

Designated Airline for the Convention

It is always possible that you may find a cheaper rate on another airline. If you qualify for a Senior Citizen discount on United, you will receive an even better rate.

Transportation

Downtown Boston is not far from the airport. If you take Uber, Lyft or taxis it will cost about \$30. Amtrak also is available if coming from New York City, New York or Portland, Maine. It is not recommended to rent a car because parking garages charge about \$50 a day and street parking is limited. If you decide to take the subway, the Boston Park Plaza Hotel is about one block

from the Arlington station. It costs about \$2.40 per line. If you have questions, please contact the hotel concierge or our office.
