AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to Advanced Practice Registered Nurses; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 353.1, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 353.1), which relates to definitions used in the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act; modifying and adding definitions; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 353.1a, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 353.1a), which relates to prescriptive authority of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses; modifying prescriptive authority of certain Certified Nurse Practitioners; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.3a, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 281, O.S.L. 2017 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 567.3a), which relates to definitions used in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act; modifying and adding definitions; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.4a, as last amended by Section 8, Chapter 428, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 567.4a), which relates to prescriptive authority; directing the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to promulgate certain rules; providing for independent prescriptive authority of Certified Nurse Practitioners; providing application criteria; specifying duration of authority; authorizing supervision by Certified Nurse Practitioner with independent prescriptive authority; providing for application approval, reapplication, fees and prescriptive authority revocation; providing for prescriptive authority recognition by endorsement; requiring certain malpractice insurance; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.5a, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2013 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 567.5a), which relates to Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-312, which relates to controlled dangerous

1 substances; authorizing Certified Nurse Practitioners
2 to prescribe and administer certain controlled
3 dangerous substances; updating statutory reference;
4 providing for codification; and providing an
5 effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 353.1, as
8 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp.
9 2019, Section 353.1), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 353.1. For the purposes of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act:

11 1. "Accredited program" means those seminars, classes,
12 meetings, work projects, and other educational courses approved by
13 the ~~Board~~ State Board of Pharmacy for purposes of continuing
14 professional education;

15 2. "Act" means the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act;

16 3. "Administer" means the direct application of a drug, whether
17 by injection, inhalation, ingestion or any other means, to the body
18 of a patient;

19 4. "Assistant pharmacist" means any person presently licensed
20 as an assistant pharmacist in the State of Oklahoma by the Board
21 pursuant to Section 353.10 of this title and for the purposes of the
22 Oklahoma Pharmacy Act shall be considered the same as a pharmacist,
23 except where otherwise specified;

24 5. "Board" or "State Board" means the State Board of Pharmacy;

1 6. "Certify" or "certification of a prescription" means the
2 review of a filled prescription by a licensed pharmacist or a
3 licensed practitioner with dispensing authority to confirm that the
4 medication, labeling and packaging of the filled prescription are
5 accurate and meet all requirements prescribed by state and federal
6 law. For the purposes of this paragraph, "licensed practitioner"
7 shall not include optometrists with dispensing authority;

8 7. "Chemical" means any medicinal substance, whether simple or
9 compound or obtained through the process of the science and art of
10 chemistry, whether of organic or inorganic origin;

11 8. "Compounding" means the combining, admixing, mixing,
12 diluting, pooling, reconstituting or otherwise altering of a drug or
13 bulk drug substance to create a drug. Compounding includes the
14 preparation of drugs or devices in anticipation of prescription drug
15 orders based on routine, regularly observed prescribing patterns;

16 9. "Continuing professional education" means professional,
17 pharmaceutical education in the general areas of the socioeconomic
18 and legal aspects of health care; the properties and actions of
19 drugs and dosage forms; and the etiology, characteristics and
20 therapeutics of the diseased state;

21 10. "Dangerous drug", "legend drug", "prescription drug" or "Rx
22 Only" means a drug:

23 a. for human use subject to 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1), or
24
25

1 b. is labeled "Prescription Only", or labeled with the
2 following statement: "Caution: Federal law restricts
3 this drug except for use by or on the order of a
4 licensed veterinarian".

5 11. "Director" means the Executive Director of the State Board
6 of Pharmacy unless context clearly indicates otherwise;

7 12. "Dispense" or "dispensing" means the interpretation,
8 evaluation, and implementation of a prescription drug order,
9 including the preparation and delivery of a drug or device to a
10 patient or a patient's agent in a suitable container appropriately
11 labeled for subsequent administration to, or use by, a patient.
12 Dispense includes sell, distribute, leave with, give away, dispose
13 of, deliver or supply;

14 13. "Dispenser" means a retail pharmacy, hospital pharmacy, a
15 group of chain pharmacies under common ownership and control that do
16 not act as a wholesale distributor, or any other person authorized
17 by law to dispense or administer prescription drugs, and the
18 affiliated warehouses or distributions of such entities under common
19 ownership and control that do not act as a wholesale distributor.
20 For the purposes of this paragraph, "dispenser" does not mean a
21 person who dispenses only products to be used in animals in
22 accordance with 21 U.S.C. 360b(a) (5);

