



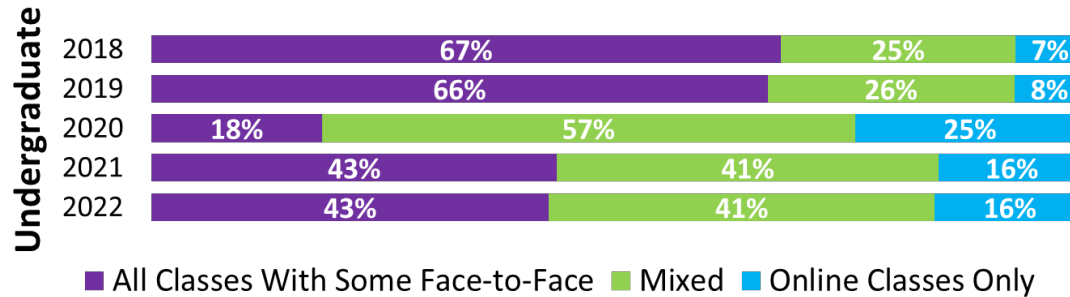

Moving Beyond Covid

- Covid caused major shift to “online classes only”
 - But students have returned to “face-to-face” and “mixed”



Access: Offer Services Wherever Students Are

- Continue best practices that we learned from Covid
- Offer remote options for classes, tutoring, advising for academics, career, financial aid, etc.
- Utilize 409 public libraries
 - Students can study in quiet spaces and access workstations, printers and WiFi
 - Students can checkout laptops, tablets, WiFi hotspots
 - Communities have access to books and WiFi using Bookmobiles



Access: Offer Programs Wherever Students Are

- High school
 - Dual enrollment, Film academy CTAE pathway
- Across different USG institutions
 - Dual agreements (e.g., BS Georgia Highlands + BS at Georgia Tech)
 - Regents' engineering (e.g., Georgia Southwestern → Georgia Southern)
 - Transfer of 42 hrs core plus 18 hrs major across all USG institutions
- Across the State
 - E-Campus: E-Core and E-Major
 - Collaborative programs (e.g., fintech courses, film academy)



Delivery: Prepare Students for Careers

- Programs aligned with workforce needs across the state
 - Competencies to meet demand (employers/earnings/labor trends)
 - 33 new programs from Aug '22 to Aug '23 (e.g., 14 in Bus/Comp Sci)
 - Across Georgia (e.g., B.S. in Ag-Tech at ABAC, M.S. in Data Science at Clayton, Ph.D. in Artificial Intelligence at UGA)
- Data science courses/technology; Film/Fintech academies
- Tools for guidance on selecting major, career path, etc.
 - System: Stepping Blocks, Georgia Degrees Pay
 - Institutions: Handshake, resume writing tools, etc.

