


# Atlantic Canada's economy: powered by increasing diversity

Population share, Atlantic Canada, 2021 (%)


- Women: 51%
- Indigenous peoples: 6%
- Immigrants: 6%
- Black Atlantic Canadians: 2%
- Visible minorities: 7%
- Persons with disabilities: 35%
- 2SLGBTQ+: 5%





# Rising immigration is contributing to a more diverse population


Visible minorities as a share of population (%)





## Improving share of women employed in senior positions


Share of women by select indicator (% of total)





# Lower share of visible minorities employed in management relative to population share


Share of visible minority by select indicator (% of total)





### Diversity groups' incomes improve but remain below median

Median income as a share of median income for all workers (%)



Median incomes for all diversity groups trail that for all workers in the Atlantic region and Canada

Women earned 23% less than men in 2021, but the gap has narrowed since 2016

Immigrant incomes are very close to the all-worker median in the region
