An overview of Engineering Council HRB registration for new applicants and existing Engineering Council registrants.

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Section 1 – Engineering Council – HRB Registration Overview

The Engineering Council & HRB registration

Engineering Council has developed the HRB registration process covering varied disciplines to provide clients, residents, employers, and regulators with a higher degree of confidence that engineers are competent to work on Higher Risk Buildings. Engineering Council holds a publicly accessible register of registrants assessed as competent to work on HRB.

To become registered, CABE members will need to demonstrate competence against the requirements set out in **UK-SPEC for HRB**, which has been developed to set clear standards of competence for work on Higher Risk Buildings.

Registration with Engineering Council to work on Higher Risk Buildings provides a robust attestation of competence based on specially developed competence criteria set out in a new competence framework, referred to as UK-SPEC for HRB. However, CABE and Engineering Council cannot guarantee that regulators will accept Engineering Council registration for HRB as definitive evidence in all circumstances.

CABE members successfully completing this assessment process will need to maintain their Engineering Council registration* which will include paying the annual registration fee (if applicable) in addition to their CABE membership fees. Registration for HRB will come at an extra cost to be set by the Engineering Council.

This process is subject to licensing by Engineering Council and ongoing third-party review of the assessment process to ensure that outcomes are consistent and based on robust evidence of competence. However, applicants are reminded that:

- I. Registration provides evidence of general levels of competence only and does not indicate the ability to undertake any task.
- II. Building Engineers must therefore adhere strictly to working within the limits of their own competence and refuse to undertake work they know is beyond those limits.

Grades of registration for HRB

Registration for HRB is available at the existing three grades of Engineering Council registration which will be recognised by descriptors in addition to **CEng**, **IEng** and **EngTech** post nominals* (if applicable) (TBC once designations have been approved by the Engineering Council).

Types of registration for HRB

UK-SPEC for HRB sets out competence criteria relating to:

- Generalist Engineering Disciplines (including Building Engineers)
- Structural Engineering disciplines
- Services Engineering Disciplines
- Fire Safety Disciplines.

CABE is currently able to offer assessment against the **generalist requirements for UK-SPEC for HRB** only. This means that you will be recognised as having the necessary skills to undertake a broad range of building engineering tasks on higher risk buildings.

CABE is reviewing how to provide an assessment route against the Fire Safety Discipline annex of UK-SPEC for HRB and further information will be published separately once this has been developed.

Eligibility

Registration is open to both existing Engineering Council registrants and CABE members who have not yet obtained Engineering Council registration. All applicants will need to be able to demonstrate suitable competence to work on Higher Risk Buildings (this can include work under supervision of more experienced Building Engineer or other suitably competent building professional).

Any person wishing to apply to Engineering Council for HRB registration must:

- a. be a current CABE member in good standing (i.e., up-to-date CPD, no pending complaints or unspent sanctions) at the relevant grade to which you want to apply for registration, e.g., if you are MCABE, you would be at the level of IEng Engineering Council & HRB registration.
- b. be able to meet the criteria in the relevant section of UK-SPEC for HRB
- c. be able to demonstrate a track record of relevant experience working on Higher Risk Buildings.

*Note: CABE members may apply at a lower grade of HRB registration with Engineering Council if they wish, i.e., a member at MCABE C.Build E could apply for HRB registration at IEng or EngTech level. No member can apply for HRB registration at a grade higher than the equivalent CABE membership grade.

The necessary duration and type of experience required will be assessed this process but, in general, it is expected that applicants at EngTech level should have at least two years' supervised experience; applicants at IEng level should have at least five years' relevant experience and CEng level applicants should have at least seven years' relevant experience.

Using the relevant guidance

CABE has produced separate guidance documents setting out the processes that new and existing registrants will need to follow in order to be registered with Engineering Council to work on Higher Risk Buildings. The route to application that you will follow will depend on:

- I. your existing status in terms of Engineering Council registration and CABE membership
- II. your relevant qualifications
- III. your relevant industry experiential learning; and
- IV. your career history.

There are various approaches to building the necessary evidence and undertaking assessment for HRB registration. This includes routes which recognise relevant academic qualifications (Academic Route) as well as options which reply more on your career experience (such as the Experiential Learning Assessment).


All CABE's routes to registration are based on generally accepted principles of how to assess underpinning knowledge and professional competence, which means that that all your skills, knowledge, experience, and behaviours are considered as a whole.

Section 2: HRB Application Process

The following flow chart provides an overview of the three primary stages of the HRB registration process which are the same for all applicants. The detailed route you will follow is determined at Stage 1 following receipt of your application form and HRB Competence Report, with desktop assessment and review of evidence submitted at Stage 2 before proceeding to a Professional Review Interview at Stage 3. Further detail on each stage is provided in the guidance documents.



The HRB Competence Report

Depending on which detailed assessment route you follow you will be required to different types of information in support of your application. Whichever route you follow, the main body of evidence for meeting the criteria in the relevant section of **UK-SPEC for HRB** will be provided in a **Competence Report** which provides an opportunity to evidence your expertise.

The HRB Registration process differs from the existing registration process by utilising evidence of underpinning knowledge and understanding in combination with the Competence Report to demonstrate competence for UK-SPEC for HRB (which also covers all aspects of UK-SPEC), as opposed to the competency-based application form that is used in the main Engineering Council registration process.

Further information on the HRB Competence Report is provided in the detailed guidance documents. The report is also the basis for the Competence Report Interview.

^{*}By utilising a report to demonstrate competence against the criteria set out in UK-SPEC for HRB at the relevant grade, a CABE member – if successful in the process – can achieve HRB registration and Engineering Council registration simultaneously; however, acceptance of Engineering Council registration is not mandatory in order to hold HRB registration with Engineering Council. If an applicant wishes to be added to the main Engineering Council register following a successful HRB assessment, this must be specified at the time of application, and this will result in possibly two entry, but certainly two recurring annual costs to be set by Engineering Council.*
