

## Manuela Di Re – IPC




Manuela Di Re was called to the bar of the Province of Ontario in 1998 and to the bar of the State of New York in 2000. She began her practice as associate counsel at McCarthy Tétrault providing advice and representation to physicians in claims for medical negligence, in complaints before the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario and in matters before the Health Professions Appeal and Review Board and other administrative tribunals. She then continued her practice as senior legal counsel to a board of health, an ambulance service and two long-term care homes. In January 2005, she joined the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario and is now the Director of Legal Services and General Counsel.
