





*Key findings: 4 bills signed into law — HB 413 (Act 159, auto rating factors, eff. 1/1/2027), HB 739 (Act 32, insurance fraud), HB 826 (Act 320, referrals for insurance sales), HB 904 (Act 326, captive insurance guidelines). HB 638 (contractor payments) enrolled and sent to governor. HB 943 substituted as HB 1241 (child support data match) — passed both chambers. HB 759 (fortified roof) died on the Senate calendar. All tort reform bills died without committee hearings. SB 355 (Fortify Homes discount) and most other Senate insurance bills died without hearings.*
