Norman Regional Health System

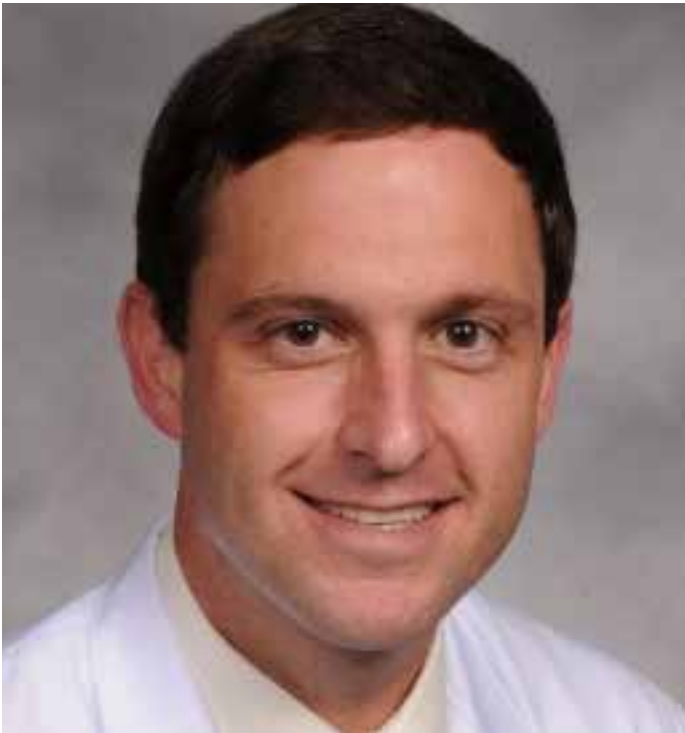

3. Participants will be able to locate MAT treatment programs in Oklahoma and Naloxone hubs.;
4. Participants will be able to identify overdose risk factors and signs of overdose.

Updates in Bariatric Surgery

1. (Rx) Identify medication related weight gain and potential need for vitamin prescriptions for replacement and maintenance of proper nutrition after bariatric surgery;
2. Understand different types of bariatric surgery available to treat obesity, and effectiveness of treatment;
3. Identify patients who are candidates for bariatric surgery, as well as contraindications to surgery;
4. Identify obesity as a chronic disease process which is multifactorial, requires lifetime intervention, and involves multidisciplinary treatment.
