Hello, my name is Kara Komula, and I am a Chemical Engineer at Sandia National Laboratories. I hold a Bachelor of Science in Biochemistry and a Master of Science in Biomedical Engineering from the University of New Mexico.

Besides my engineering responsibilities, I serve as the Chair for ANGLE (Advancing the Next Generation of Leadership Excellence), an employee resource group focused on career development, networking, and public outreach. In this role, I support 13 sub-chairs and advocate for ANGLE's mission: to create opportunities for workforce members to connect with each other, Sandia National Laboratories, and the Albuquerque community. 
