

Assistant Professor of Fashion – School of Art Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts at Arizona State University

The School of Art in the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts at Arizona State University invites applications for a full-time tenure-track appointment in Fashion at the assistant professor level beginning fall 2018.

Located in one of the most expansive metropolitan centers in the United States, and situated in the Sonoran Desert, the school supports a broad range of art practice and inquiry. Programs within the School of Art lead to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Art with concentrations in art history, art studies, museum studies and fashion; an online BA in art history; Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) in Art with concentrations in art education, drawing/painting, ceramics, fibers, intermedia, photography, printmaking, sculpture/metals/woods; Master of Arts (MA) in Art with concentrations in art history or art education; and Master of Fine Arts (MFA) in Art. In addition, the school participates in the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) programs in Design, Environment and the Arts housed within the Herberger Institute. With several nationally ranked programs and one of the largest comprehensive art programs in a public research university in the United States, the ASU School of Art plays a prominent role within the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts and is located on both the Tempe and downtown Phoenix campuses.

The Assistant Professor of Fashion position will serve undergraduates in the School of Art's new BA degree in Fashion. Successful candidates should possess strong visual design skills, a capacity for conducting original creative design and/or scholarship, and the ability to teach a combination of practice-based studio courses and larger lecture courses. The appointee will be expected to assume a leadership role in implementing new directions in the newly formed fashion program. The position offers opportunities for collaborative, interdisciplinary teaching and curriculum development. A background in creative practice or industry, ideally with

emergent areas of fashion technologies, and an ability to bridge fashion across related fields are desired.

Required Qualifications:

- PhD or MFA in Fashion or related area.
- Ability to develop and teach innovative introductory and advanced courses in the new Fashion program
- Evidence of successful teaching experience in fashion design
- History of practice-based innovation in fashion design
- Record of successful creative activity and/or scholarship

Desired Qualifications: Demonstrated success in one or more of the following areas:

- Evidence of strong commitment to innovative research as well as undergraduate teaching
- Expertise in one or more of the following areas: fashion technology, sustainable practice, designing for diverse populations, material explorations in applications such as biomaterials, fashion entrepreneurship or performance, visual communication or other interdisciplinary work
- Interest in interdisciplinary and collaborative teaching
- Ability to generate and develop relationships with industry professionals
- Global perspective
- Visionary in fashion futures
- Evidence of a commitment to diversity in research and creative activity, teaching, recruitment, retention, and service

- Brief statement of teaching philosophy along with descriptions of courses taught and/or proposed
