DANIEL O'CONNELL'S SONS

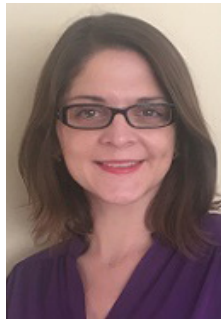
