

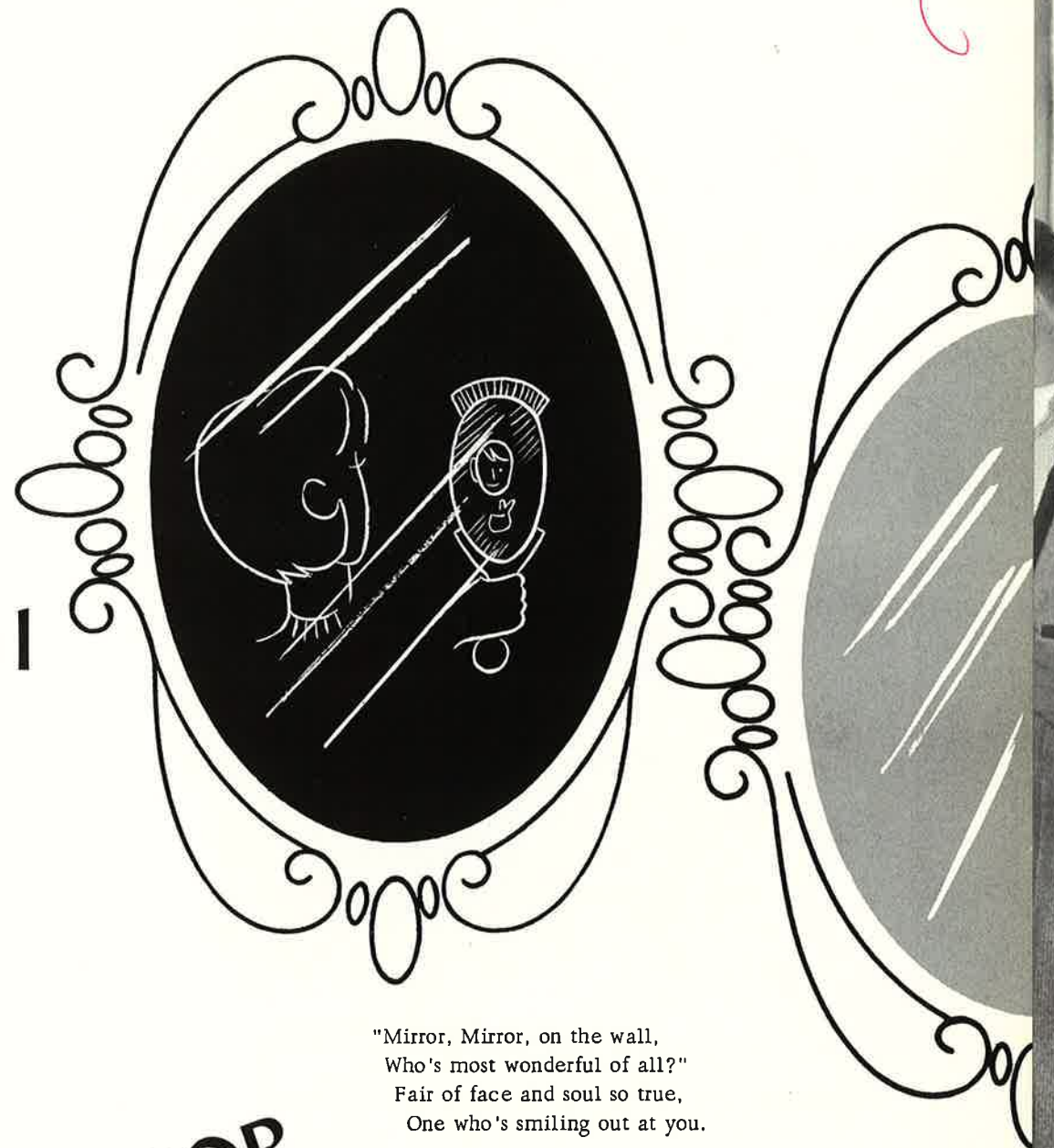

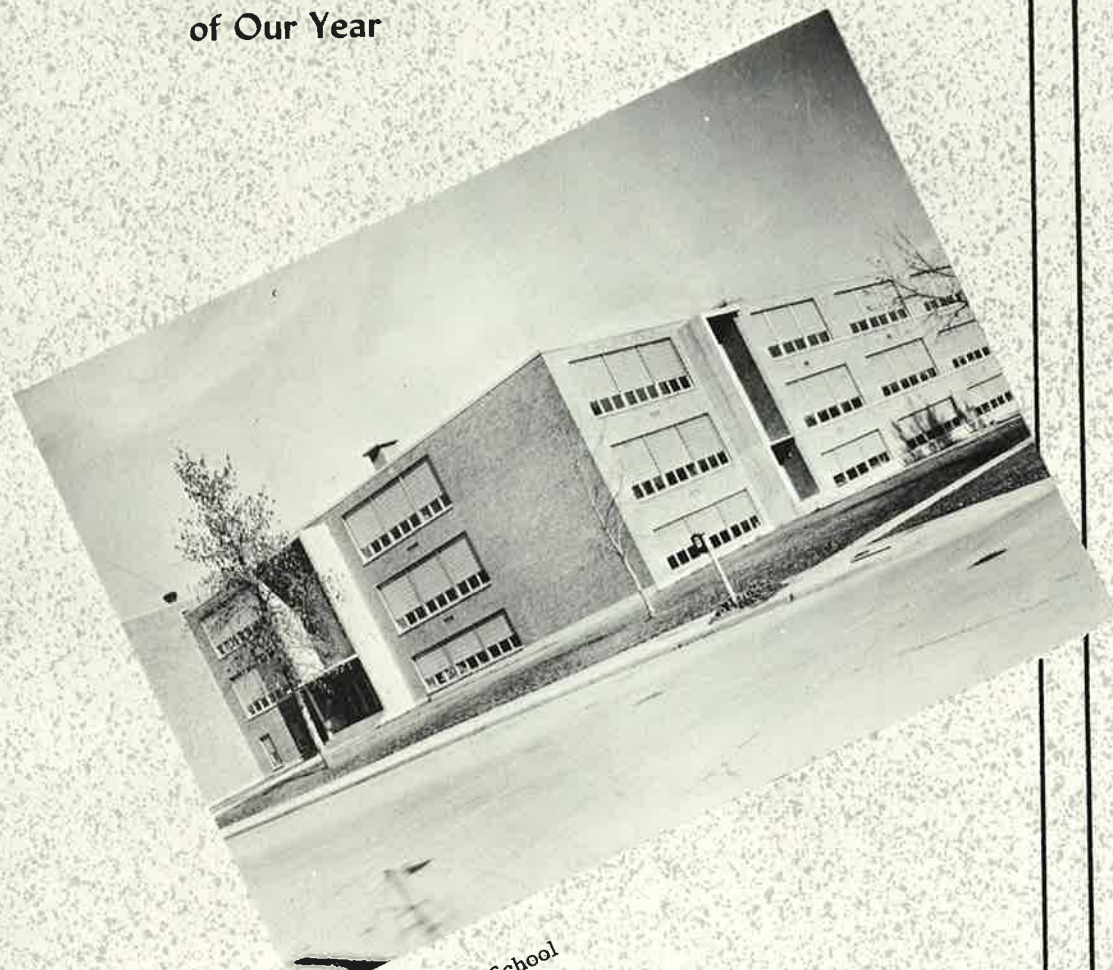

