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Victorian Statewide Roll-Out of CAT 2007-2008

- GPV negotiated attractive price for CAT statewide roll-out
- All divisions purchased CAT & provided it free to practices
- Approx. 34% Vic practices installed & used CAT
- Big variation in practices per division: <u>5% 95%</u>
- Some divisions supporting systematic data quality improvement activities – Collaboratives "Light"




Goal of current study:

Methods

- Conducted structured interviews with division staff
- Developed & conducted survey with Vic CEOs (17) & program staff (19)
- Discussions with divisions & SBOs from other states, particularly users of other PCDT
- Visits, workshops, discussions, data, experience, etc,
- Analysed results & described best practice
