Today's announcement is a crucial steppingstone that paves the way to the enactment of Ontario's 2015 Budget commitments to implement all of the recommendations put forward in the OHIC report.

"MEDEC thanks Ministers Hoskins for driving this critical initiative forward and we continue to strongly support the government's commitment to implement the OHIC recommendations" added Brian Lewis. "This is a very positive advancement towards improving patient care and growing Ontario's economy."
