CALL FOR LATE-BREAKING POSTER ABSTRACTS
MAY 22-25, 2018 | MONTREAL, QUEBEC

Background

The 2018 Canadian Pain Society (CPS) Annual Scientific Meeting will create a forum in which scientists, healthcare professionals, patients, and trainees from clinical, educational, research, policy, industry and other settings can meet and exchange up-to-date information on pain mechanisms, assessment, and management. The Scientific Program Committee (SPC) seeks to offer a balanced and diverse scientific program that reflects different areas of science from all members of the pain community. Because 2018 is the International Association for the Study of Pain (IASP)'s Global Year for Excellence in Pain Education, submissions on the topic of pain education are encouraged.

Remuneration

The CPS does not provide any remuneration for accepted poster abstracts. All speakers, including patient speakers, are responsible for their own travel, accommodation and registration costs. Any author that has an accepted poster is required to register and pay to attend the meeting, for at least the day of their presentation.

Submission Guidelines

All abstract submissions are only accepted through the CPS website. Once submitted the author will be directed to a webpage thanking and confirming receipt of their proposed abstract(s). The submitting author will receive notification of acceptance of their abstract(s) once reviewed by the Scientific Program Committee. Submissions and presentations may be made in English or in French.

Canadian Journal of Pain

Accepted abstracts will be printed in the online *Canadian Journal of Pain*, published by Taylor and Francis, and will be available for online viewing at the 2018 Annual Scientific Meeting. If any of the requested information is missing on the abstract templates, the Journal may not consider your abstract for publication.

Onsite

All late-breaking poster abstracts will be presented in two separate rooms across the hall from the tradeshow where the exhibitor booths and first round of poster abstracts will be on display.



LATE-BREAKING RESEARCH POSTER ABSTRACTS | DEADLINE: MARCH 19, 2018

Description:

Posters can include summaries of the results of any research study (quantitative or qualitative) in the area of pain. While the results of pilot studies and abstracts with preliminary results will be considered, abstracts without any data and/or proposals will generally not be deemed suitable for acceptance.
