

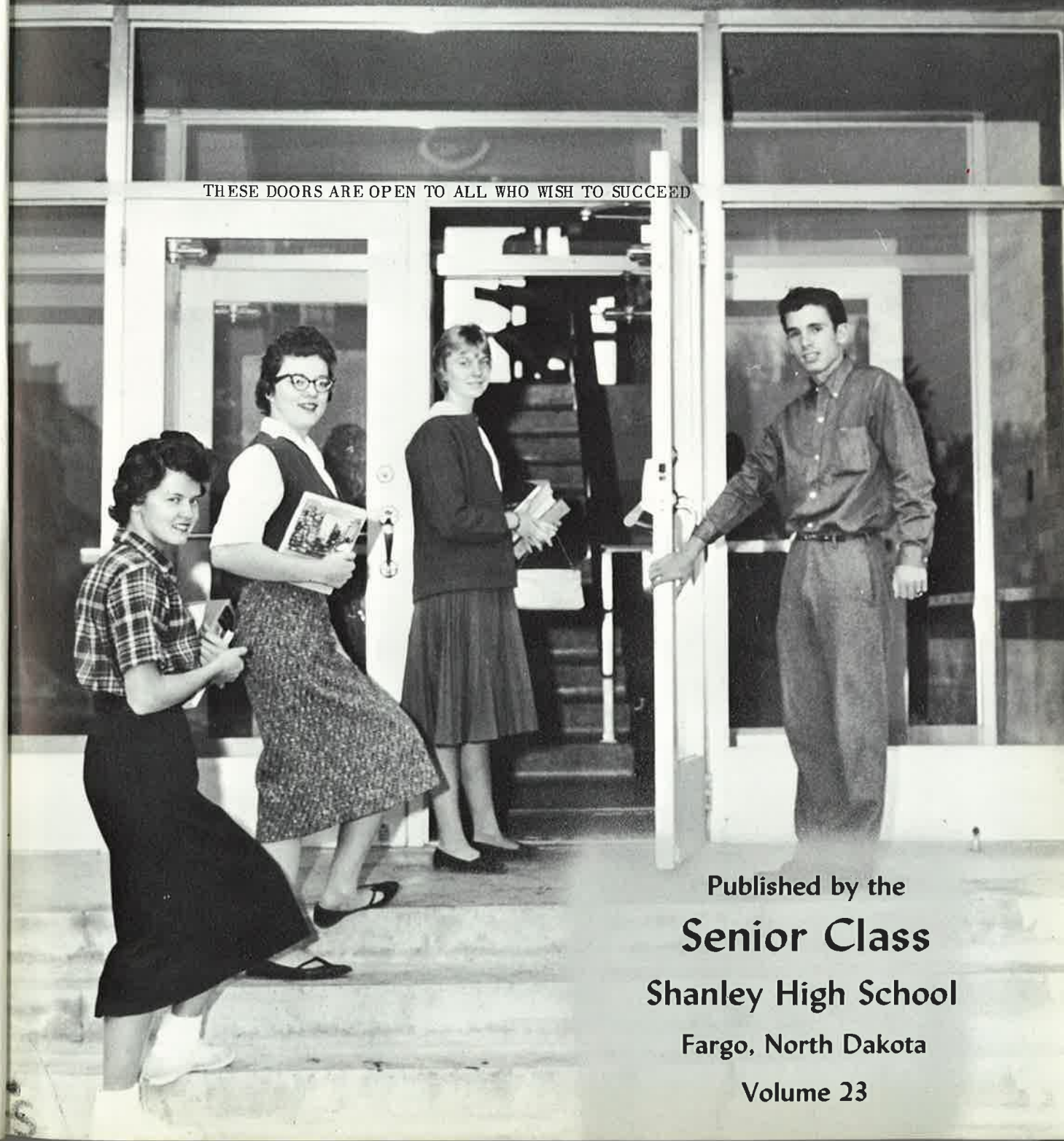

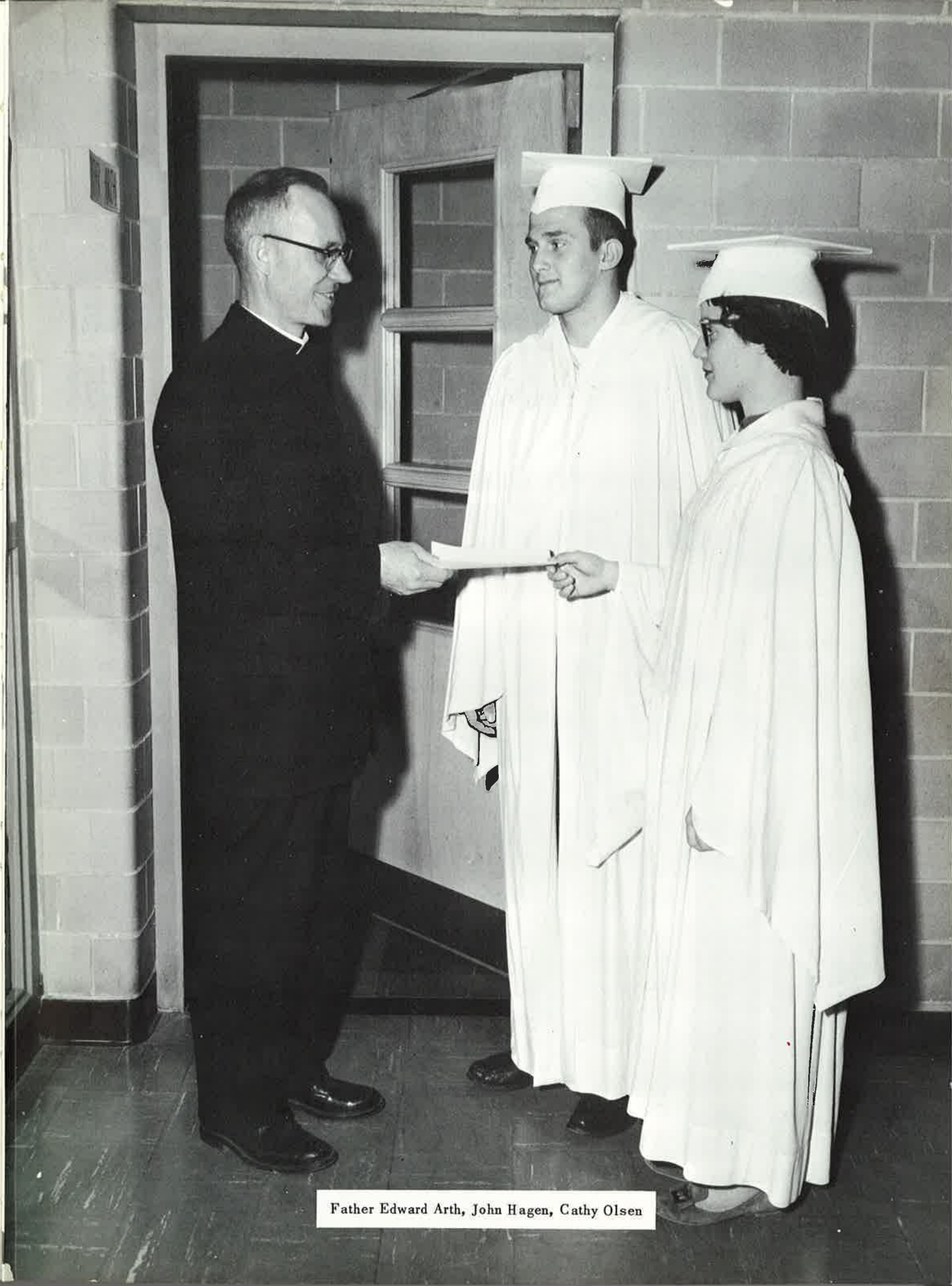

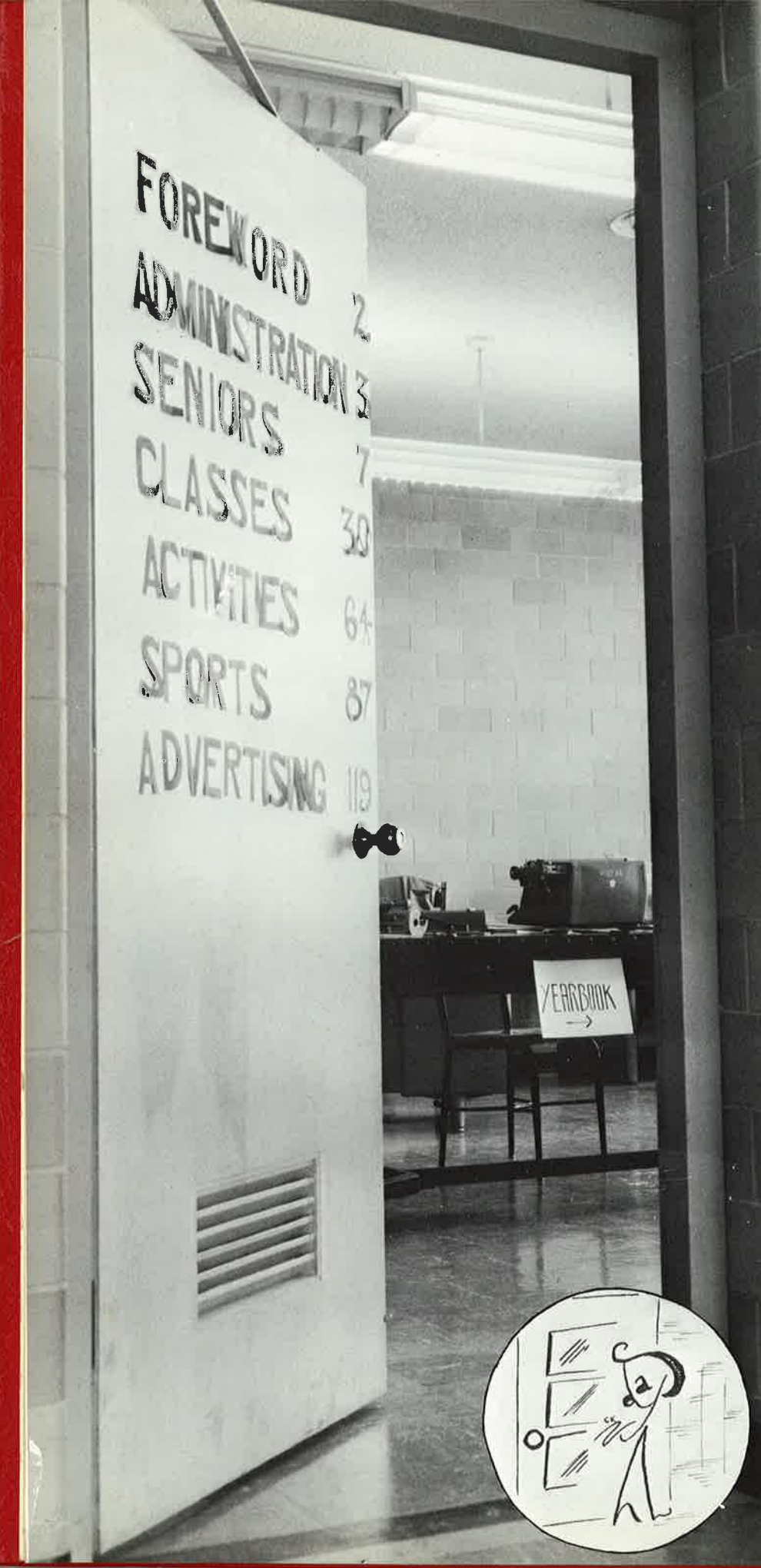