23 14. "Distribute" or "distribution" means the sale, purchase,
24 trade, delivery, handling, storage, or receipt of a product, and
25

1 does not include the dispensing of a product pursuant to a
2 prescription executed in accordance with 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1) or the
3 dispensing of a product approved under 21 U.S.C. 360b(b); provided,
4 taking actual physical possession of a product or title shall not be
5 required;

6 15. "Doctor of Pharmacy" means a person licensed by the Board
7 to engage in the practice of pharmacy. The terms "pharmacist",
8 "D.Ph.", and "Doctor of Pharmacy" shall be interchangeable and shall
9 have the same meaning wherever they appear in the Oklahoma Statutes
10 and the rules promulgated by the Board;

11 16. "Drug outlet" means all manufacturers, repackagers,
12 outsourcing facilities, wholesale distributors, third-party
13 logistics providers, pharmacies, and all other facilities which are
14 engaged in dispensing, delivery, distribution or storage of
15 dangerous drugs;

16 17. "Drugs" means all medicinal substances and preparations
17 recognized by the United States Pharmacopoeia and National
18 Formulary, or any revision thereof, and all substances and
19 preparations intended for external and/or internal use in the cure,
20 diagnosis, mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in humans
21 or animals and all substances and preparations, other than food,
22 intended to affect the structure or any function of the body of a
23 human or animals;

1 18. "Drug sample" means a unit of a prescription drug packaged
2 under the authority and responsibility of the manufacturer that is
3 not intended to be sold and is intended to promote the sale of the
4 drug;

5 19. "Filled prescription" means a packaged prescription
6 medication to which a label has been affixed which contains such
7 information as is required by the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act;

8 20. "Hospital" means any institution licensed as a hospital by
9 this state for the care and treatment of patients, or a pharmacy
10 operated by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

11 21. "Licensed practitioner" means:

12 a. an allopathic physician,

13 b. an osteopathic physician,

14 c. a podiatric physician,

15 d. a dentist,

16 e. a veterinarian ~~or~~,

17 f. an optometrist, or

18 g. a Certified Nurse Practitioner who has obtained
19 independent prescriptive authority,

20 licensed to practice and authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs
21 within the scope of practice of such practitioner;

22 22. "Manufacturer" or "virtual manufacturer" means with respect
23 to a product:

- 1 a. a person that holds an application approved under 21
2 U.S.C. 355 or a license issued under 42 U.S.C. 262 for
3 such product, or if such product is not the subject of
4 an approved application or license, the person who
5 manufactured the product,
- 6 b. a co-licensed partner of the person described in
7 subparagraph a that obtains the product directly from
8 a person described in this subparagraph or
9 subparagraph a,
- 10 c. an affiliate of a person described in subparagraph a
11 or b who receives the product directly from a person
12 described in this subparagraph or in subparagraph a or
13 b; or
- 14 d. a person who contracts with another to manufacture a
15 product;

16 23. "Manufacturing" means the production, preparation,
17 propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of a device or a
18 drug, either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of
19 natural origin or independently by means of chemical or biological
20 synthesis and includes any packaging or repackaging of the
21 substances or labeling or relabeling of its container, and the
22 promotion and marketing of such drugs or devices. The term
23 "manufacturing" also includes the preparation and promotion of
24

1 commercially available products from bulk compounds for resale by
2 licensed pharmacies, licensed practitioners or other persons;

3 24. "Medical gas" means those gases including those in liquid
4 state upon which the manufacturer or distributor has placed one of
5 several cautions, such as "Rx Only", in compliance with federal law;

6 25. "Medical gas order" means an order for medical gas issued
7 by a licensed prescriber;

8 26. "Medical gas distributor" means a person licensed to
9 distribute, transfer, wholesale, deliver or sell medical gases on
10 drug orders to suppliers or other entities licensed to use,
11 administer or distribute medical gas and may also include a patient
12 or ultimate user;

13 27. "Medical gas supplier" means a person who dispenses medical
14 gases on drug orders only to a patient or ultimate user;

15 28. "Medicine" means any drug or combination of drugs which has
16 the property of curing, preventing, treating, diagnosing or
17 mitigating diseases, or which is used for that purpose;

