Howard Pine received a Bachelor of Science from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He then moved to Japan where he taught and worked for seven years. He returned to the U.S. and earned a Master of International Affairs from the University of California San Diego School of Global Policy and Strategy. He then graduated from Rutgers School of Law-Newark and practiced labor and employment law before joining the Attorney General's Office, Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs in 2009 as a Special Assistant to then-Director, David Szuchman.

In 2015, Acting Director Steve C. Lee promoted Howard to Deputy Director at the Division of Consumer Affairs. As Deputy Director, he oversees the operations of the fifty-one boards and committees regulating more than one hundred professions and 720,000 licensees. He also serves as liaison between the boards and the Governor, Attorney General and Division Director and representatives of the regulated community, and participates in the development of public policy with respect to all activities of the boards.
