On the Front Lines of Immigrant Homeownership: Asian American Nonprofits during the Great Recession | 在移民住房的前線：大衰退中的亞裔美國人非營利組織

**Abstract:** Asian American–serving nonprofits were on the forefront to help immigrant Asian American homeowners during the recession, particularly those with limited English proficiency. Yet, we know little about the experiences of these organizations, as they are relatively understudied in the nonprofit literature. We triangulated interviews with 14 Asian American–serving nonprofits providing housing counseling services with organizational tax records to advance theory on their roles and impacts. Our findings reveal that although Asian American nonprofits played an important role in serving limited English-speaking clients overlooked by other nonprofits during the recession, they struggled to provide comprehensive assistance and remain solvent. Asian American nonprofits used diverse troubleshooting strategies, including seeking certifications, diversifying funding sources, and creaming. Adopting more holistic funding criteria and encouraging greater collaboration among nonprofits serving immigrants would help Asian American nonprofits become more resilient.

摘要：經濟衰退期間亞裔美國人服務的非營利組織在前線幫助移民亞裔美國房主，特別是其中英語水平有限的人。然而，非營利組織領域其相關研究較少，所以我們對這些組織的經驗知之甚少。我們利用組織稅收記錄，對 14 家提供住房諮詢服務的亞裔美國人非營利組織進行了三角交叉驗證訪談，以推進關於其作用與影響的理論。我們的調查結果顯示：儘管這些組織在經濟衰退期間服務英語能力有限的群體中發揮了重要作用，且這個群體多被其他非營利組織忽視；但這些組織又苦於如何提供全面的幫助，並保持其有效性。他們的解決策略多元，包括尋求認證、多樣化其資金來源、以及篩選優先個案。採取更全面的資助標準，並鼓勵在為移民服務的非營利組織之間加強合作，將為亞裔美國人非營利組織的發展注入更多活力。

2018 will mark the anniversary of the 1968 burst of social movement mobilizations: from French May, over Anti-Vietnam War protests or the Tlatelolco massacre, to Prague Spring. The 1968 protest cycle considerably shaped social movements, political parties, universities, states, and societies as well as the social movement scholarship. Taking the 1968 anniversary as a stimulating moment for reflection, this conference seeks to provide space for looking at the implications of that period on social movement research as well as addressing a number of key questions in current social movement research. For instance:

1. How have the theoretical and methodological approaches in the social movement field evolved in the aftermath of 1968?
2. How did issues of protest change: which have emerged, disappeared or taken new forms? What is the impact of protest? When do movements bring social change?
3. How do social movements select their strategies?
4. How do they interact with other actors like parties, interest groups or NGO's?
5. Where do protestors end up in the aftermath of mobilization?
6. What is the role of memory in social movements mobilization?
7. What is the impact of individualisation on contentious politics?
8. What is the role of media coverage and new communication technologies?

### The Urban Politics of Squatters' Movements | 非法居住者运动的都市政治

#### Description | 簡介

This volume sheds light on the development of squatting practices and movements in nine European cities (Madrid, Barcelona, Seville, Rome, Paris, Berlin, Copenhagen, Rotterdam and Brighton) by examining the numbers, variations and significant contexts in their life course. It reveals how and why squatting practices have shifted and to what extent they engender urban movements. The book measures the volume and changes in squatting over various decades, mostly by focusing on Squatted Social Centres but also including squatted housing. In addition, it systematically compares the cycles, socio-spatial structures and the political implications of squatting in selected cities. This collection highlights how squatters' movements have persisted over more than four decades through different trajectories and circumstances, especially in relation to broader protest cycles and reveals how political opportunities and constraints influence the conflicts around the legalisation of squats.

Part II offers a series of thematic chapters, such as democratization, social enterprise, civic activism, and the media.



As an analysis of Asian social, cultural, and political phenomena from the perspective of civil society in the post-World War II era, this book will be useful to students and scholars of Asian Studies, Asian Politics, and Comparative Politics.
