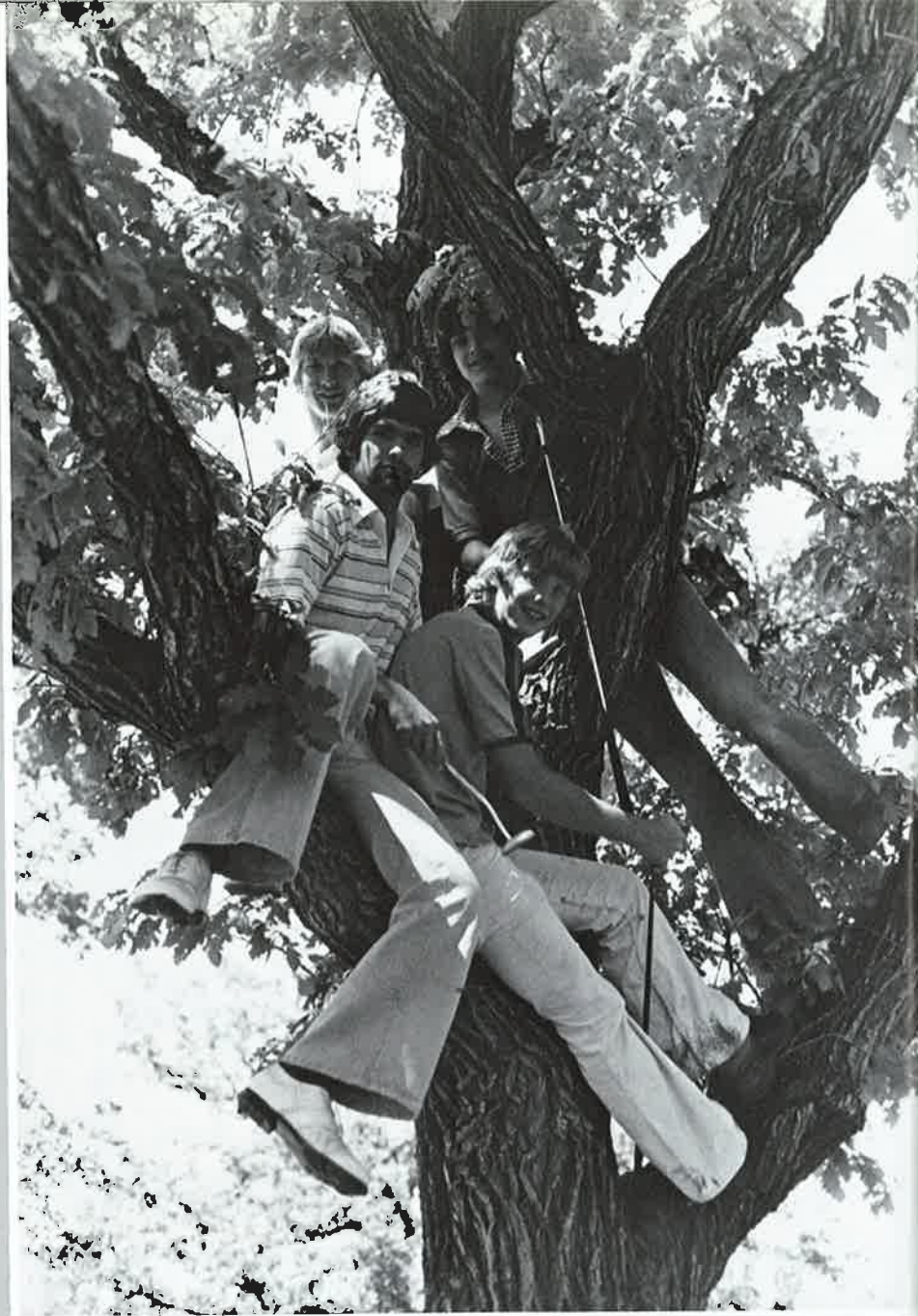

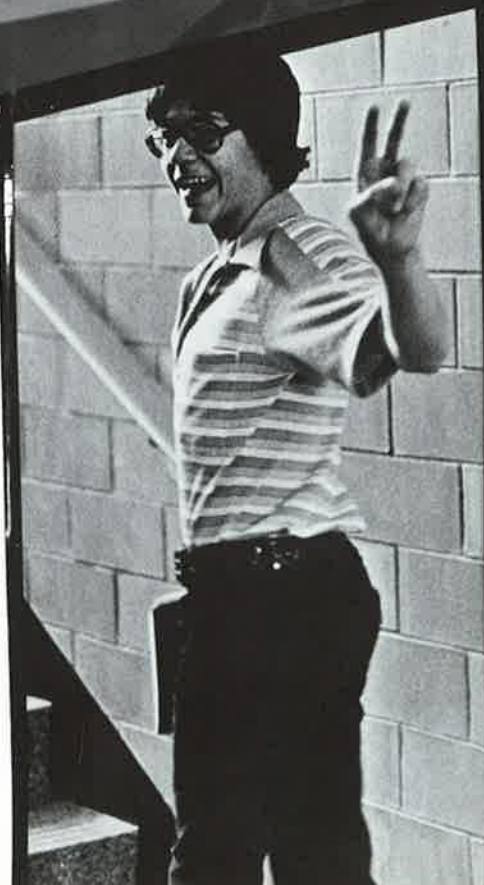

Once again Shanley had the opportunity to continue the student