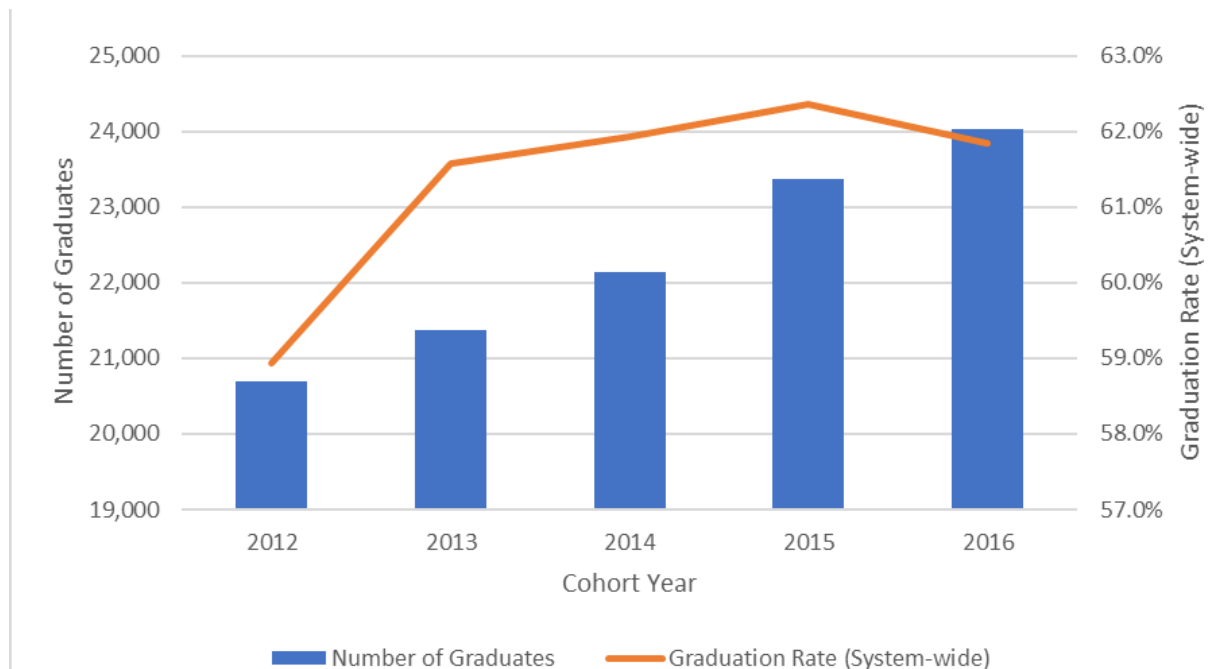


Success: For Students and Georgia

- Last year, no. of graduates at all-time high (74,446)
 - Higher enrollment in prior years
 - Focus on student success—purpose, pathways, and mindset
- Simultaneous improvement in student outcomes
 - Higher graduation rates
 - Recent five years (2012-2016 cohorts): 58.9% increased to 61.8%
 - Shorter time to degree
 - Recent five years (2018-2022 graduates): 5.10 years decreased to 4.87 years

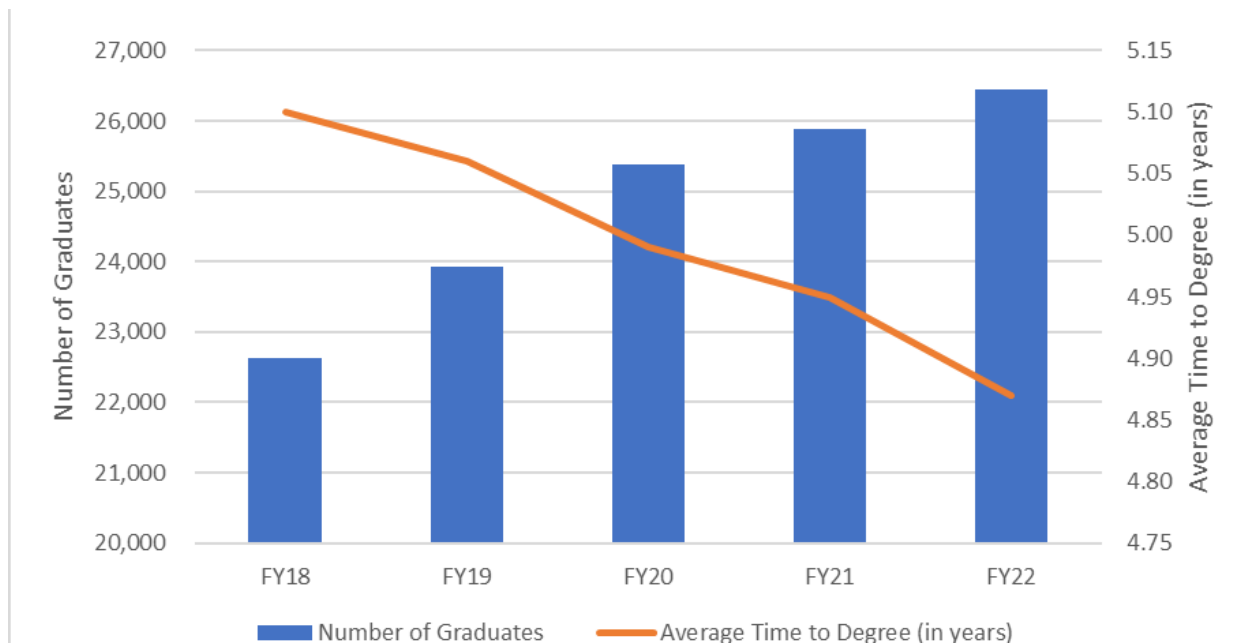
Success: For Students and Georgia
