The Problem

Children and adults who rely on Medicaid Private Duty Nursing generally get less than half of the services they need to live safely at home. NH Medicaid's reimbursement rates are too low to enable home care agencies to recruit and retain these specialized nurses. RNs and LPNs can earn much more working in a hospital or providing similar PDN care in Massachusetts.

The Solution

NH Medicaid PDN rates must be increased significantly so agencies can pay competitive wages, attract more nurses, and provide patients with the services they need. It's critical that the NH Legislature fully fund this rate increase in the State Budget.

How You Can Help

- Contact your NH State Senator in April and May (sooner is better!)
- Tell them your story.
- Ask them to target \$2.6 million in general funds in the budget for FY '24 and \$5.3 million in FY '25 to stabilize and grow Medicaid Private Duty Nursing.
- Consider testifying at the Senate Finance Committee state budget public hearing on May 2nd at 1:00 pm at the State House.
