California Flood Preparedness Week (CFPW) Background

- 2011: CFPW proposed during a Sacramento flood conference
- 2012: first CFPW, with Sacramento County as the only participating entity
- 2013: Silver Jackets kicked off CFPW with charter signing event, with 22 participating entities
- 2018: will be the seventh year for CFPW, with events being planned statewide

CFPW Purpose

- To empower local agencies and entities to inform their citizens on the concepts of flood risk communication and flood preparedness.

CFPW Approach

- Interagency coordination is key to organizing events for the week. Participating agencies can host public events, hold emergency drills and exercises, and release resolutions about flood risk, as well as other activities.
