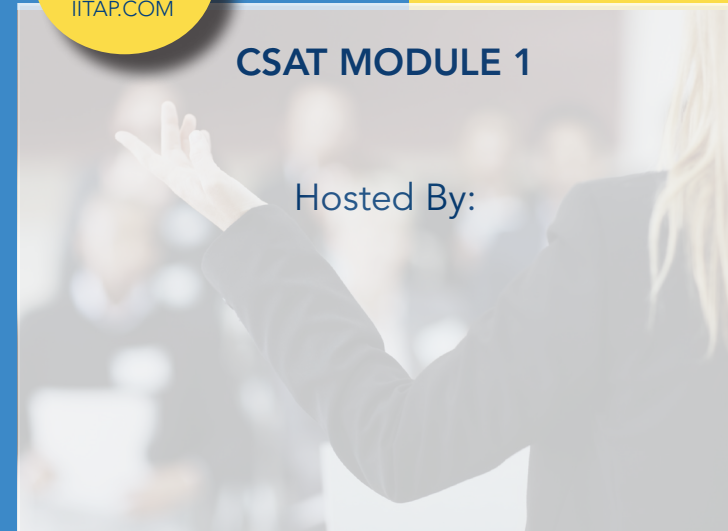

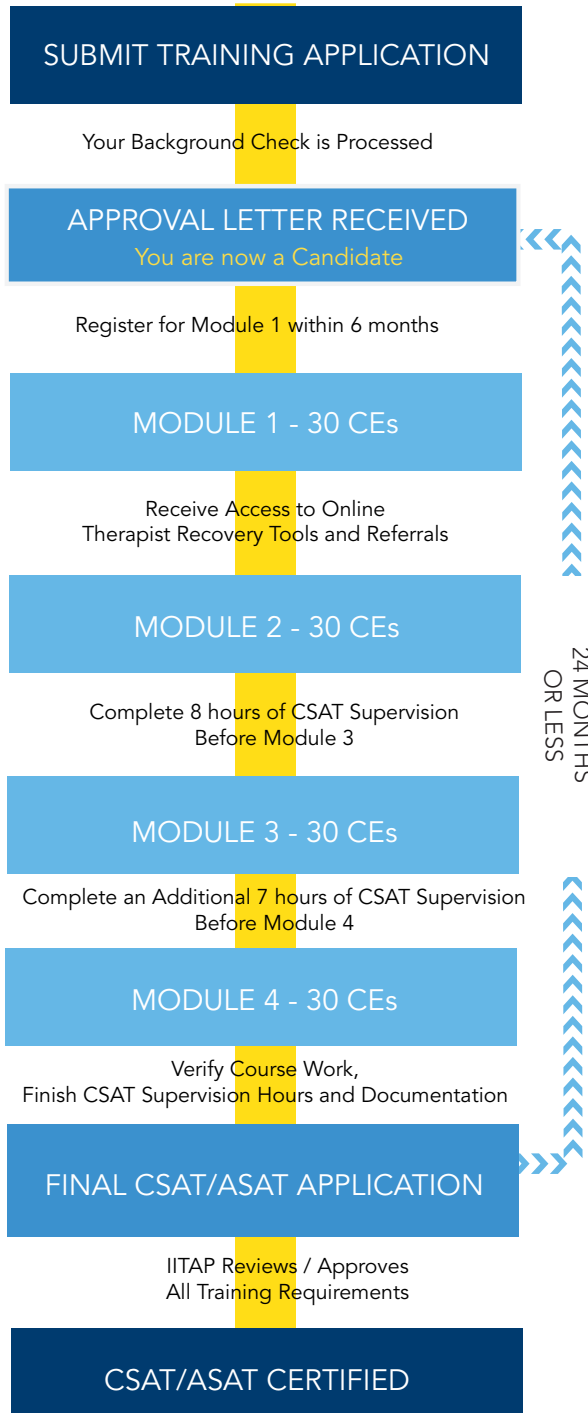

CSAT / ASAT TRAINING STEPS



HOW DO I BECOME A CSAT® or ASAT?

- A Certified Sex Addiction Therapist (CSAT®) requires the following **credentials upon completing all four (4) training modules** and prior to submitting your Application for Final Certification.
- Licensed through a state board (or equivalent) as a social worker, therapist, doctor, psychiatrist, or counseling clergy.
- Master's Degree or higher from an accredited institution in psychology, counseling, or related mental health field.
- Minimum of five years clinical counseling experience.

The Associate Sex Addiction Therapist (ASAT) certification is for candidates who do not fully meet the requirements for the CSAT® program. For example, an intern who has completed their master's degree and is working on acquiring a state licensure, or an undergraduate with a bachelor's degree. As an ASAT you will receive the same training and tools developed by Dr. Patrick Carnes for the CSAT® certification.

- An ASAT requires the following **credentials upon completing all four (4) training modules** and prior to submitting your Application for Final Certification.
- Associate/Intern license through a state board (or equivalent); or certified through NAADAC.
- Bachelor's Degree or higher from an accredited institution in psychology, counseling, or related mental health field.
- Less than 5 years of clinical counseling experience.

Candidates must complete a minimum of 30 hours of clinical supervision and mentoring with an approved CSAT Supervisor.
