Sara coordinates multiple clinical trials and other research projects within the program and also conducts both individual and family outpatient therapy.

## June 10: Trauma, Dr. Laura Jones

An Assistant Professor in the Department of Applied Psychology and Counselor Education, Laura graduated in 2013 from The University of North Carolina at Greensboro with a Ph.D. in Counseling and Counselor Education. She also holds a M.S. degree in Psychology – Cognitive Neuroscience from the University of Oregon. Her research and clinical interests include trauma over the lifespan and vicarious trauma in counselors, with specific interests in the confluence of neuroscience, counseling, and culture as it relates to elucidating the experiences of female survivors of interpersonal trauma, the impact of trauma on interpersonal relationships, perceptions of safety following trauma exposure and efficacious interventions for survivors.

## June 17: Substance Use Disorders, Dr. Todd Lewis

Todd F. Lewis, PhD, is an Associate Professor of Counseling and Counselor Education at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor in North Carolina and a National Certified Counselor. Dr. Lewis is past Treasurer and President of the International Association of Addictions and Offender Counselors (IAAOC), a subdivision of the American Counseling Association. He has twice been the recipient of the Exemplary Research Award, an honor recognized by IAAOC related to substance abuse research. Throughout his career, he has taught graduate-level students in substance abuse and addiction counseling, assessment, diagnosis, and treatment planning. Dr. Lewis has published numerous research articles related to substance abuse and addiction, collegiate drinking, and theoretical approaches to addictions treatment. He has presented on these topics at numerous local, state, national, and international venues.
