Responsibilities:


- Teach mathematics courses at both the developmental and college levels.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's degree with a major in mathematics or
- Master's degree with a minimum of 18 graduate semester credits (27 graduate quarter credits) in mathematics.

- Demonstrated innovative use of assessment techniques.
- Demonstrated ability to thrive working with diverse communities.

- Experience in online teaching or demonstrated willingness to learn and develop online courses.

Temporary Full-Time faculty salaries currently range from \$37,437 – \$82,417 annually. Salary schedule placement is determined on the basis of education and experience and in accordance with the 2017-2019 Master Agreement between the Minnesota State Board of Trustees and the Minnesota State College Faculty (MSCF).

Temporary Full-time, faculty work 171 days during a nine-month academic year and receive excellent benefits including health insurance; life insurance; optional dental, short-and long-term disability and long-term care insurance; paid personal and sick leave; defined benefits and defined contribution plans; optional 457(b) and 403(b) retirement savings plans and tuition waiver for employees and dependents.