exchange with Chimboti, Peru, through Father Davis, formerly of North Dakota.

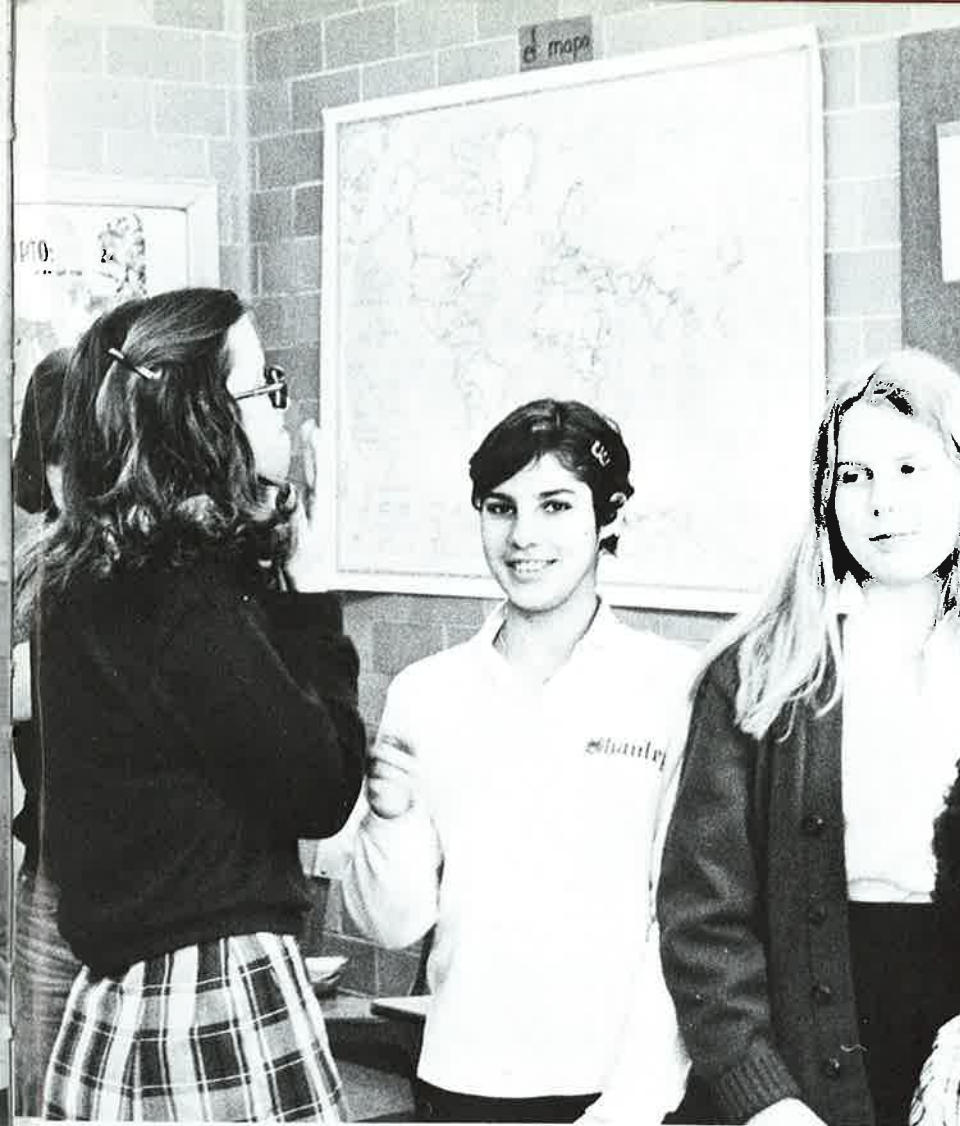

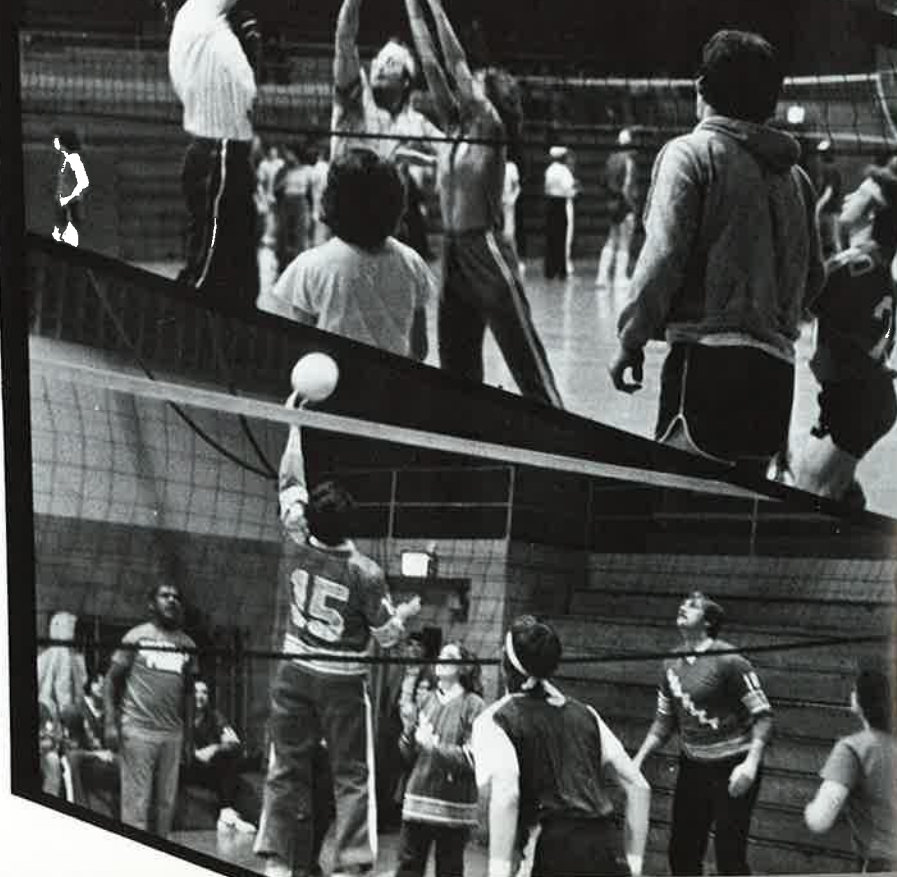