18 29. "Nonprescription drugs" means medicines or drugs which are
19 sold without a prescription and which are prepackaged for use by the
20 consumer and labeled in accordance with the requirements of the
21 statutes and regulations of this state and the federal government.
22 Such items shall also include medical and dental supplies and
23 bottled or nonbulk chemicals which are sold or offered for sale to
24 the general public if such articles or preparations meet the

1 requirements of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, 21
2 U.S.C.A., Section 321 et seq.;

3 30. "Outsourcing facility", including "virtual outsourcing
4 facility" means a facility at one geographic location or address
5 that:

- 6 a. is engaged in the compounding of sterile drugs,
- 7 b. has elected to register as an outsourcing facility,
- 8 and
- 9 c. complies with all requirements of 21 U.S.C. 353b;

10 31. "Package" means the smallest individual saleable unit of
11 product for distribution by a manufacturer or repackager that is
12 intended by the manufacturer for ultimate sale to the dispenser of
13 such product. For the purposes of this paragraph, "individual
14 saleable unit" means the smallest container of a product introduced
15 into commerce by the manufacturer or repackager that is intended by
16 the manufacturer or repackager for individual sale to a dispenser;

17 32. "Person" means an individual, partnership, limited
18 liability company, corporation or association, unless the context
19 otherwise requires;

20 33. "Pharmacist-in-charge" or "PIC" means the pharmacist
21 licensed in this state responsible for the management control of a
22 pharmacy and all other aspects of the practice of pharmacy in a
23 licensed pharmacy as defined by Section 353.18 of this title;

1 34. "Pharmacy" means a place regularly licensed by the Board of
2 Pharmacy in which prescriptions, drugs, medicines, chemicals and
3 poisons are compounded or dispensed or such place where pharmacists
4 practice the profession of pharmacy, or a pharmacy operated by the
5 Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

6 35. "Pharmacy technician", "technician", "Rx tech", or "tech"
7 means a person issued a Technician permit by the State Board of
8 Pharmacy to assist the pharmacist and perform nonjudgmental,
9 technical, manipulative, non-discretionary functions in the
10 prescription department under the immediate and direct supervision
11 of a pharmacist;

12 36. "Poison" means any substance which when introduced into the
13 body, either directly or by absorption, produces violent, morbid or
14 fatal changes, or which destroys living tissue with which such
15 substance comes into contact;

16 37. "Practice of pharmacy" means:

- 17 a. the interpretation and evaluation of prescription
18 orders,
19 b. the compounding, dispensing, administering and
20 labeling of drugs and devices, except labeling by a
21 manufacturer, repackager or distributor of
22 nonprescription drugs and commercially packaged legend
23 drugs and devices,
24

- c. the participation in drug selection and drug utilization reviews,
- d. the proper and safe storage of drugs and devices and the maintenance of proper records thereof,
- e. the responsibility for advising by counseling and providing information, where professionally necessary or where regulated, of therapeutic values, content, hazards and use of drugs and devices,
- f. the offering or performing of those acts, services, operations or transactions necessary in the conduct, operation, management and control of a pharmacy, or
- g. the provision of those acts or services that are necessary to provide pharmaceutical care;

38. "Preparation" means an article which may or may not contain sterile products compounded in a licensed pharmacy pursuant to the order of a licensed prescriber;

39. "Prescriber" means a person licensed in this state who is authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs within the scope of practice of the person's profession;

40. "Prescription" means and includes any order for drug or medical supplies written or signed, or transmitted by word of mouth, telephone or other means of communication:

- a. by a licensed prescriber,

1 b. under the supervision of an Oklahoma licensed
2 practitioner, by an Oklahoma licensed advanced
3 ~~practice registered nurse or an Oklahoma licensed~~
4 Clinical Nurse Specialist, Certified Nurse-Midwife or
5 physician assistant, ~~or~~

6 c. (1) under the supervision of an Oklahoma licensed
7 practitioner or supervising Certified Nurse
8 Practitioner, by a Certified Nurse Practitioner
9 who has not obtained independent prescriptive
10 authority under the provisions of Section 5 of
11 this act, or
12 (2) by a Certified Nurse Practitioner who has
13 obtained independent prescriptive authority under
14 the provisions of Section 5 of this act, or

15 d. by an Oklahoma licensed wholesaler or distributor as
16 authorized in Section 353.29.1 of this title;

