AWARD HISTORY

The Carol Bond Fund is a memorial scholarship fund which was created by NC One Water in cooperation with employees of the City of Raleigh, N.C. This scholarship fund commemorates the late Carol Bond and her lifelong devotion to environmental education. Carol was one of the first certified Environmental Educators in the state of North Carolina. Carol also served on many NC One Water committees. Scholarships and grants awarded from this fund support environmental education initiatives.

HOW TO APPLY

All required forms, listed below, must be uploaded through the online system no later than March 15, 2023, for application to be considered.

RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

Two letters from a school official, employer, or community official. (Max. one page each) Signed letters must be submitted online at www.nconewater.org/ScholarshipRecLetter

PROJECT DESCRIPTION & FOLLOW-UP

A description of the project including total project cost and budget, environmental education objectives, methodology, relevant drawings, materials to be used, estimated hours for development and completion, and the completion date. There is an expectation that the project will be completed within one year after notification of the award. At the end of the project, the recipient should provide a report to NC One Water which will be shared with the donor. The report should describe the administration of the project and its accomplishments.

PROOF OF EMPLOYMENT & QUALIFICATION

Applicants must provide proof of employment as an educator and a statement of qualifications of the applicant for completing the project.

CAROL BOND FUND SCHOLARSHIP FOR MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATORS – 2023-2024

AWARD

One \$1,500 grant plus free attendance to the 2023 NC One Water Annual Conference

LEVEL AND LOCATION

Middle or high school teacher in North Carolina

PROJECT

The grant may be applied towards expenses related to a variety of clean water and environmental preservation educational initiatives, including educational materials (books, videos), travel for field trips, building materials specific to a project, enrollment fees for water-related short courses for educators, and prizes for competitions. The amount of the award will depend on the cost of the project(s) selected.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

None

RENEWAL ELIGIBILITY

The grant is for one year, but recipients are eligible to apply in future years.

PAYABLE TO

School, teacher, or facilitator

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The applicant must not be related to scholarship sponsors nor employed by such sponsors and not an employee of nor related to any officer or director of NC One Water, nor to any member of the Endowment Committee.

Please do not submit any additional materials with your application. Materials that are not requested will not be reviewed nor will they be returned to you.
