Average starting salary for bachelor's degree graduates

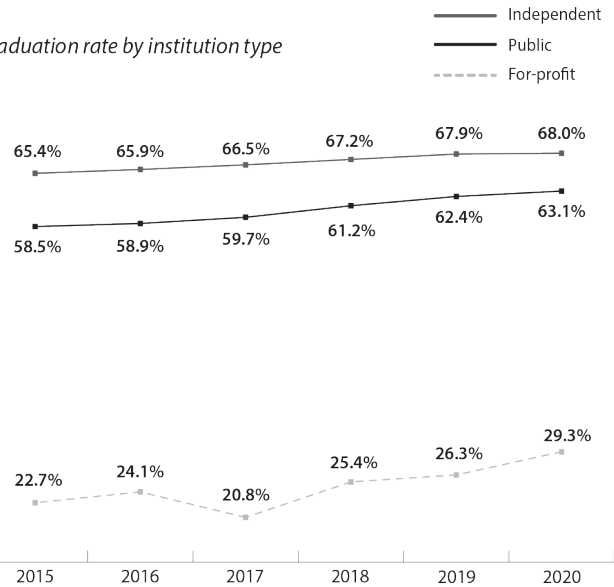

Graduation rate by institution type



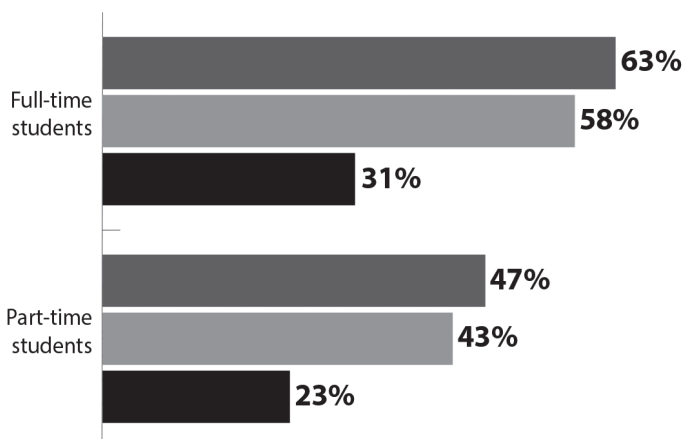

■ Community Colleges

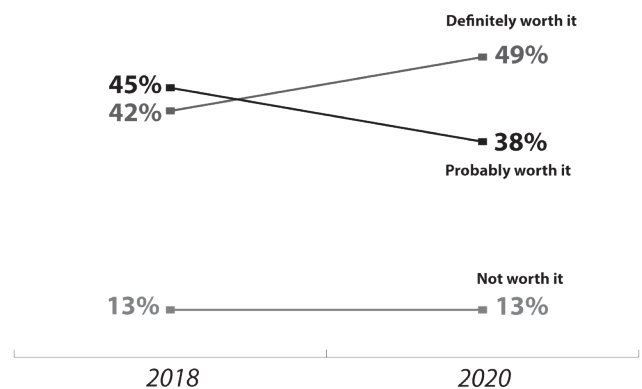

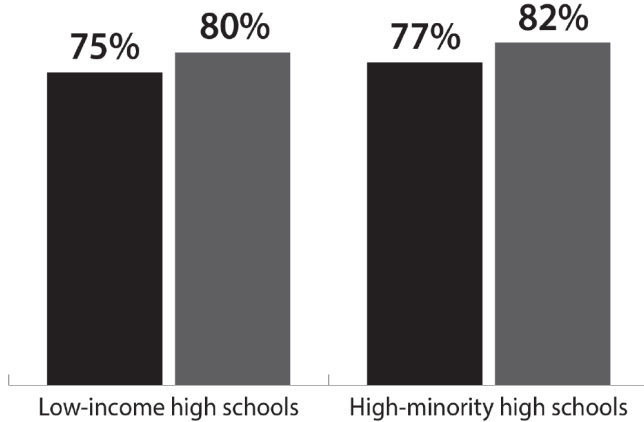

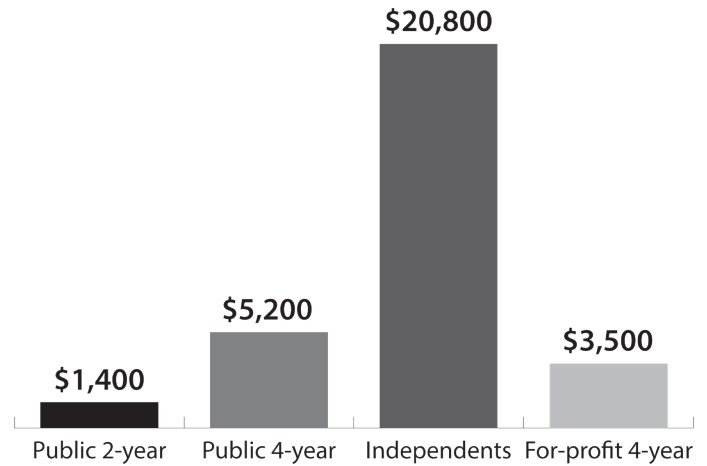

Average institutional grant aid provided per student in 2019-2020



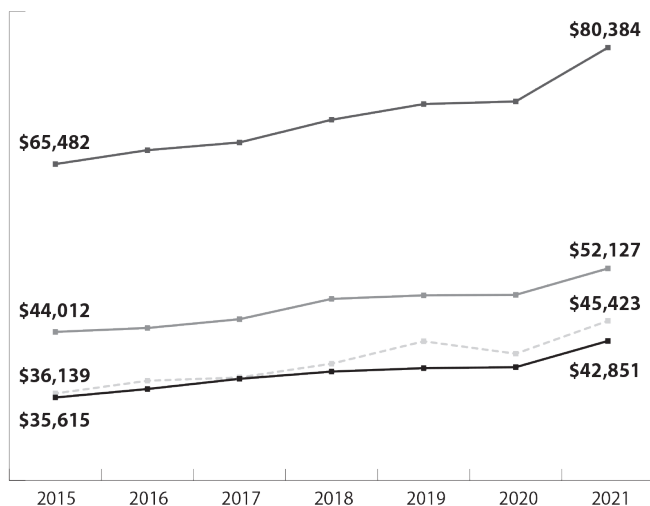

HS graduate



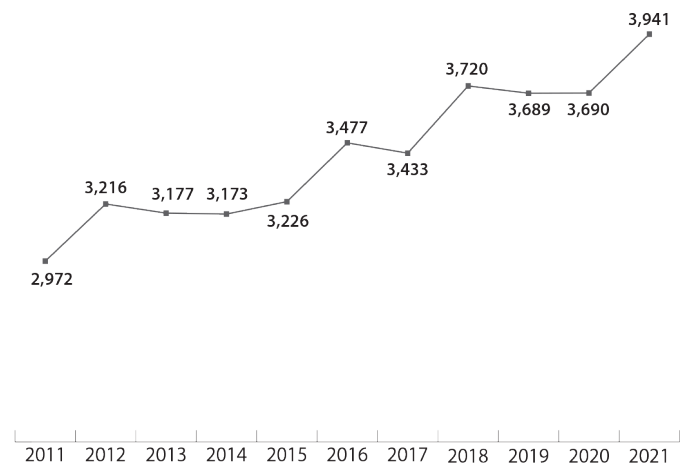

How do I apply for financial aid?

AICUO's financial aid step-by-step guide provides an overview of the process. You can get started by filing your FASFA at fasfa.gov, which will make you eligible for federal (national), state, and institutional aid.

What types of financial aid are available to me?

Some types of aid are grants/scholarships, while others are loans. Aid can either be need-based or non-need-based (e.g., scholarships for academic achievement, athletics, and/or leadership). Check with the institutions in which you're interested to learn more about what types of aid they offer.

Why is there a difference in price between public and independent institutions?

The cost of providing higher education is generally the same at independent institutions as public. For example, both types of institutions incur costs associated with building and maintaining classrooms, computer facilities, and libraries; paying faculty salaries; and providing career and counseling services. However, independent institutions charge a higher price, or tuition, because they do not receive an instructional subsidy from the state of Ohio.

How much of the total listed tuition cost will I pay?

It depends on which institution you apply to, but more than 80 percent of first-year students at independents received an aid package from their institution in addition to aid from federal and state governments. The average institutional aid package covered over half the cost of tuition as of 2023.

FINANCIAL AID STEP BY STEP