17 41. "Product" means a prescription drug in a finished dosage
18 form for administration to a patient without substantial further
19 manufacturing, such as capsules, tablets, and lyophilized products
20 before reconstitution. "Product" does not include blood components
21 intended for transfusion, radioactive drugs or biologics and medical
22 gas;

23 42. "Repackager", including "virtual repackager", means a
24 person who owns or operates an establishment that repacks and
25

1 relabels a product or package for further sale or distribution
2 without further transaction;

3 43. "Sterile drug" means a drug that is intended for parenteral
4 administration, an ophthalmic or oral inhalation drug in aqueous
5 format, or a drug that is required to be sterile under state and
6 federal law;

7 44. "Supervising Certified Nurse Practitioner" means a
8 Certified Nurse Practitioner as defined in Section 567.3a of this
9 title who has obtained independent prescriptive authority under the
10 provisions of Section 5 of this act, who supervises a Certified
11 Nurse Practitioner who has not obtained independent prescriptive
12 authority under the provisions of Section 5 of this act;

13 45. "Supervising physician" means an individual holding a
14 current license to practice as a physician from the State Board of
15 Medical Licensure and Supervision, pursuant to the provisions of the
16 Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision
17 Act, or the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, pursuant to the
18 provisions of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, who supervises
19 an advanced practice registered nurse a Certified Nurse Practitioner
20 who has not obtained independent prescriptive authority under the
21 provisions of Section 5 of this act, a Clinical Nurse Specialist, a
22 Certified Nurse-Midwife or a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist,
23 as such terms are defined in Section 567.3a of this title, and who
24 is not in training as an intern, resident, or fellow. ~~To be~~

1 ~~eligible to supervise an advanced practice registered nurse, such~~

2 The physician shall remain in compliance with the rules promulgated
3 by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision or the State
4 Board of Osteopathic Examiners;

5 ~~45.~~ 46. "Supportive personnel" means technicians and auxiliary
6 supportive persons who are regularly paid employees of a pharmacy
7 who work and perform tasks in the pharmacy as authorized by Section
8 353.18A of this title;

9 ~~46.~~ 47. "Third-party logistics provider", including "virtual
10 third-party logistics provider" means an entity that provides or
11 coordinates warehousing, or other logistics services of a product in
12 interstate commerce on behalf of a manufacturer, wholesale
13 distributor, or dispenser of a product but does not take ownership
14 of the product, nor have responsibility to direct the sale or
15 disposition of the product. For the purposes of this paragraph,
16 "third-party logistics provider" does not include shippers and the
17 United States Postal Service;

18 ~~47.~~ 48. "Wholesale distributor", including "virtual wholesale
19 distributor" means a person other than a manufacturer, a
20 manufacturer's co-licensed partner, a third-party logistics
21 provider, or repackager engaged in wholesale distribution as defined
22 by 21 U.S.C. 353(e) (4) as amended by the Drug Supply Chain Security
23 Act;

1 ~~48.~~ 49. "County jail" means a facility operated by a county for
2 the physical detention and correction of persons charged with, or
3 convicted of, criminal offenses or ordinance violations or persons
4 found guilty of civil or criminal contempt;

5 ~~49.~~ 50. "State correctional facility" means a facility or
6 institution that houses a prisoner population under the jurisdiction
7 of the Department of Corrections;

8 ~~50.~~ 51. "Unit dose package" means a package that contains a
9 single dose drug with the name, strength, control number, and
10 expiration date of that drug on the label; and

11 ~~51.~~ 52. "Unit of issue package" means a package that provides
12 multiple doses of the same drug, but each drug is individually
13 separated and includes the name, lot number, and expiration date.

14 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 353.1a, as
15 amended by Section 2, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019,
16 Section 353.1a), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 353.1a. A. ~~Prescribing~~ Prescriptive authority shall be
18 allowed, under the medical direction of a supervising physician, for
19 an ~~advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered Nurse
20 recognized by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing ~~in one of the following~~
21 ~~categories: advanced registered nurse practitioners, clinical nurse~~
22 ~~specialists, or certified nurse-midwives~~ as a Clinical Nurse
23 Specialist or Certified Nurse-Midwife.

1 B. 1. Prescriptive authority shall be allowed, under the
2 medical direction of a supervising physician, for an Advanced
3 Practice Registered Nurse recognized by the Board as a Certified
4 Nurse Practitioner who has not obtained independent prescriptive
5 authority under the provisions of Section 5 of this act.