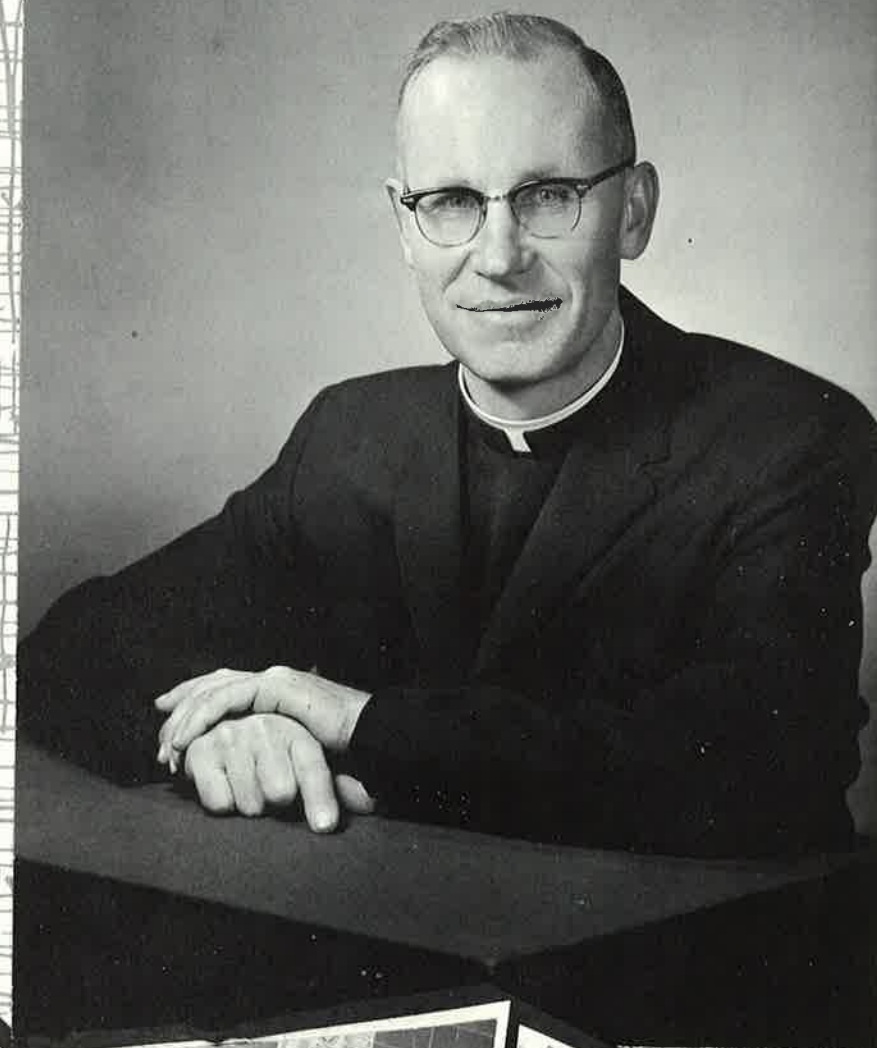
To the students of Shanley Father Edward Arth has become an inspiration and a source of ambition.

