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Criteria for the Forms of Asian Bodywork Therapy

To qualify as an AOBTA® Recognized ABT Form, the following criteria must be met:

Article 18 of the AOBTA Rules, Guidelines, and Procedures

1. The Form must have its foundation in Chinese Medicine
2. The Form must have a program of instruction that meets professional level membership requirements of the AOBTA® Curriculum.
3. The Form must have clearly defined theories and techniques of treatment that, although founded in Chinese Medicine Theory, are unique and which distinguish it from other Forms.
4. The Form must have origin of lineage or textual, canonical knowledge.
5. The Form must have at least 20 graduates, which include practitioners and instructors of said Form, who are professional level AOBTA® members.
6. The Form must have a written definition.