6 2. Prescriptive authority shall be allowed, independent of the
7 medical direction of a supervising physician, for an Advanced
8 Practice Registered Nurse recognized by the Board as a Certified
9 Nurse Practitioner who has obtained independent prescriptive
10 authority under the provisions of Section 5 of this act.

11 C. The ~~advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered
12 Nurse may write or sign, or transmit by word of mouth, telephone or
13 other means of communication an order for drugs or medical supplies
14 that is intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a
15 pharmacist. The supervising physician, if applicable, and the
16 ~~advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be
17 identified at the time of origination of the prescription and the
18 name of the ~~advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered
19 Nurse shall be printed on the prescription label.

20 ~~B.~~ D. Pharmacists may dispense prescriptions for non-controlled
21 prescription drugs authorized by an ~~advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced
22 Practice Registered Nurse or physician assistant, not located in
23 Oklahoma, provided that they are licensed in the state in which they
24 are actively prescribing.

1 ~~C. E.~~ 1. Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for
2 controlled dangerous substances prescribed by an ~~advanced practice~~
3 ~~nurse or physician assistant~~ Advanced Practice Registered Nurse
4 ~~licensed in the State of Oklahoma and supervised by an Oklahoma-~~
5 ~~licensed practitioner~~ this state who meets the criteria in
6 subsection A or B of this section.

7 2. Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for controlled
8 dangerous substances prescribed by a physician assistant licensed in
9 this state and supervised by an Oklahoma-licensed practitioner.

10 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.3a, as
11 amended by Section 1, Chapter 281, O.S.L. 2017 (59 O.S. Supp. 2019,
12 Section 567.3a), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 567.3a. As used in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act:

14 1. "Board" means the Oklahoma Board of Nursing;

15 2. "The practice of nursing" means the performance of services
16 provided for purposes of nursing diagnosis and treatment of human
17 responses to actual or potential health problems consistent with
18 educational preparation. Knowledge and skill are the basis for
19 assessment, analysis, planning, intervention, and evaluation used in
20 the promotion and maintenance of health and nursing management of
21 illness, injury, infirmity, restoration or optimal function, or
22 death with dignity. Practice is based on understanding the human
23 condition across the human lifespan and understanding the
24 relationship of the individual within the environment. This

1 practice includes execution of the medical regime including the
2 administration of medications and treatments prescribed by any
3 person authorized by state law to so prescribe;

4 3. "Registered nursing" means the practice of the full scope of
5 nursing which includes, but is not limited to:

- 6 a. assessing the health status of individuals, families
7 and groups,
- 8 b. analyzing assessment data to determine nursing care
9 needs,
- 10 c. establishing goals to meet identified health care
11 needs,
- 12 d. planning a strategy of care,
- 13 e. establishing priorities of nursing intervention to
14 implement the strategy of care,
- 15 f. implementing the strategy of care,
- 16 g. delegating such tasks as may safely be performed by
17 others, consistent with educational preparation and
18 that do not conflict with the provisions of the
19 Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act,
- 20 h. providing safe and effective nursing care rendered
21 directly or indirectly,
- 22 i. evaluating responses to interventions,
- 23 j. teaching the principles and practice of nursing,
- 24 k. managing and supervising the practice of nursing,

- 1 1. collaborating with other health professionals in the
- 2 management of health care,
- 3 m. performing additional nursing functions in accordance
- 4 with knowledge and skills acquired beyond basic
- 5 nursing preparation, and
- 6 n. delegating those nursing tasks as defined in the rules
- 7 of the Board that may be performed by an advanced
- 8 unlicensed assistive person;

9 4. “Licensed practical nursing” means the practice of nursing
10 under the supervision or direction of a registered nurse, licensed
11 physician or dentist. This directed scope of nursing practice
12 includes, but is not limited to:

- 13 a. contributing to the assessment of the health status of
- 14 individuals and groups,
- 15 b. participating in the development and modification of
- 16 the plan of care,
- 17 c. implementing the appropriate aspects of the plan of
- 18 care,
- 19 d. delegating such tasks as may safely be performed by
- 20 others, consistent with educational preparation and
- 21 that do not conflict with the Oklahoma Nursing
- 22 Practice Act,
- 23 e. providing safe and effective nursing care rendered
- 24 directly or indirectly,