Step 1: Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov.

The FAFSA is used to determine your eligibility for federal, state, and institutional aid, such as Pell Grants and Work Study. This video tutorial provides an overview of the process:

Step 2: Complete the College Scholarship Services (CSS) Financial Aid Profile.

Use the sign on link at cssprofile.collegeboard.org to create a profile. Many colleges, including some of Ohio independents, use this tool to help determine eligibility for financial aid.

Step 3: Review the FAFSA Submission Survey from the U.S. Department of Education.

You will receive an email after submitting your FAFSA form instructing you to access an online copy of your FAFSA Submission Summary, which will include your Student Aid Index (SAI). The SAI is used by schools to calculate how much and what types of financial aid you are eligible for.

Step 4: Review the financial aid offers from the schools you listed on the FAFSA.

Most colleges will send your financial aid offer around the same time as your admission offer. Closely read the materials your school provides and ask any questions you have to an admission counselor.

Step 5: Accept the financial aid award offered by the school you plan to attend.

Step 6: Let your school know if you receive outside scholarships and grants.

You can search for local scholarships through employers, government and community organizations, or by using online scholarship databases.

Step 7: Complete any forms required to secure the aid awarded by your school.

How Do I Pay for College?

What is the Student Aid Index (SAI) and why is it important?

Your SAI is an index number that is calculated using the information that you and your contributors provide on the FAFSA form. Your SAI can range anywhere from –1500 to 999999. Note that it is not a dollar amount. Once your college, career school, or trade school knows your SAI, they will use it to calculate how much and what types of financial aid you are eligible to receive.