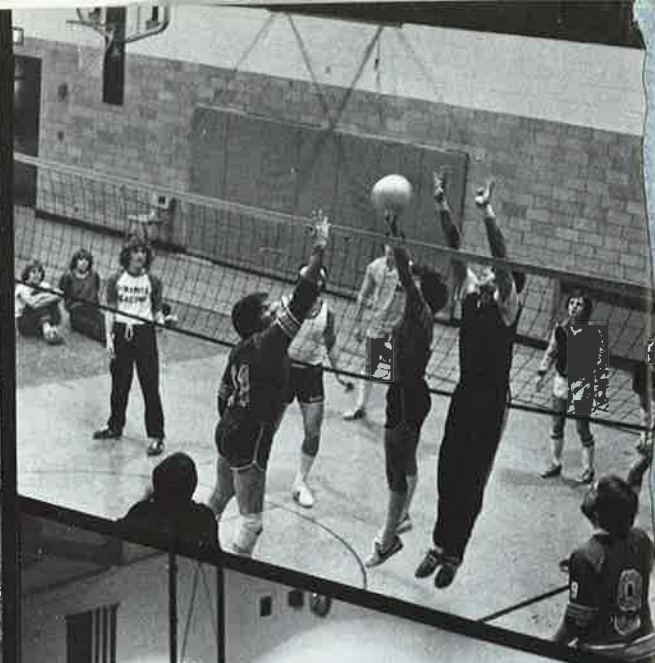

What these Costa Ricans felt here was a closeness that made them want to return ... in the summer.