- f. participating in the evaluation of responses to interventions,
- g. teaching basic nursing skills and related principles,
- h. performing additional nursing procedures in accordance with knowledge and skills acquired through education beyond nursing preparation, and
- i. delegating those nursing tasks as defined in the rules of the Board that may be performed by an advanced unlicensed assistive person;

5. "Advanced Practice Registered Nurse" means a licensed

Registered Nurse:

- a. who has completed an advanced practice registered nursing education program in preparation for one of four recognized ~~advanced practice registered nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered Nurse roles,
- b. who has passed a national certification examination recognized by the Board that measures the ~~advanced practice registered nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered Nurse role and specialty competencies and who maintains recertification in the role and specialty through a national certification program,
- c. who has acquired advanced clinical knowledge and skills in preparation for providing both direct and indirect care to patients; however, the defining

1 factor for all Advanced Practice Registered Nurses is
2 that a significant component of the education and
3 practice focuses on direct care of individuals,

- 4 d. whose practice builds on the competencies of
5 Registered Nurses by demonstrating a greater depth and
6 breadth of knowledge, a greater synthesis of data, and
7 increased complexity of skills and interventions, and
- 8 e. who has obtained a license as an Advanced Practice
9 Registered Nurse in one of the following roles:

18 roles and use the applicable titles: Certified Registered Nurse
19 Anesthetist and the abbreviation "CRNA", Certified Nurse-Midwife and
20 the abbreviation "CNM", Clinical Nurse Specialist and the
21 abbreviation "CNS", and Certified Nurse Practitioner and the
22 abbreviation "CNP".

23 It shall be unlawful for any person to assume the role or use

12 7. a. "Clinical Nurse Specialist" ~~is~~ means an Advanced
13 Practice Registered Nurse who holds:

- 14 (1) a master's degree or higher in nursing with
15 clinical specialization preparation to function
16 in an expanded role,
17 (2) specialty certification from a national
18 certifying organization recognized by the Board,
19 (3) an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license
20 from the Board, and
21 (4) any nurse holding a specialty certification as a
22 Clinical Nurse Specialist valid on January 1,
23 1994, granted by a national certifying
24 organization recognized by the Board, shall be

1 deemed to be a Clinical Nurse Specialist under

9 8. "Nurse-Midwife" ~~is~~ means a nurse who has received an
10 Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license from the Oklahoma Board
11 of Nursing who possesses evidence of certification according to the
12 requirements of the American College of Nurse-Midwives.

13 A Certified Nurse-Midwife in accordance with the scope of
14 practice of such Certified Nurse-Midwife shall be eligible to obtain
15 recognition as authorized by the Board to prescribe, as defined by
16 the rules promulgated by the Board pursuant to this section and
17 subject to the medical direction of a supervising physician. This
18 authorization shall not include the dispensing of drugs, but shall
19 not preclude, subject to federal regulations, the receipt of, the
20 signing for, or the dispensing of professional samples to patients.

21 The Certified Nurse-Midwife accepts responsibility,
22 accountability, and obligation to practice in accordance with usual
23 and customary advanced practice registered nursing standards and
24

1 functions as defined by the scope of practice/role definition
2 statements for the Certified Nurse-Midwife;

3 9. "Nurse-midwifery practice" means providing management of
4 care of normal newborns and women, antepartally, intrapartally,
5 postpartally and gynecologically, occurring within a health care
6 system which provides for medical consultation, medical management
7 or referral, and is in accord with the standards for nurse-midwifery
8 practice as defined by the American College of Nurse-Midwives;

9 10. a. "Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist" ~~is~~ means an

20 authority under the provisions of Section 5 of this act, a Clinical
21 Nurse Specialist, or a Certified Nurse-Midwife of written,
22 telephonic, electronic or oral prescriptions for drugs and other
23 medical supplies, subject to a defined formulary; and

1 ~~13.~~ 14. "Advanced Unlicensed Assistant" means any person who
2 has successfully completed a certified training program approved by
3 the Board that trains the Advanced Unlicensed Assistant to perform
4 specified technical skills identified by the Board in acute care
5 settings under the direction and supervision of the Registered Nurse
6 or Licensed Practical Nurse.

7 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.4a, as
8 last amended by Section 8, Chapter 428, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.
9 2019, Section 567.4a), is amended to read as follows:

17 independent prescriptive authority under the provisions of

22 application, stating the reason or reasons for denial, if denied.