# Pope John XXIII Appoints Bishop Leo F. Dworschak Ordinary of Fargo Diocese

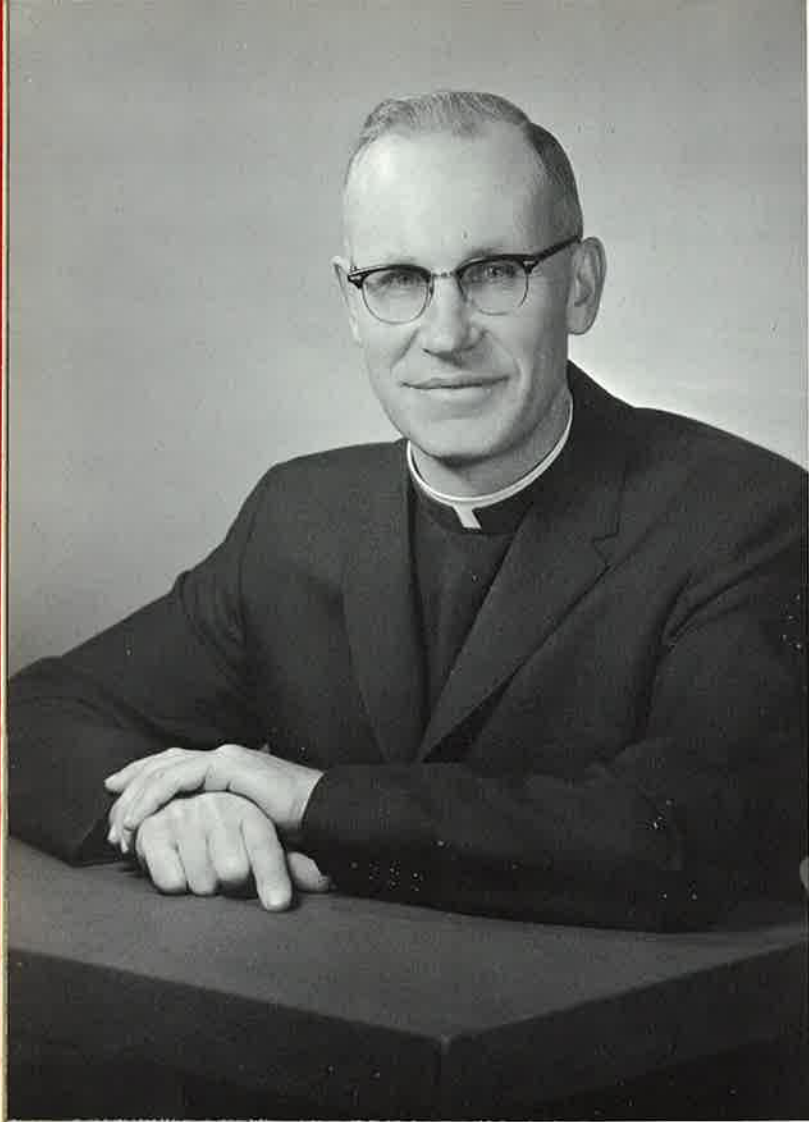


POPE JOHN XXIII

