### NOTICE AND ORDER OF REVOCATION

On the date shown above (\*Date Issued) you were asked to submit to a breath test pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 169A.50-.53, the Implied Consent Law.

Your driver's license and/or privilege to drive in this state is hereby **REVOKED. THIS IS YOUR OFFICIAL NOTICE OF REVOCATION.**

This revocation will take effect 7 days after the issue date shown above.

**TEST REFUSAL**

Because you refused to submit to testing, the Commissioner of Natural Resources hereby prohibits you from operating any motorboat, snowmobile, and all-terrain vehicle for a period of one year from the date of this notice as provided in Minnesota Statutes, sections 84.91, subdivision 1(c) and 86B.331, subdivision 1(c).

Additionally, the Commissioner of Public Safety will revoke your driver's license and/or driving privileges under authority of Minnesota Statutes, section 169A.52, subdivision 3 or Minnesota Statutes, section 171.177, subdivision 4 as follows:

- (1) For a person with no qualified prior impaired driving incidents within the past ten years, for a period of not less than one year;
- (2) For a person with one qualified impaired driving incident within the past ten years, or two qualified prior impaired driving incidents, for a period of not less than two years;
- (3) For a minimum of three, four, or six years as set forth below under (4) or (5).

**TEST FAILURE - .08 OR MORE**

Because you submitted to a breath test which disclosed an alcohol concentration of 0.08 or more, the Commissioner of Public Safety will revoke your driver's license and/or driving privileges under authority of Minnesota Statutes, section 169A.52, subdivision 4 as follows:

- (1) For a period of 90 days, or if the test results indicate an alcohol concentration of twice the legal limit or more, not less than one year;
- (2) If the person is under the age of 21 years, for a period of not less than 180 days, or if the test results indicate an alcohol concentration of twice the legal limit or more, not less than one year;
- (3) For a person with one qualified impaired driving incident within the past ten years, or two qualified prior impaired driving incidents, for a period of not less than one year, or if the test results indicate an alcohol concentration of twice the legal limit or more, not less than two years;
- (4) For a person with two qualified prior impaired driving incidents within the past ten years, or three qualified prior impaired driving incidents, for a period of not less than three years;
- (5) For a person with three qualified prior impaired driving incidents within the past ten years, for a period of not less than four years; or for a person with four or more qualified prior impaired driving incidents, for a period of not less than six years.

The officer shall invalidate the Minnesota driver's license or permit in such a way that no identifying information is destroyed and return it to the person.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

During the period of prohibition/revocation, you may not operate motor vehicles, including motorboats, snowmobiles, and all-terrain vehicles, in this state or on the ice of any boundary waters of this state.

If the prohibition is for motorboats, you may operate non-motorized watercraft, such as canoes, sailboats, or rowboats. You may also ride as a passenger aboard any watercraft, motorized or non-motorized.

## REQUEST FOR ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

You have the right to an administrative review of an order of revocation under Minnesota Statutes, section 169A.53, subdivision 1, or Minnesota Statutes, section 171.177, subdivision 10, and prohibition under Minnesota Statutes, section 86B.331 or 84.91. The Commissioner of Public Safety will review your revocation only upon written request.

## PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW

You have the right to petition for judicial review. Petitions must be filed in writing as outlined in Minnesota Statutes, section 169A.53, subdivision 2, or Minnesota Statutes, section 171.177, subdivision 11 in the county in which the incident occurred and within 60 days from receiving a notice and order of revocation. If you do not petition for judicial review of a revocation order exactly as prescribed in Minnesota Statutes, you lose the right to judicial review of the implied consent revocation.

## REINSTATEMENT INFORMATION

When your driver's license is revoked, you may not drive again in Minnesota under any condition, including using a driver's license from another jurisdiction, until you have complied with Minnesota's requirements and received a notice of reinstatement. Revocation of driving privileges under the implied consent law is an administrative action, which is independent and separate of the actions taken on the criminal charge of DWI/refusal.

During the one year period of prohibition, you may not operate motorboats, snowmobiles, or all-terrain vehicles (as specified on the reverse side) in this state or on the ice of any boundary waters of this state. If the prohibition is for motorboats, you may operate non-motorized watercraft, such as canoes, sailboats, or rowboats. You may also ride as a passenger aboard any watercraft, motorized or non-motorized.

You may not drive a motor vehicle in Minnesota until:

- The expiration of the period of time designated on the front side of this notice or expiration of additional period of time as indicated in correspondence from Driver and Vehicle Services Division;
- You have successfully completed a re-examination, and paid the reinstatement fee;
- You have complied with any other requirements of Driver and Vehicle Services for any other withdrawal of Minnesota driving privilege; and
- You have made application for and received a new license.

NOTE: Re-examination test and application fee are not required if you possess an out-of-state driver's license and are maintaining out-of-state residency.

## IGNITION INTERLOCK INFORMATION

Depending upon your prior driver's license record, you may be eligible for or required to have a restricted driver's license with an ignition interlock device installed in your vehicle as provided for by Minnesota Statutes, section 171.306. For additional information, contact:
