Near-Miss Reporting App Launch – Alpine Close Calls Survey

A near-miss is an unintended, unsafe situation that could have resulted in injury but for a lucky intervention. The Alpine Near-Miss Survey catalogues near-misses because studies show that they outnumber accidents 10 to 1, which gives a bigger pool of incidents to study. Studying near-misses may also identify unsafe trends *before* they result in accidents.