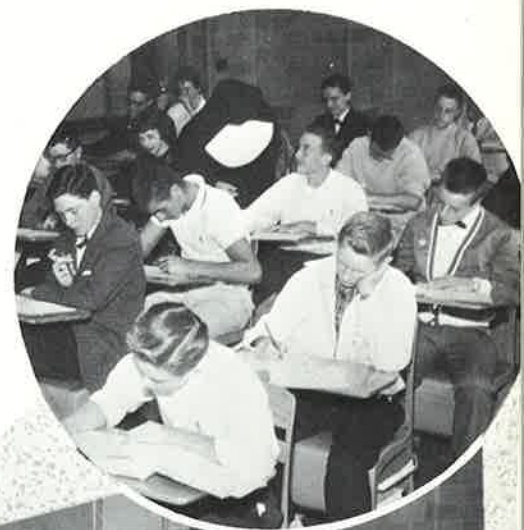

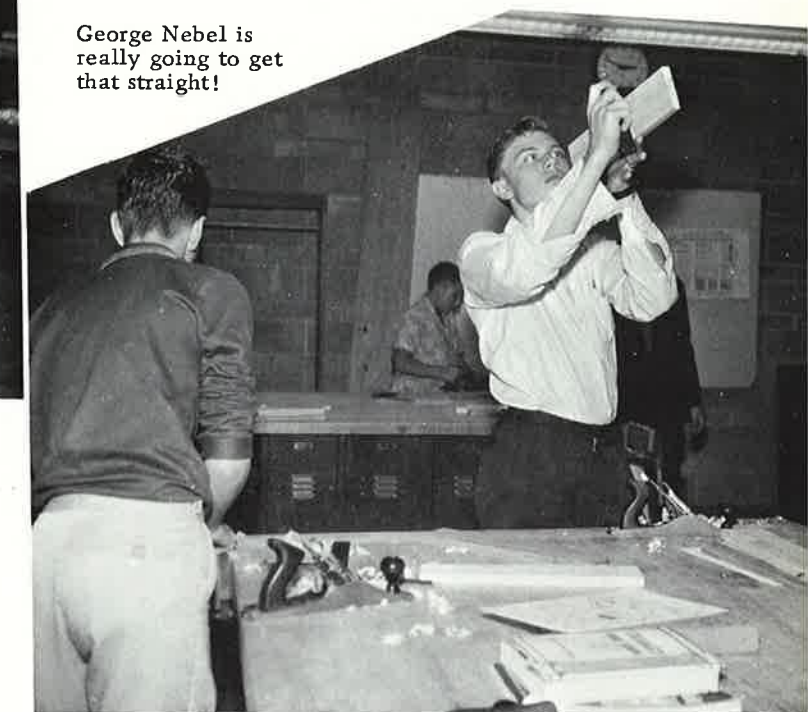

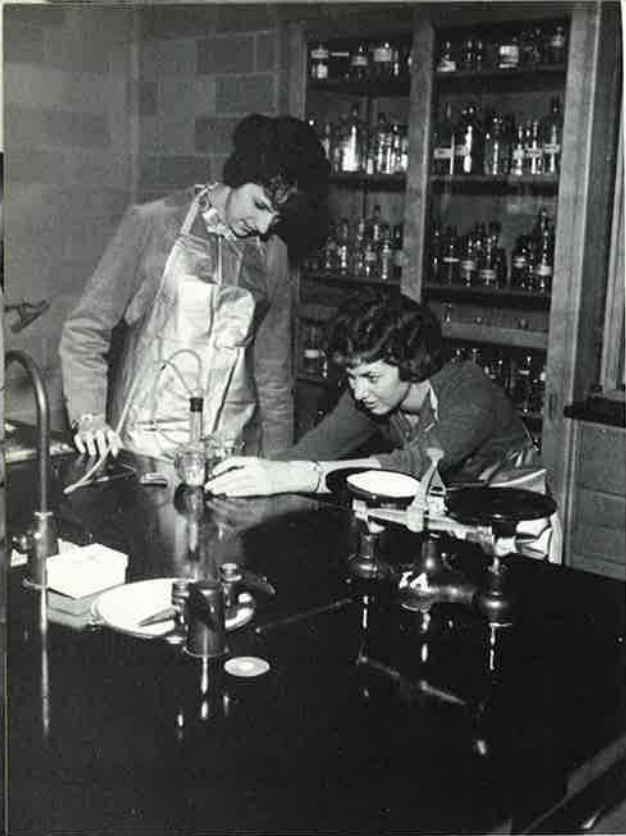

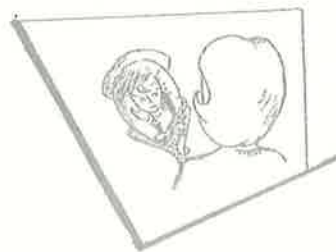

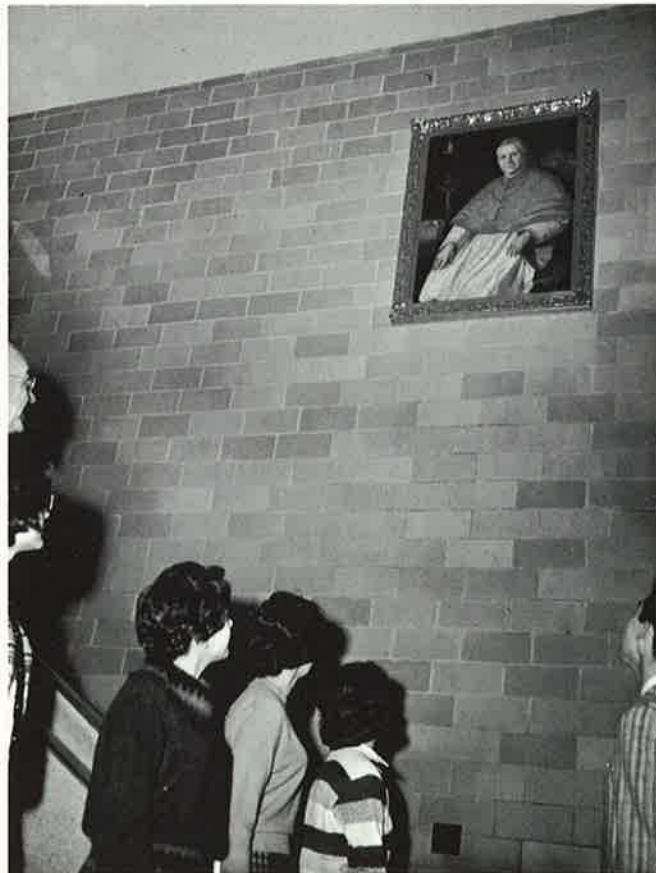

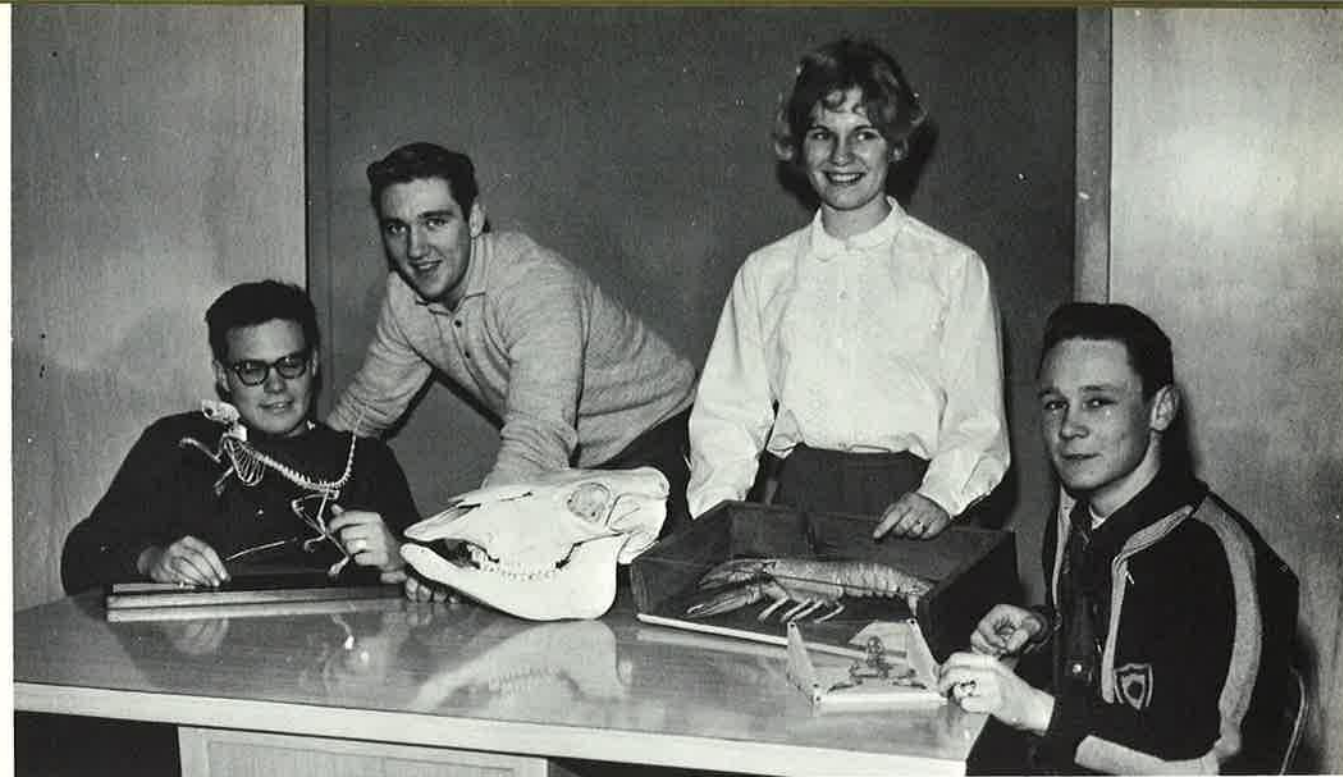

Presentation Sisters Move Into New Convent

Opened by the Presentation Sisters in 1897, the Sacred Heart Academy extended facilities yearly until in 1903 a four-year high school course was introduced. As the enrollments increased and expansion was necessary, Shanley High School was opened in 1949-1950. Some classes were still held in the old building until the present Shanley was completed. Private music and art lessons are still given at Sacred Heart Convent.