Father Edward Arth has high ideals of what Catholic boys and girls graduating from Shanley should be.

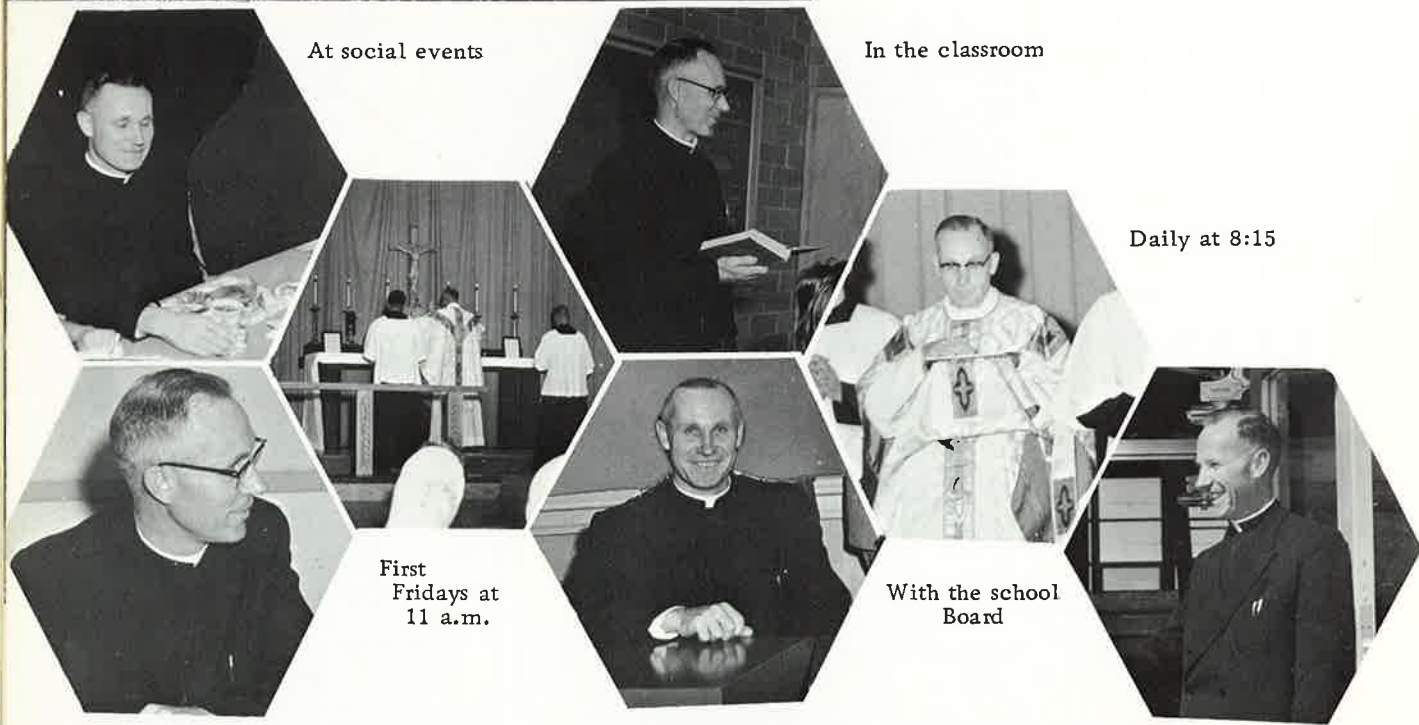

# Fabulous Fifties



Much is being written of the "Fabulous Fifties" and our football fortunes at Shanley High School should also be mentioned in that element.