21 recognized by the Board. Effective January 1, 2016, the applicant

1 adult-gerontology, neonatal, pediatrics, women's health/gender-
2 related, or psychiatric/mental health;

6 6. Meet continued competency requirements as set forth in Board

10 D. The Board may issue prescriptive authority recognition by

14 applicant for prescriptive authority recognition by endorsement

10 obtained independent prescriptive authority under the provisions of
11 Section 5 of this act;

12 6. Meet continued competency requirements as set forth in Board
13 rules; and

14 7. Provide any and all other evidence as required by the Board
15 in its rules.

16 E. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license issued under
17 this section shall be renewed concurrently with the registered nurse
18 license provided that qualifying criteria continue to be met.

19 F. The Board may reinstate a license as set forth in Board
20 rules.

21 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 567.27 of Title 59, unless there
23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse, or his or her employer on
2 his or her behalf, shall be required to carry malpractice insurance
3 or demonstrate proof of financial responsibility in a minimum amount
4 of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Three
5 Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) in the aggregate per year.

6 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-312, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 Section 2-312. A. A physician, podiatrist, optometrist or a
9 dentist who has complied with the registration requirements of the
10 Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in
11 the course of such person's professional practice only, may
12 prescribe and administer controlled dangerous substances, or may
13 cause the same to be administered by medical or paramedical
14 personnel acting under the direction and supervision of the
15 physician, podiatrist, optometrist or dentist, and only may dispense
16 controlled dangerous substances pursuant to the provisions of
17 Sections 355, 355.1 and 355.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

18 B. A veterinarian who has complied with the registration
19 requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in
20 good faith and in the course of the professional practice of the
21 veterinarian only, and not for use by a human being, may prescribe,
22 administer, and dispense controlled dangerous substances and may
23 cause them to be administered by an assistant or orderly under the
24 direction and supervision of the veterinarian.

1 C. ~~An advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered
2 Nurse who is recognized to prescribe by the Oklahoma Board of
3 Nursing as ~~an advanced registered nurse practitioner, clinical nurse~~
4 ~~specialist or certified nurse-midwife,~~ a Clinical Nurse Specialist
5 or a Certified Nurse-Midwife who is subject to medical direction by
6 a supervising physician, pursuant to Section 567.3a of Title 59 of
7 the Oklahoma Statutes, and who has complied with the registration
8 requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in
9 good faith and in the course of professional practice only, may
10 prescribe and administer Schedule III, IV and V controlled dangerous
11 substances.

12 D. 1. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse who is recognized
13 to prescribe by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a Certified Nurse
14 Practitioner but has not obtained independent prescriptive authority
15 under the provisions of Section 5 of this act and therefore is
16 subject to medical direction by a supervising physician pursuant to
17 Section 567.3a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and has
18 complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform
19 Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in the course
20 of professional practice only, may prescribe and administer Schedule
21 III, IV and V controlled dangerous substances.

22 2. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse who is recognized to
23 prescribe by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a Certified Nurse
24 Practitioner and has obtained independent prescriptive authority

1 under the provisions of Section 5 of this act, and has complied with
2 the registration requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous
3 Substances Act, in good faith and in the course of professional
4 practice only, may prescribe and administer Schedule II, III, IV and
5 V controlled dangerous substances.

6 E. An ~~advanced practice nurse~~ Advanced Practice Registered
7 Nurse who is recognized to order, select, obtain and administer
8 drugs by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a ~~certified registered~~
9 ~~nurse anesthetist~~ Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist pursuant to
10 Section 353.1b of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes and who has
11 complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform
12 Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in the course
13 of such practitioner's professional practice only, may order,
14 select, obtain and administer Schedules II ~~through~~, III, IV and V
15 controlled dangerous substances in a preanesthetic preparation or
16 evaluation; anesthesia induction, maintenance or emergence; or
17 postanesthesia care setting only. A ~~certified registered nurse~~
18 ~~anesthetist~~ Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist may order,
19 select, obtain and administer such drugs only during the
20 perioperative or periobstetrical period.

21 ~~E.~~ F. A physician assistant who is recognized to prescribe by
22 the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision under the
23 medical direction of a supervising physician, pursuant to subsection
24 D of Section 519.6 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and who has

1 complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform
2 Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in the course
3 of professional practice only, may prescribe and administer Schedule
4 ~~II through~~, III, IV and V controlled dangerous substances.

5 SECTION 9. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
