





### **Indiana J-1 Visa Waiver 2017 Cycle Update**

Indiana will begin accepting applications for the 2017 Cycle of the J-1 Visa Waiver Program September 1, 2016. Please note that IPHCA has not yet received the 2017 J-1 Visa Waiver Guidelines from ISDH. Applications will be accepted based on the 2016 guidelines, but please be aware changes might be requested once the 2017 Guidelines are released, if any changes are made to the guidelines or requirements.

Applications will be reviewed as received but will not be processed until October 1, 2016 for Primary Care physicians and January 1, 2017 for Specialist physicians. IPHCA will continue to post updates on the website as they are available. ### **Student to Service Loan Repayment Program Application Cycle Now Open!**

Are you a medical or dental student in your final year of school?

The [National Health Service Corps \(NHSC\) Students to Service Loan](#)

[Repayment Program](#) (S2S LRP) provides up to \$120,000 to medical (MD and DO) or dental (DDS or DMD) students in their final year of school in return for a commitment to provide primary health care full time for at least 3 years at an approved NHSC site in a Health Professional Shortage Area of greatest need.

### **Benefits**

Students to Service loan repayment award recipients receive up to \$120,000 (tax free) for at least three years of full-time service at an approved NHSC site in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) of greatest need. Upon completion of residency for medical students (dental residency is encouraged but not required), recipients serve as primary care providers in an NHSC-approved site in a HPSA of greatest need.

### **Finance and Operations Updates**

#### **RID Numbers Change for Newly Eligible Members**

New members enrolling in Medicaid may have a slightly different RID (Recipient Identification number). Effective July 17, IHCP member may have RID numbers which start with "120" whereas historically, RID numbers start with "100." RID numbers will still be 12 digits long and conclude with "99." Effective 7/1 MDwise has a new delivery system called MDwise Community Health. As the name suggests, this is a Community Hospital based delivery system. The introduction of MDwise Community Health does not omit an existing delivery system. This delivery system encompasses the following areas: Indianapolis (Northeast including Fishers and Noblesville, far eastside and south side), Kokomo and Anderson. Active members in these geographic areas should not be transferred to MDwise Community Health nor will those who termed and re-determined (within a year). However, newly eligible members in these areas will be auto assigned to MDwise Community Health. This delivery system includes all IHCP lines of business including HIP, Hoosier Healthwise and Hoosier Care Connect. When checking eligibility in Web interChange and MDwise's portal, the member will be listed as "MDwise Community Health Network." At present time, Community Health has 2,412 Hoosier Healthwise and 866 HIP members. As with all MDwise members, they may change delivery systems within several days.