The year 1950 saw Sacred Heart Academy being changed in name to Shanley High School. With that change also came the first Eastern Division football championship for the Deacons, who posted a 7-1 record, losing only to powerful Jamestown in a 19-18 thriller. The play-off with Minot, the Western Champion, was canceled due to a snowstorm.

1951 was a building year with the Deacons posting their only losing season (3-5) of the decade.

After a slow start in 1952, the Deacons gained momentum, won the Eastern title by defeating Fargo Central 7-0 and went out to Williston and played the all-conquering "Coyotes" to a 7-7 tie. (We were advised by many observers not to go West because our small Shanley team would be annihilated. Our performance out at Williston was most gratifying.)



Our 1953 team swept nine opponents before it and climaxed the season one fine November day by running rampant over a good Bismarck St. Mary's team, 40-20 in the play-off game.

We had a seasoned crew for the 1954 season but as a result of injuries and complacency brought about by the two previous years of success, it was a continued struggle to stay on top. However, despite some adversity, we won 9 games and tied one, climaxing the season with a 20-7 victory over the "Blue Jays" at Jamestown.

It was generally considered that 1955 would be a building year with an inexperienced crew but we emerged with a respectable 6-2 record; losing a 13 to 7 game to Moorhead in the opener and losing the Eastern title to Fargo Central 13-12 in the final. (Fargo was unscored upon until the Shanley game.)

1956 was about the same story. The Deacons, running the "drive Series," most effectively ran through the schedule with ease except for the Fargo game which we lost by at 19 to 7 score.

The 1957 season record showed a respectable 6 wins, 1 loss, and 1 tie, but that loss was a 45 to 0 lacing administered by the Fargo Midgets--the worst defeat in modern football history to be absorbed by a Shanley team.

1958 looked like a struggle all the way but turned out to be one of the most satisfying seasons with a 10-0 record and a State title win over the Bismarck Demons.

To close the decade in 1959, the Deacons posted a 7-1 record over teams that represented the most powerful elements of Minnesota and the two Dakotas. Watertown, which won the Eastern South Dakota Title, lost to Shanley, 26-13. St. John's Prep had a 13-game winning string but the Deacons clipped that by a 20-0 margin. The only stumbling block was St. Paul, Cretin, with 24 straight victories, who stopped us by a 13-7 margin.

The record books for the "Fabulous Fifties" show an overall record of 69 wins, 14 losses, and 2 ties.

They show 3 outright State titles and ties for 2 more.

They show many fine young men who shaped the above record; young men, who in most cases, had no more ability than the boys that they competed against; but, they did have a greater desire to play the game and were more willing to make the sacrifices necessary for success. To those young men I want to convey my sincerest thanks.

**ROGER MARIS** participated in three sports while attending Shanley High School and was probably the "most natural" athlete that I have worked with during the past twelve years:

Football was his top high school sport, and he was rewarded by being selected on the "All State" teams during both his junior and senior years. His long runs are legend. The game that I will always remember is the Devils Lake game of 1951. We had one of our weaker teams while the Satans were touted as an "Eastern" contender. When the dust had cleared on the Roosevelt Park field that September evening the scoreboard read: Shanley 33--Devils Lake--27. Roger had scored 32 of our 33 points. Walking off of the field after the game the Devils Lake coach remarked: "It got so bad we were afraid to score, because we would have to kick off and knew very well that Maris would run it back for a touchdown." (I believe he ran four kick offs back that night.)

Roger usually hit double figures in basketball where his speed, coordination, and aggressive-ness paid big dividends. He was a leader on our 1950-1951 squad which compiled one of the finest records, winning the city championship along with defeating the Fargo Midgets and the Moorhead Spuds twice.

To round out his high school athletic career, Roger was an outstanding performer on the track team. Our track squad in 1952 had one of its best seasons. At the State meet in Valley City, Roger placed in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, the shot put, and ran the lead off position in our 880 relay team which won that event.

Since graduting from high school Roger has climbed the ladder of baseball prominence. He has had some great moments in his young career; and also some disappointments. We want to wish him the best of luck in the future.
