The Education Policy Fellowship Program (EPFP) is a nine-month professional development program that provides emerging leaders with the knowledge and networks to impact a broad range of education and public policy issues from an equity perspective.

Fellows concentrate on three program strands:

- Policy
- Leadership
- Networking

Fellows discuss and apply new insights and build and develop new skills.
