**Call for Volunteer NPWH Board Members:**

The NPWH Board of Directors is a board of volunteers who contribute their time and energy to provide leadership and commitment to delivering our mission, vision, and IDE commitment. Our goal is to develop a Board of diverse candidates seeking to be the national representatives of women's health nurse practitioners committed to serving and supporting the NPWH Strategic Plan and the organization.

**Vision:** We envision a world where WHNP-BCs and all APRNs who provide women's and gender-related healthcare are esteemed pioneers in fostering a just, healthy, and equitable society.

**Mission:** NPWH is the professional community for Women's Health Nurse Practitioners and other advanced practice registered nurses who provide women's and gender-related healthcare. We set a standard of excellence by generating, translating, and promoting the latest research and evidence-based clinical guidance, providing high-quality continuing education, and advocating for patients, providers, and the WHNP profession. Our mission includes protecting and promoting a woman's and all individuals' rights to make their own choices regarding their health and well-being within the context of their lived experience and their personal, religious, cultural, and family beliefs.

**Inclusivity, Diversity, and Equity (IDE) Statement:** NPWH is committed to increasing inclusivity, diversity, and equity in our organization, the WHNP profession, the women's and gender-related healthcare field, and beyond. Our membership comprises professionals representing diversity by, but not limited to, specialty area, educational background, race and ethnicity, age, geographic location, socioeconomic status, ability, gender and identity, sexual orientation, and personal beliefs. We actively seek to engage and amplify the voices that have historically been silenced and ensure they are represented in our staff, leadership, and programming.

Our [Strategic Plan 2025-2027](#) reflects the shared mission, vision, and values of our community and organization.

### **Position Description**

The Board will support the work of NPWH and provide mission-based leadership and strategic governance. While day-to-day operations are led by NPWH's Chief Executive Officer (CEO), the Board-CEO relationship is a partnership, and the appropriate involvement of the Board is both critical and expected to support the mission, vision, and strategic plan of the organization. Board members' focus is primarily on strategy and supporting the goals of the strategic plan while being a good fiscal steward to the organization.

### **The Board of Directors' responsibilities include:**

- Leadership, governance, and oversight.
- High level of commitment and dedication to the strategic priorities of NPWH, the WHNP-BC profession, and prioritizing the work of the BOD.
- Serving as a trusted advisor to the CEO as s/he develops and implements NPWH's strategic plan.
- Reviewing outcomes and metrics created by NPWH for evaluating its impact and regularly measuring its performance and effectiveness using those metrics, reviewing agendas, and supporting materials before board and committee meetings.
- Approving NPWH's annual budget, audit reports, and material business decisions; being informed of and meeting all legal and fiduciary responsibilities.
- Assisting the CEO and Board Chair in identifying and recruiting other board members.
- Partnering with the CEO and other board members to ensure that board resolutions are carried out.
- A willingness to volunteer to support continuing education programming, task forces, committee liaison, and special assignments for the organization.
- Serving on at least one standing committee as a board liaison.
- Representing NPWH to stakeholders; acting as an ambassador for the organization by encouraging membership and assisting in identifying future exhibitors and sponsors for the organization.
- Ensuring NPWH's commitment to a diverse board and staff that reflects the communities NPWH serves.
- Making an annual personal financial donation to the organization.
- Attending at least 80% of all board meetings.
- Disclosing any actual, potential, or perceived conflicts of interest that may arise during the term and recusing oneself from participation accordingly.
  - For example, service on another organization's board whose mission, advocacy priorities, or business interests may intersect with or conflict with NPWH's agenda should be disclosed. Candidates should clearly identify the nature of any such affiliations.

### **BOD Composition and Eligibility.**

The BOD shall consist of the four (4) elected Executive Committee Officers who serve with full voting rights. In addition, by BOD vote, the BOD must have at least six (6) other members who must hold an active certification of the WHNP-BC, and up to three (3) at-large members who may be Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) who provide women's or gender-related healthcare and/or others who have a skill set required by the BOD (total maximum directors and officers shall not exceed 13). The CEO will serve as a non-voting member of the BOD who does not count for quorum purposes. Only individuals who have been voting members (and maintained membership) of NPWH for two (2) consecutive years shall be qualified to serve as directors, but only as long as no conflict of interest exists. Every member of the board will have one (1) vote. After a hiatus of two (2) years, a former BOD member may reapply for consideration for reappointment to the BOD. Former BOD members will follow the same nominations committee appointment process as new BOD candidates.

### **BOD Appointment and Term.**

A majority vote of the BOD shall make appointments to the BOD after consideration of the Nominating and Governance Committee's recommendations. The term of the appointment of Board Members shall be three years. A second term of three years may be considered based upon a mutual decision between the board member and the organization. The appointed directors shall be staggered by dividing the total number of directors as nearly equally as possible into three groups so that the terms of roughly one-third of the directors shall expire each year. BOD positions are voluntary.

A currently appointed BOD member who has served for at least one year on the BOD can seek election as an executive officer of the BOD. Executive officers are the President, President-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer. A member of the BOD may resign by notifying the BOD in writing. BOD members who miss two consecutive in-person or virtual meetings after being given proper notice require Executive Committee review for continued participation in the BOD.

NPWH has adopted a process for vetting qualified applicants to serve on the NPWH Board of Directors. The NPWH Nominations and Governance Committee will review all applications and vet all candidates. A slate of recommended candidates will be brought to the entire BOD to vote.