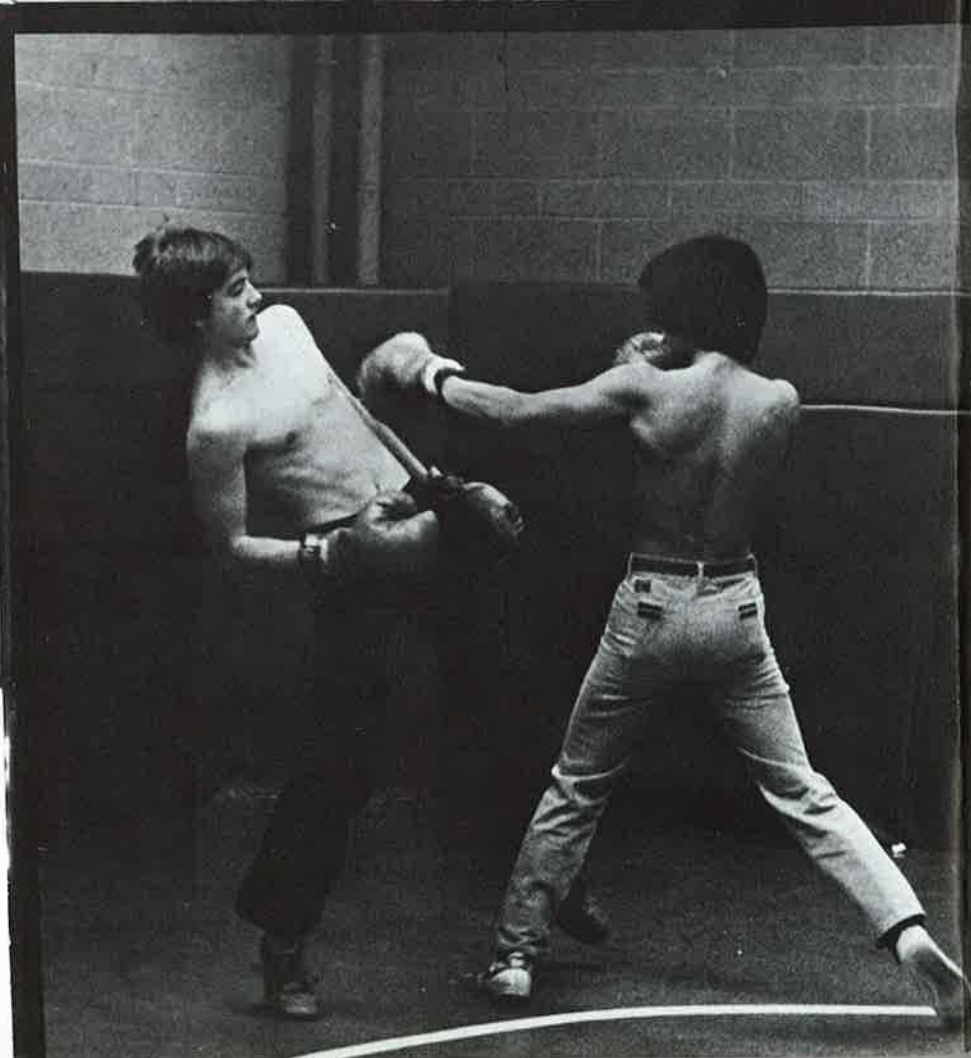


