

Memorandum of Understanding
Between
The Federal Aviation Administration
And
National Association of State
Aviation Officials
2022 Initiative
Aviation and Space Education
(AVSED)

Task Statement:

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the National Association of State Aviation Officials (NASAO) will work through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in collaboration to promote and support aviation education. Recognizing an ongoing need, both organizations have revised aviation education activities nationwide to reflect the changing environment. This Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) AVSED initiative provides an opportunity for FAA and NASAO to renew their support for aviation education under a unified document. This effort establishes goals and objectives that encourages them to leverage and maximize a working relationship for both organizations to help meet their unique aviation goals, promote aviation safety, and foster an interest in aviation for educators and students at all levels. This MOU provides framework

for identifying and sharing available resources, supports mutual outreach initiatives, and promotes and supports joint activities among organizations engaged in aviation education activities in states and regions.

Objective: The FAA and NASAO will continue to work together providing aviation education outreach activities within states, consistent with Public Law 94-353. This MOU will assist to develop aviation education within their respective areas of responsibilities and to develop a long standing, cooperative relationship between the FAA and NASAO.

Action Goals: The FAA/NASAO partnership activities will include, but are not limited to activities as follows:

- Perform a minimum of three joint outreach initiatives per year. These outreach initiatives may include, but are not limited to; coordination and support of Aviation Career Education {ACE} camps; and similar aviation events, AVSED career days, classroom assistance, teacher workshops, and NASAO/FAA/FAI (Federal Aeronautic International) Art contest as appropriate.
- Work within NASAO to identify opportunities to support the need of aviation jobs - i.e. engineers, mechanics, avionic technicians, etc., and identify potential opportunities for collaboration as appropriate.
- Appointed representatives will meet monthly, or more often as deemed appropriate to review progress and discuss opportunities and/or areas of concern. Summarized data will be reported at the joint FAA/NASAO annual conference.

The effective date of this MOU will be at the time of the last signature below. This document will remain in effect for five (5) years or until termination by either of the signing authorities or their successors. Written notice of termination must be served by one party to the other at least ninety (90) days prior to the effective date of the termination, or, in the event of mutual consent, with no prior notice requirement.


