WHAT IF I AM NOT ELIGIBLE FOR HELP THROUGH THE PRO BONO PROGRAM?

The Pro Bono Program will try to refer you to another agency or program that may be able to help with your legal problem. If your income is too high to qualify or if your legal issue cannot be handled for FREE service through the Pro Bono Program, you may be able to obtain an attorney through the following legal providers:

LAWYER REFERRAL SERVICE

A representative will assist you in locating and referring you to an attorney who is well versed in the area of law needed.

FAMILY LAW SELF-HELP CENTER

Low income Montgomery County residents who want to proceed with a simple family law case without an attorney can get limited legal advice or general legal information from staff and volunteer attorneys. It is a FREE walk-in clinic located on the first floor of the Circuit Court for Montgomery County, Maryland, 50 Maryland Avenue, Room 1500 South Tower, Rockville, MD 20850; Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:00 am - 4:30 pm and Tuesdays from 8:00 am - 8:00 pm.

WHAT IS THE PRO BONO PROGRAM?

The Pro Bono Program provides FREE LEGAL SERVICES to low-income county residents in civil cases. The Pro Bono Program provides two means for residents to receive free services - at a legal advice clinic or through the client intake line for referral to an attorney volunteer for direct representation.

Who is Eligible?

Clients must meet **ALL** of the following criteria to be eligible:

- You must be a resident of Montgomery County
- You must meet the Maryland income eligibility guidelines
- You must need assistance in an area of law which volunteer attorneys in the pro bono program will handle

WHAT DO I DO IF I NEED AN ATTORNEY TO REPRESENT ME FOR FREE?

(Please note that walk-ins are not accepted)

- If you appear to be eligible, based on the initial intake screening, the Pro Bono Program will mail you forms which must be completed and returned to us within ten business days. You must include a non-refundable \$25.00 processing fee (Cashier's Check or Money Order ONLY) with your completed application.
- Once determined to be eligible, after returning all the necessary information, the Pro Bono Program will place you on a wait list for an attorney. When a volunteer attorney agrees to review and accept your case, you will be sent a letter with the attorney's name and telephone number. You must follow up and contact the attorney to set up all appointments.
- Every effort will be made to place your case with an attorney; however, we do not guarantee placement.

WILL I GET AN ATTORNEY TO REPRESENT ME IMMEDIATELY?

No. The Pro Bono Program depends on volunteers, so it may take several weeks to find an attorney available to represent you. For this reason, the Program cannot assist people who have emergency cases.
