



Knowledge Translation at the Canadian Pain Society Annual Meeting

Do you have a *knowledge translation, education, or patient engagement initiative* that you would like to share with the Canadian pain community?

We want to showcase your knowledge translation, education, and patient engagement initiatives at the Canadian Pain Society's Annual Scientific Meeting in Montreal this May!

We know that many of these efforts never get shared through traditional research posters, symposia, or publications, but are critical to advancing pain research and care in Canada.

We are creating a rotating slideshow to share your initiatives between sessions at the scientific meeting.

Examples might include new pain education materials (e.g., handouts, websites, videos, magazine inserts), patient or family engagement as partners on research projects, and/or new clinical programs.

Submission Requirements:

- 1 static slide (no videos or moving graphics) with:
 - 140 characters or less describing one knowledge translation, patient engagement, or education initiative success story (catchy, lay-friendly language, e.g., something “tweet-able”); and
 - A visual, graphic, logo, or photo (must have copyright approval to use); and
 - A web link, social media handle, or email contact where viewers can go for more information
- Limit of 1 submission per person

Please note: The purpose of this initiative is not to share research study results, but rather to showcase examples of public/patient-facing efforts of successful knowledge translation, patient engagement, and/or education in pain in Canada.