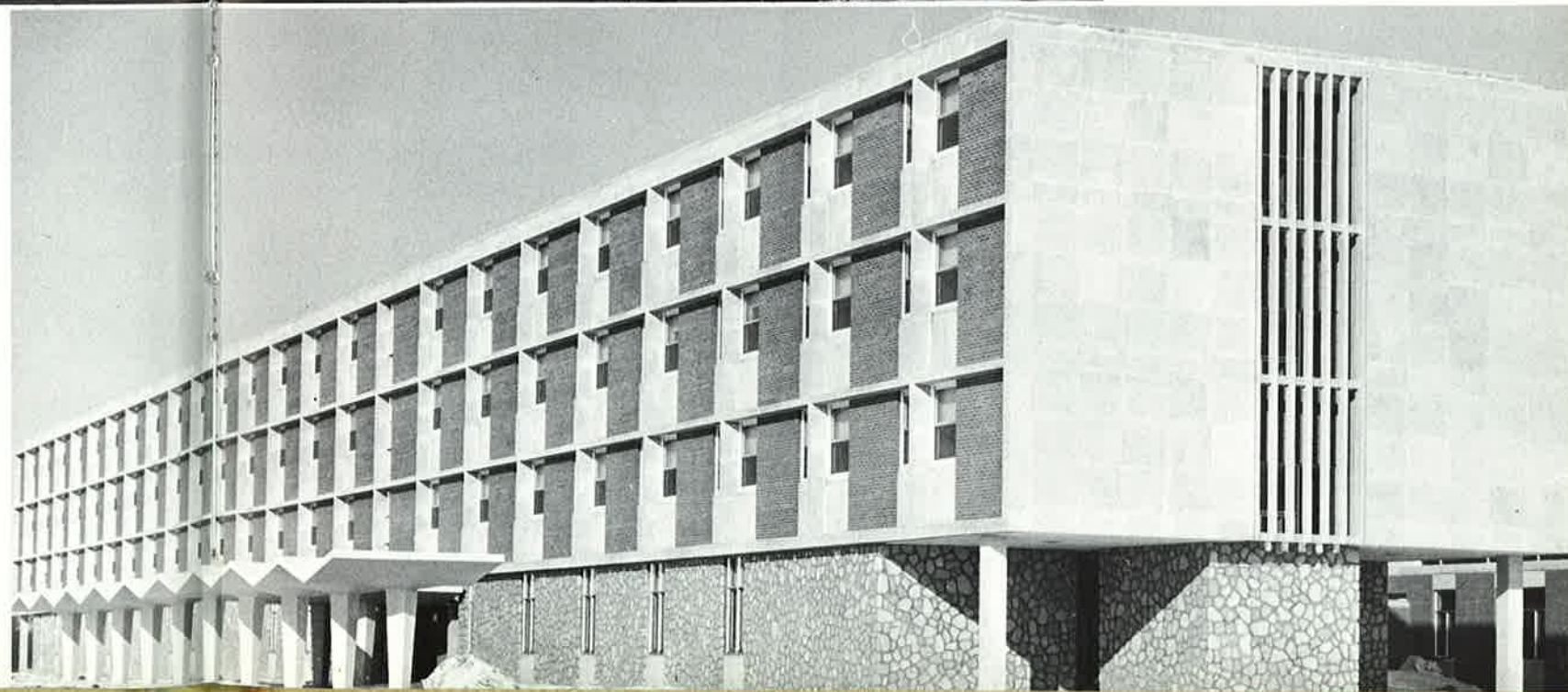
In 1957, when the tornado struck Fargo most of Sacred Heart Academy was destroyed. Building preparations were begun for a new convent. At the present writing the Sisters are preparing to move to the new Sacred Heart Convent south of Fargo. The residential area is pictured below. The new convent has junior college facilities.

Bishop Leo F. Dworschak consecrated the altar and offered Mass in the new convent on February 18.

