Becoming a Florida Medicaid Provider



Why?

Access to reimbursement for services you may already be providing, larger referral streams.

Overall process:

- 1 Obtain a National Provider Identifier (NPI).
- 2 Complete the Florida Medicaid Provider Enrollment Application.
- 3 Undergo background screening.
- 4 Submit supporting documentation and provider agreement.

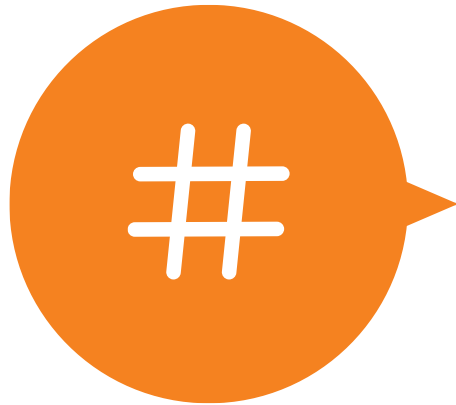
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Examples of services you may already be providing you could get reimbursed for:

- > Care Coordination
- > Pre- and Post-Natal Education and Support
- > Behavioral Health Services
- > Substance Abuse Treatment
- > Rehabilitative Services: Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech-Language Pathology
- > Home Healthcare



Step by Step Get Your NPI

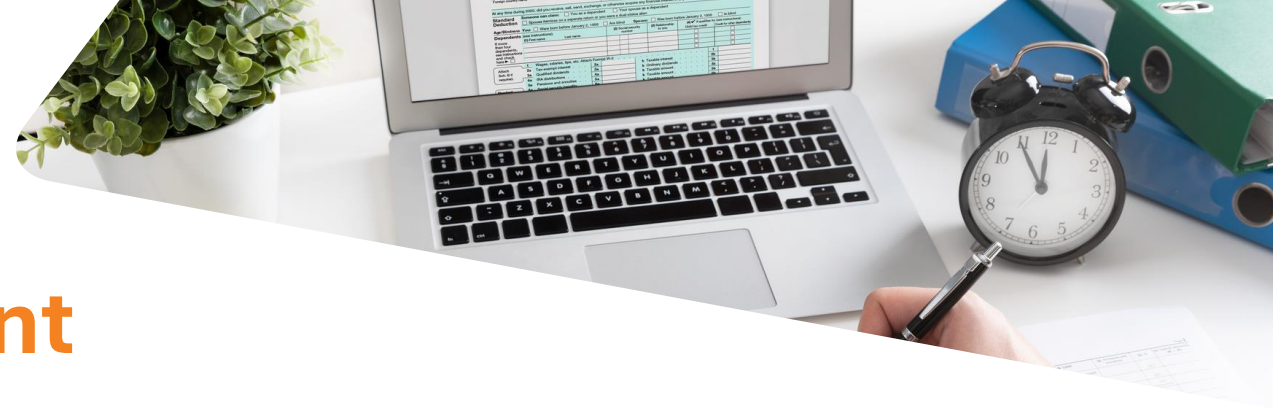


What is an NPI? A 10-digit unique identification number for healthcare providers, issued by the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES).

To apply visit **NPPES Website** (<https://nppes.cms.hhs.gov/#/>) and complete the online application.

You will receive your NPI **via email**.