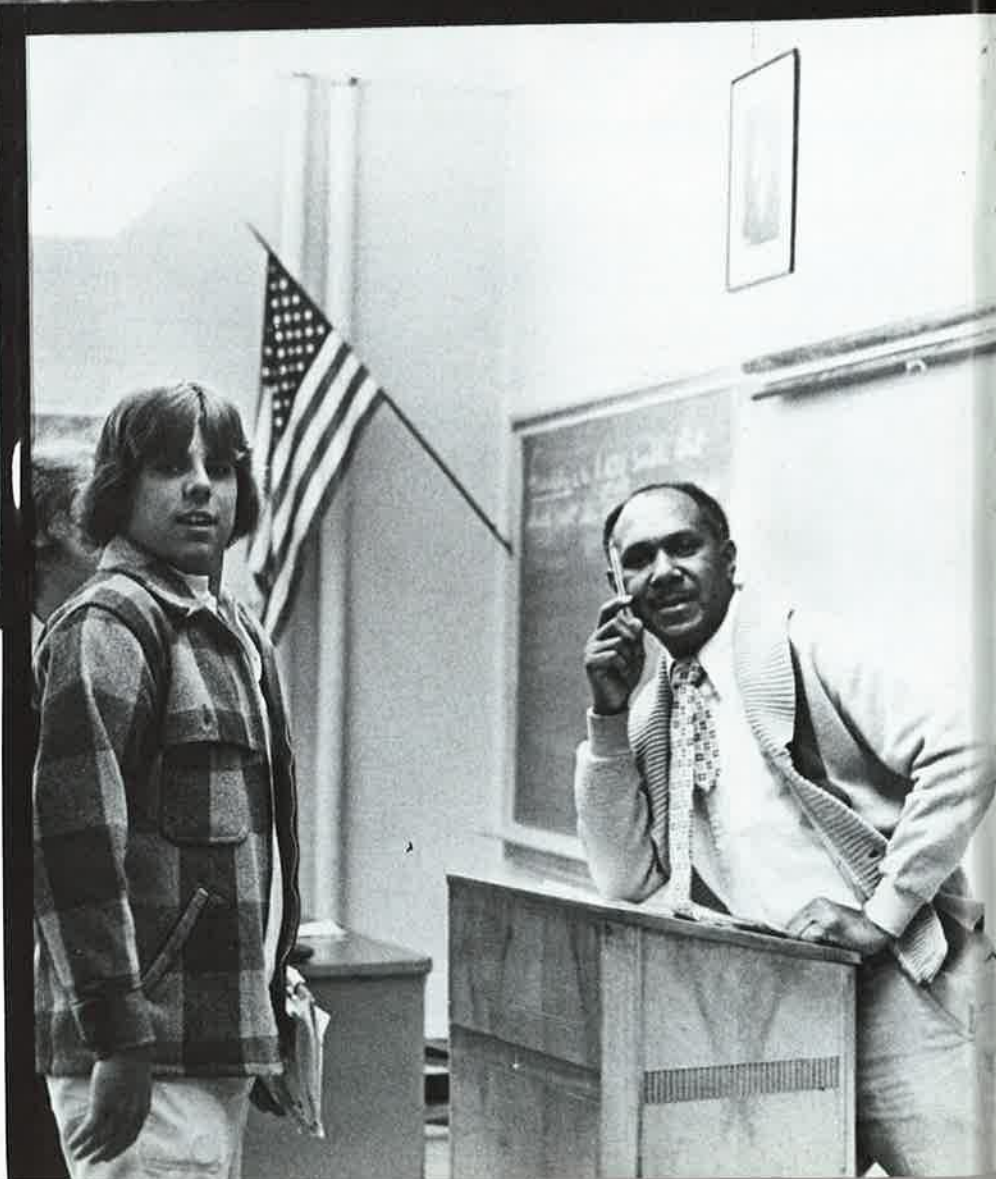
