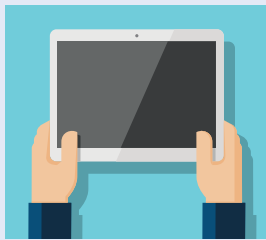
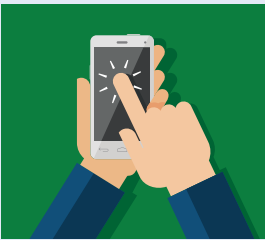

As bar leaders continue to grapple with challenges related to rule of law and democracy, this program will feature a special focus on projects generated from the Cornerstones of Democracy AAA grant and on current concerns related to judicial security. These programs demonstrate the variety of ways in which bar organizations can be partners and leaders in projects that protect rule of law and mobilize people to stand up for democracy. The projects include protection of voter rights to educating lawyers and the public on principles of democracy; publicly supporting and defending elections; and improving civics education for elected officials and the public.