## **Fundraising**

NPWH Board Members are expected to view NPWH as a philanthropic priority and demonstrate this commitment through annual financial contributions. To ensure the organization can credibly pursue funding from foundations, corporations, and individual donors, NPWH seeks 100% participation from its Board. Each Board Member is asked to contribute an annual gift aligned with their capacity, with a minimum contribution of \$250. As a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization, all contributions are tax-deductible to the extent allowed by law. In addition to personal giving, Board Members are encouraged to actively support NPWH's development efforts by helping to secure new memberships, sponsorships, donations, or exhibitors.

## **Details for Board of Directors Terms/Participation**

NPWH's Board Members will serve a three-year term from January 1, 2027, to December 31, 2029. Board meetings will be held 2x a year in person and as needed virtually, usually a minimum of two additional meetings. In-person meetings are held in March/April and at the NPWH Annual Women's Healthcare Conference. All Board members must be committed, available, and responsive to electronic communications and virtual meetings. All Board members are expected to attend the entire annual meeting, be willing to volunteer and support the event as needed, plus attend the in-person Board meeting, which is typically two days prior to the annual meeting.

## **Experience**

This is an extraordinary opportunity for an individual who is passionate about NPWH's mission and who has a record of leadership. Selected Board Members will have achieved leadership in any of the following categories: business, government, philanthropy, education/academia, research, private or public clinical practice, or the nonprofit sector.

- Prior board of directors experience in governing an organization preferred.
- Extensive professional experience with significant executive leadership accomplishments in business, government, philanthropy, or the nonprofit sector
- A commitment to and understanding of NPWH's beneficiaries, preferably based on experience.
- Savvy diplomatic skills and a natural affinity for cultivating relationships and persuading, convening, facilitating, and building consensus among diverse individuals.
- Personal qualities of integrity, credibility, and a passion to build up the WHNP profession, to raise awareness for women's health, and seek to represent board-certified women's health nurse practitioners nationally.

Service on NPWH's Board of Directors is without remuneration. Board members are reimbursed for reasonable travel and accommodation costs in relation to BOD duties. Also, the registration fee and accommodation cost for the Annual NPWH Women's Healthcare Conference are waived (while serving on the Board).

### **Current Priorities of the NPWH Board of Directors**

The NPWH Board of Directors is committed to advancing leadership that reflects the evolving needs of our members and the profession. As we look to grow and diversify the Board, we encourage all interested individuals to apply—even if your expertise does not align directly with the priorities listed below. Your unique experiences and perspectives are valued.

Our current priorities include:

1. Elevating the voices of practicing clinicians, researchers, and academics (with a particular emphasis on those bringing forward the clinical perspective).
2. Expanding representation across subspecialties within WHNP, such as gynecologic oncology, aesthetics, entrepreneurship, and the pharmaceutical industry (with thoughtful attention to managing potential conflicts of interest).
3. Developing strategic growth by engaging candidates who have business, financial, or healthcare administration experience.
4. Encouraging applicants who have demonstrated ongoing engagement with NPWH through committee participation or other volunteer roles (especially those who are actively contributing to organizational efforts).

We welcome all who are committed to the mission and vision of NPWH and ready to contribute to its continued success.

### **Commitment to Creating a Diverse Organization:**

NPWH is committed to creating a diverse environment and organization. All qualified applicants will receive consideration for volunteer opportunities without regard to race, color, religion, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, national origin, genetics, disability, age, or veteran status.

NPWH seeks representation across the U.S. and diversity that is visible and invisible across a broad spectrum of characteristics. We believe deeply in diversity of race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, national origin, and all the other fascinating characteristics that make us unique as individuals.

The NPWH Nominations and Governance Committee will review the applications and select candidates for an interview. Interviews will be conducted via Zoom in late summer/early fall. Appointments will be announced in mid-to-late Fall.

### **Appendix A Self-Assessment Rubric**

Serving on NPWH's Board of Directors is both a distinguished honor and a vital responsibility, reflecting a deep commitment to advancing the organization's mission and impact. This leadership role requires active engagement, including significant time commitment and travel to fulfill the mission of the organization. Board members are expected to attend two in-person board meetings annually and additional meetings as needed by the Board of Directors, and to make a minimum yearly donation of \$250 to the organization. The Board of Directors members are expected to prioritize their Board member role and these obligations throughout the term of their service.

This rubric is designed to help NPWH members assess their readiness and suitability for a position on the NPWH Board of Directors by evaluating their contributions, leadership qualities, and measurable impact on the mission of NPWH. Please note that not all criteria will be applicable or required to be considered a strong candidate for the NPWH Board of Directors.

#### **Instructions for Use:**

- **Self-Assessment:** Rate yourself on each criterion using the scale provided.
- **Notes & Examples:** In the space below, please provide specific examples or reflections that support your rating per category. Please note that if an area is a growth opportunity, share how you will address growth in this particular area. You may use a separate sheet of paper to expand upon your self-assessment notes.
- **Review:** Use this assessment to identify areas of strength and opportunities for growth in preparation for board service. The Nominations and Governance Committee will use this as part of their evaluation process when reviewing your application, which has three (3) parts: 1) Self-Assessment, 2) CV, and 3) Letter of Interest outlining your qualifications and involvement in NPWH. If selected for an appointed position on the NPWH BOD, the NPWH Board President and



CEO will use this assessment to support your growth and provide additional materials and learning opportunities to support your development in any identified areas.