Most of the tax information used to calculate the SAI is transferred directly from the IRS into the FAFSA form. The calculation uses information from your tax return as well as the net worth of your assets. Your SAI will be listed on your FAFSA Submission Summary. The FAFSA Submission Summary is a paper or electronic document from the U.S. Department of Education that gives basic estimates about the student's eligibility for federal student aid. The Federal Student Aid Estimator provides an estimate of how much federal student aid the student may be eligible to receive.

What does an SAI of -1500 Mean?	What is a high SAI?	What is a low SAI?
An SAI of -1500 is the lowest possible SAI score. It means that you are eligible for a full Pell Grant, and will likely qualify for other need-based financial aid.	The SAI has no upper limit. However, once your SAI exceeds 30000, it is very unlikely you will receive any type of need-based financial aid.	The lowest SAI is -1500. However, an SAI from -1500 to 0 is all considered the same and qualified for a full Pell Grant.

File your FAFSA as early as possible to ensure your eligibility for financial aid.

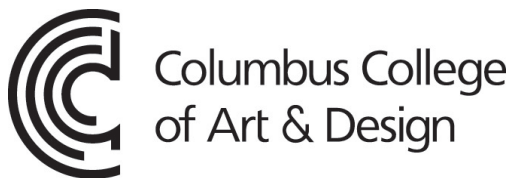

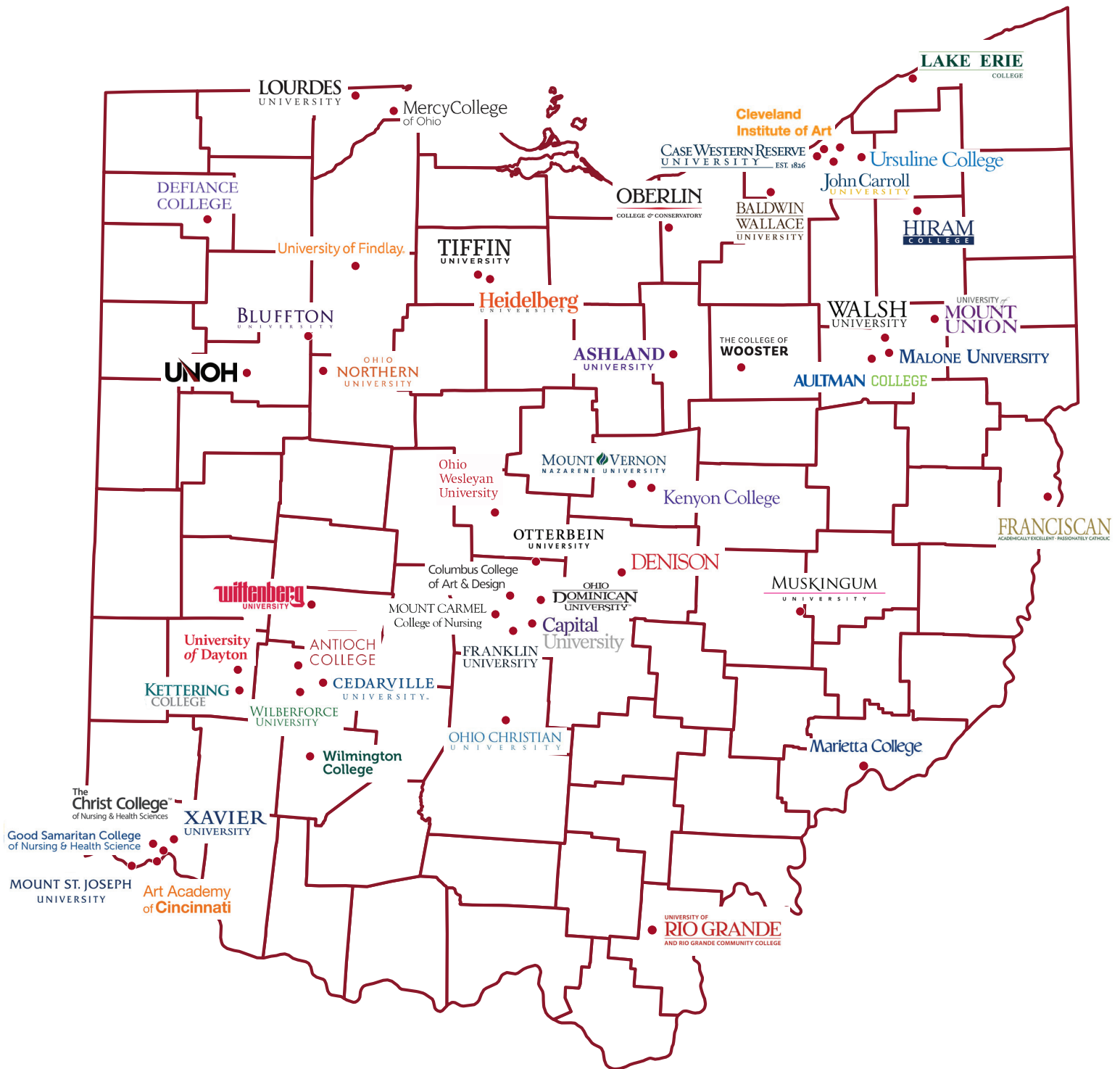