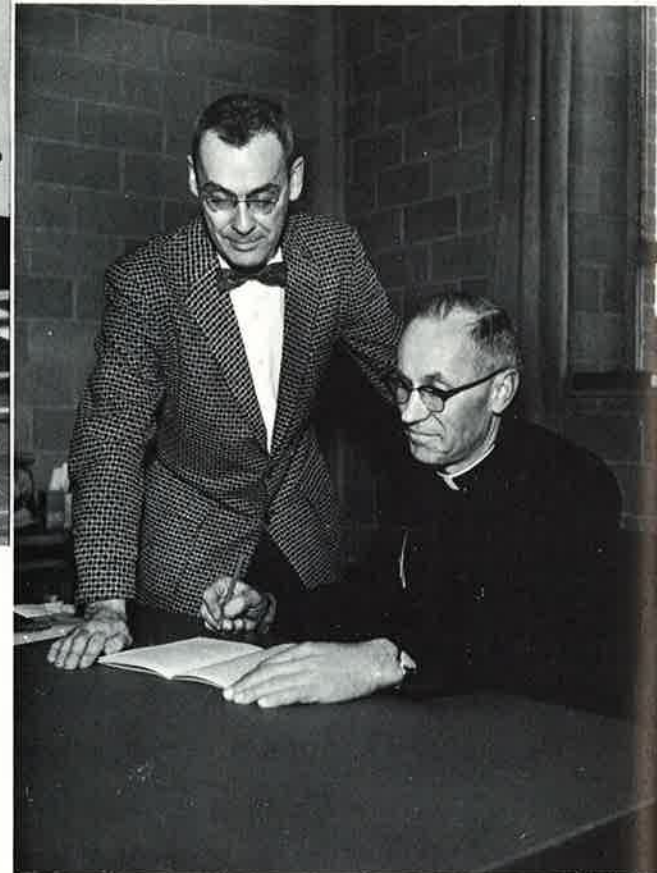

3. The Fall Festival, Nov. 15 in Shanley gym. (This is to be held each fall hereafter.) Proceeds went to the Sacred Heart Convent Building fund.
4. The Silver Tea held in St. Mary's Club Rooms, June 19. Alumnites were honored on this occasion by both the Democratic and Republican Political Nominees, namely, U.S. Senator, John F. Kennedy, now President, with his secretary and van guard; also Senator Quentin Burdick and Senator Stewart Symington; also Lieutenant Governor C. P. Dahl and Mrs. Dahl; and Chris Hilleboe, GOP County Chairman.

The association has pledged five thousand dollars to the Convent Fund. The money will go toward Chapel furnishings.

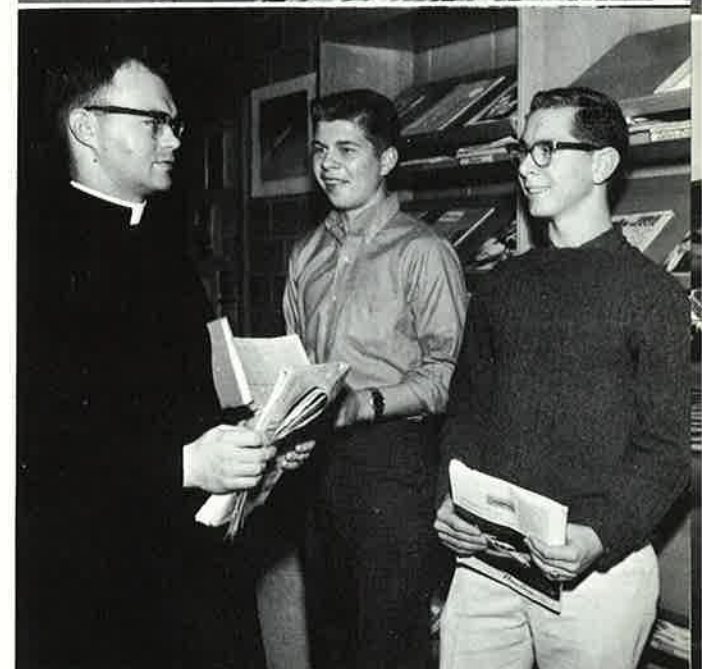

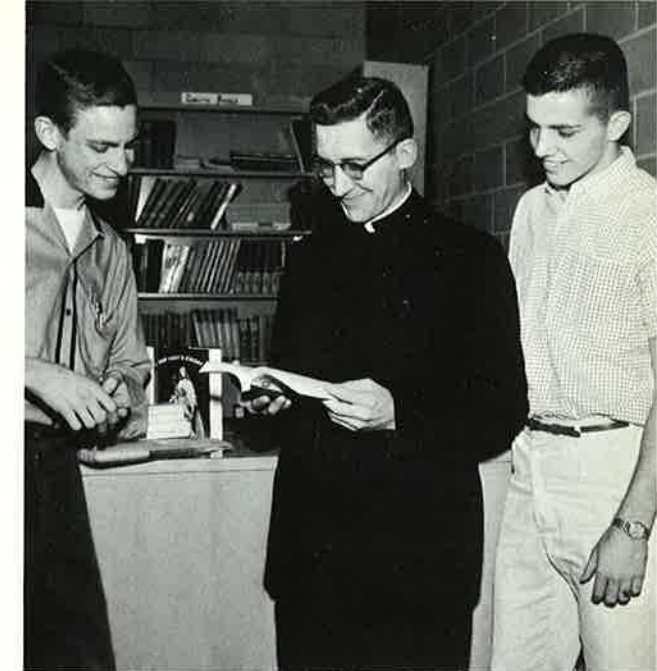
