To Whom It May Concern:

New Jersey announced Executive Order No. 107 on Saturday, March 21, 2020, effective at 9:00 p.m., containing new standards for businesses which supersede previous announcements. With this Order, certain essential businesses and facilities are considered exempt from these closures, specifically including “healthcare providers.” Veterinarians and their staff are included as Health Care Professionals in New Jersey Statute.

Governor Murphy also signed Executive Order No. 108, which invalidates any county or municipal restriction that in any way will or might conflict with any of the provisions of Executive Order No. 107. This is effective at 9 p.m. on Saturday, March 21, 2020, as well. The only exceptions are two categories over which municipalities or counties may impose any additional restrictions: 1) online marketplaces for arranging or offering lodging; and 2) municipal or county parks.

Employees reporting to work are permitted to travel to and from their place of business. As an employee of the company named below, the bearer of this letter works in an industry permitted to continue operations and thus should be allowed to travel as necessary as it relates to their involvement with this officially-designated essential business.
