The School of Art, Architecture + Design (soad.indiana.edu) invites applications for a full-time Assistant/Associate Professor position (tenure track) in the Fashion Design program (go.iu.edu/fashiondesign) to begin fall 2019.

We seek a forward-thinking colleague to be part of an innovative program in the art, design, and study of fashion, who is committed to interdisciplinary engagement, both within SoAAD, the College of Arts + Sciences, and across campus. The successful candidate will help to educate emerging leaders in higher education, museums, and the fashion industry of tomorrow. We are looking for scholars who can teach in the dress studies portion of the program; however, interest in creative activity and/or teaching fashion studios is also welcome.

Founded in 1820, IU-Bloomington is the flagship of eight campuses statewide, with a strong history of innovation, academic freedom, and commitment to the arts and humanities, including global languages and cultures. Embedded within the College of Arts + Sciences, the School of Art, Architecture + Design is dedicated to shaping the future of creativity, from imagination to implementation.

Position responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Actively pursue a program of scholarship related to dress studies, fashion studies, and/or fashion design
- Contribute to the national and international visibility of the program
- Teach an annual load of four, three-credit courses during the ten-month academic year, with specific courses to be determined based on the candidate's experience and expertise. Potential for summer teaching.
- Participate in undergraduate and graduate curriculum development
- Provide service to the program, school, university, and profession

Qualifications – all candidates should have:

- PhD or related terminal degree by the start date of employment, preferably in fashion studies or fashion design
- Evidence of expertise in fashion studies and/or dress studies, including areas such as fashion theory, behavioral aspects of dress, cultural aspects of dress, aesthetics, history of dress, history of fashion, and/or fashion curation
- Evidence of commitment to interdisciplinary scholarship and teaching
- Demonstrated record of (or potential for) publishing and grant writing

Other desirable (optional) qualifications include:

- Interest in engaging with the Elizabeth Sage Historic Costume Collection and other outstanding collections on the IUB campus
- Evidence of innovative teaching, including pedagogical grants and publications
- Evidence of leadership and mentoring
- Ability to teach studio courses
- Professional experience in the fashion industry
